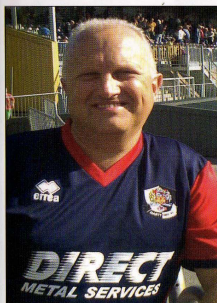


big ed's bit.....

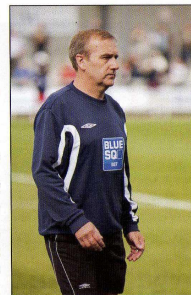
So we move on, and like Saturday we will give Canvey the utmost respect. They will come and have a right go at us, but we have to be patient, professional, and believe in ourselves.
