FA Trophy

WEALDSTONE are through to the last 16 of the FA Carlsberg Trophy after beating Conference Premier club Barrow 2-1 at Grosvenor Vale on Saturday.

They were joined in today's draw by Carshalton and East Thurrock, who both face replays tomorrow after deservedly drawing against Conference opposition.

The game at Wealdstone was the only tie of the round featuring two former winners of the competition.

Stones enjoyed a Wembley triumph in 1985 and Barrow did so five years later, a success they repeated in 2010.

Richard Jolly hit a Barrow post early in the game, which was then delayed for some 25 minutes while visiting goalkeeper Danny Hurst was treated for a head injury. He was taken to hospital and replaced by Shaun Pearson.

When play resumed, it was Barrow who broke the deadlock in the 41st minute. A through ball from Adam Boyes sent Richie Baker clear to score.

Stones hit back hard after the break. Jolly equalised with a stunning volley in the 51st minute, his ninth goal in the competition and 28th in all, and Watford loanee Britt Assombalonga grabbed the winner from a corner on the hour.

The other two Ryman League survivors both had narrow escapes in the closing moments. Carshalton produced an outstanding performance to draw 0-0 at Conference Premier club Lincoln, for whom Alan Power struck the bar in added time.

Paul Vines had earlier hit a post for the Robins.

East Thurrock should perhaps have done better than their 1-1 draw against Hampton but the Conference South outfit almost stole it at the death when Josh Huggins hit a post.

They had taken an 11th-minute lead when Tom Stephen deflected a cross into his own net, after which Rocks were well on top without finding their finishing touch.

Sam Higgins hit a post in the first half and it was Higgins who eventually equalised in the 80th minute, firing in the rebound after Craig Ross saved from Simon Peddie.

The only Ryman League club to go out were leaders Hornchurch, who were beaten 4-0 at in-form Conference Premier club Grimsby.

It was a harsh scoreline for Urchins, who played some delightful one-touch football but lacked a cutting edge in the absence of suspended top scorer Martin Tuohy.

The second Shaun Pearson to appear in this report headed Grimsby in front from an 11th-minute corner and Anthony Elding tapped in to make it 2-0 just before the half-hour.

Elding, unmarked, headed the third in added time at the end of the first half to leave Urchins with a near-impossible task. Michael Spencer almost gave them hope a minute after the break but his shot cannoned off a post.

Although Hornchurch dominated possession after that and Tommy Black had a close-range effort blocked on the line, it was the Mariners who completed the scoring with a superb strike by Conor Townsend in the 72nd minute.

WITH neither of the top two sides in league action on Saturday, Billericay had the chance to leapfrog them both and they duly reclaimed first place with a comfortable 2-0 home win over Wingate.

Richard Halle gave them the lead with a 12th-minute penalty after a foul on Jay May and centre-back Rob Swaine headed the second on the hour, confirming his position as the club's leading scorer with 12 goals in all competitions.

Fourth-placed Lewes were held to a 1-1 home draw by Kingstonian after taking the lead with a 17th-minute penalty by Paul Booth, awarded for a foul on Harry Harding.

They were unable to press home their advantage and K's deservedly levelled through Stuart Duff with nine minutes left.

Cray's home game against Tooting fell victim to a frozen pitch, leaving Bury as the only

other team in the top ten to see action. They failed to capitalise, going down 4-2 at Concord.

Steve King's header gave the hosts the lead midway through the first half but Lee Smith replied six minutes later.

Goals by Sherwin Stanley and Harry Elmes in the last four minutes of the half put Concord in command and Stanley headed another in the 58th minute.

Lee Reed pulled one back in the 76th minute but that was all the visitors could manage as the Beachboys further eased their relegation fears.

Canvey matched their island neighbours with a 4-2 victory at Aveley, though Millers were unlucky to gain no reward for their second-half fightback.

John Easterford's header gave Canvey the lead after 20 minutes and Bradley Woods-Garness, who earlier hit the bar, added a second on the stroke of half-time.

Millers had won 3-0 at Canvey in September, the first of their three league victories so far, and they gave themselves a chance of completing the double.

Dave Knight reduced the arrears on 65 minutes and levelled the scores with eight minutes of normal time to play.

But Canvey had the last words with a pair of goals in added time.

Jay Curran headed them into a 3-2 lead and Jason Hallett was credited with the fourth after an attempted clearance by home keeper Adam Rafis struck him and rebounded into the net.

Aveley, in 21st place, are nine points adrift of safety and six points ahead of bottom club Horsham, who went down 2-0 in a poor game at Harrow.

Danny Buckle opened the scoring after 27 minutes and Tristan Toney completed it five minutes after the break.

The crunch game at the bottom was at Leatherhead. They beat Hastings 2-0 to move up to 19th, three points behind their defeated opponents with two games in hand.

Tommy Hutchings missed a penalty for Tanners in the 37th minute.

But they were awarded another spot-kick three minutes after the interval and Mark Simmons made no mistake. Hutchings added the second midway through the half.

ENFIELD Town retained the leadership thanks largely to an outstanding goalkeeping performance by Noel Imber, capped by a late penalty save from Dean Green which secured a 1-0 victory over Brentwood in front of another near-500 crowd at the QE II Stadium on Saturday.

Adam Wallace put Enfield ahead after 22 minutes but they wasted other chances and were lucky not to pay the price.

Brentwood came back strongly after the break, Tyler Campbell hit the bar, and Enfield finished with ten men after Dave Kendall was dismissed for the handling offence which led to the penalty.

So Leiston remain a point behind Enfield, with a game in hand, after their own 3-2 victory at Sudbury.

Gareth Heath's early goal for Leiston was wiped out by James Baker's header on the half-hour but the visitors were 3-1 up by half-time thanks to Stuart Broadley, with a 22-yard free-kick, and a goal by Rhys Henry.

There was no more scoring until the second minute of added time, when Baker gave Sudbury some consolation with his second of the day.

Needham Market made a welcome return to form and reclaimed third place, ahead of Grays who had no game, with a 4-1 home win over Maldon.

They also regained their position as the league's top scorers with 67.

Rhys Barber put them ahead after 21 minutes and James Evans made it 2-0 two minutes later.

Both full-backs are regular members of the team but neither had previously scored this season: slightly ironic on a day when the squad featured two newly-signed forwards.

The newcomers played their part after the break: Lee McGlone set up the third goal for Danny Bloomfield on the hour and, after Liam Coleman had pulled one back from the spot, Tommy Smith marked his return to Needham with a goal in added time.

Harlow are the latest occupants of fifth place, overtaking Tilbury by beating them 3-0 at Barrows Farm. Jeff Hammond played the starring role.

One foul on Hammond earned Paul King his marching orders in the first half; another enabled Danny Brown to give Hawks the lead with a 36th-minute penalty.

Michael Deane made it 2-0 ten minutes after the break and Hammond got the goal he deserved with 11 minutes left.

Potters Bar moved into play-off contention with a 3-0 victory at Heybridge, making it eight goals in two games.

Jack West missed several chances for Swifts before a fine goal by Bradley Harrison opened the scoring in the 56th minute. James Gershfield added another in the 79th minute and a fierce free-kick by Joe O'Brien completed the tally.

Chatham's 3-1 home win over Waltham Forest could have been far more convincing. They were two up in eight minutes with a penalty by Lee Hales and a header by Joe Fuller, who hit the woodwork twice before half-time.

Outplayed Forest got back into the game when Efe Echanomi scored in the 73rd minute but Jack Jeffery restored the two-goal margin shortly afterwards.

Josh Hutchinson's 88th-minute penalty gave Cheshunt a 2-1 success at Thamesmead. He had opened the scoring with a 25-yard shot in the ninth minute, only for David Noel to reply at once.

There was no change at the bottom: a frozen pitch at Ware denied them the chance to move out of the relegation places by beating Great Wakering, and bottom club Ilford's game against Romford suffered a similar fate along with Soham's trip to Waltham Abbey.

DULWICH welcomed their biggest league crowd for almost seven years on Saturday as they took on Bognor in the clash of the top two.

But there were to be no goals to delight the 717 spectators at Champion Hill, although Dulwich had the better chances, and Bognor remain on top of the table.

Whitehawk moved above Dulwich into second place, a point behind the leaders, with a straightforward 3-0 home win over -struggling Whyteleafe.

Kyle Vassell put them ahead after 19 minutes, Ben Godfrey made it 2-0 early in the second

half and Paul Armstrong netted the third with 15 minutes left.

Folkestone slipped back to fourth but did well to come from 2-0 down to take a point at home to Godalming after playing with ten men from the 15th minute, when Liam Friend was sent off for handling on the line.

Jack Delo saved the subsequent penalty from Ryan Lake but could not prevent Scott Harris netting twice in the last five minutes of the first half to put G's in control.

Stuart King began Folkestone's comeback with a 72nd-minute penalty and Darren Smith saved a valuable point with a low shot four minutes from time.

A goal by Ellis Green less than 30 seconds into the second half was enough to give Maidstone a 1-0 home win over Burgess Hill, who had Akwasi Edusei sent off in the first half. The top five are now covered by just three points.

Worthing lost ground on Maidstone, where they drew 0-0 in the week, with a similar result at home to Walton & Hersham.

Rebels are three points behind Stones but still seven clear of seventh-placed Chipstead who kept their hopes alive with a 1-0 home win over Crawley Down.

Marcus Cassius was the marksman early in the second half.

Top scorers of the day were Walton Casuals, who beat Sittingbourne 5-1.

The Brickies found themselves two down in seven minutes thanks to goals from Anthony Morrison and Richard Taylor, but should have been level by half-time.

Joe Goldsmith reduced the arrears on the half-hour and had to chance to equalise from the penalty spot five minutes later, only for Gareth Williams to make the save.

Josh Gallagher made it 3-1 with 15 minutes left and completed a quickfire hat-trick with two goals in added time.

Two other games produced six goals, with Ramsgate's 4-2 home win over Merstham avenging a defeat by the same margin when the sides met in Surrey.

It was Merstham who took the lead with a 21st-minute penalty by Roscoe Dsane but Ian Pulman equalised on 37 minutes and Steve O'Brien converted Simon Pettit's long throw to put Rams ahead before the break.

O'Brien repaid the favour by supplying the cross for Pettit to head the third on 56 minutes.

Liam Thomas pulled one back with another header ten minutes from time, and it took a 90th-minute strike by Michael Yianni to make sure of the points.

Hythe won by the same margin at Whitstable. Brendon Cass gave them the lead after 28 minutes and Dave Cook added another six minutes before the break.

Damien Abel pulled one back midway through the half but Ronnie Dolan quickly restored the two-goal margin and Craig Thompson made it 4-1 in the 88th minute. There was still time for Abel to provide Whitstable with a little consolation by netting his second.

Eastbourne drew 1-1 at Faversham after taking a 25th-minute lead through Nathan Crabb. Adrian Stone levelled matters moments before half-time and both sides missed chances to win it later.

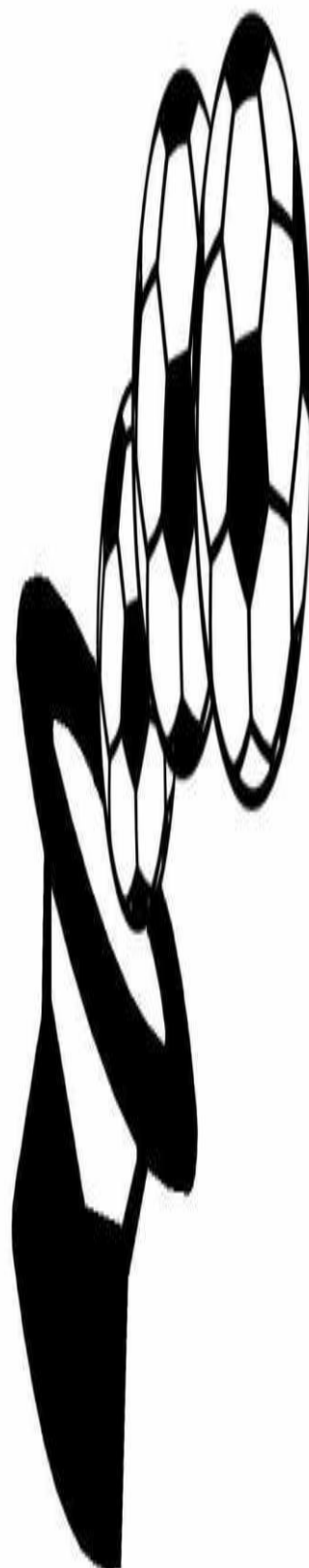

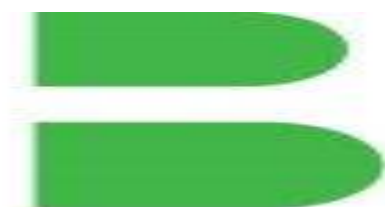
