## ALL THE ACTION

### FA Trophy

WEALDSTONE were beaten 3-1 in the first leg of their semi-final at Newport on Saturday and face an uphill struggle when the action resumes at Grosvenor Vale this coming weekend.

Stones made a positive start but were dealt a major blow when the home side took the lead in the sixth minute. Keeper Jonathan North came out of his area to head away a long ball but sent it straight to Elliott Buchanan, who lifted it into the unguarded net.

North saved well from the same player after 20 minutes but the resultant corner was headed against the bar by Gary Warren and Nat Jarvis followed up to make it 2-0.

Stones got the goal they needed four minutes into the second half and it came, inevitably, from Richard Jolly who took his Trophy tally to a remarkable 13 by pouncing on a loose ball to net his 36<sup>th</sup> of the season in all

Both sides were now creating chances, and it was Newport who converted one to put themselves in a strong position for the return match.

It came with 12 minutes left as David Pipe sprinted down the right unchallenged and crossed for Darryl Knights to shoot home.

All is not yet lost for Stones but they will need a stirring performance this Saturday if they are to reach Wembley.

The match is all-ticket: they will be on sale at the home Ryman Premier game against Horsham tonight (Monday).



### Premier

A PAIR of second-half goals from Chris Henderson fired Lowestoft right back into the title race on Saturday.

The Trawlerboys' poor away form in 2012 had left them struggling to stay with the top two, but their 2-0 victory at Met Police was coupled with dropped points for the sides above them.

Staforde Palmer hit a post for the Met during a lively but scoreless first half and it was the 65<sup>th</sup> minute before Henderson broke the deadlock, using his chest to divert Lubo Guentchev's cross into the net.

He struck again nine minutes later to put his side within six points of leaders Billericay with two games in hand.

Billericay had to come from behind twice just to earn a 2-2 home draw with bottom club Horsham, for whom Daniel Morris opened the scoring on the half-hour.

Courtney White replied on the stroke of half-time but Blues were shocked again when Tony Nwachukwu restored Hornets' lead in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute.

This time Jay May took only seven minutes to head the equaliser, after which heavy pressure failed to yield a winner.

Hornchurch suffered their second successive defeat, 2-0 at Hendon who moved back into the top five. The hosts defended in depth for much of the game and took the points with goals in added time at the end of each half.

Elliott Charles put them ahead, nodding the ball over the line after Urchins failed to clear a corner, and Isaiah Rankin broke clear to net the clincher shortly after a post had denied Tommy Black an equaliser.

Cray dropped out of a play-off berth after being held to a 1-1 draw by improved Aveley. Leigh Bremner, a half-time substitute, justified his entry by heading Cray into the lead within three minutes but Danny Francis squared it for Millers with six minutes left.

Leatherhead made it an unbeaten day for the bottom four (though Tooting had no game) with a goalless draw at Margate. Curtis Robinson hit the bar for the home side in a drab affair.

But the sides in the relegation spots all lost ground on 18<sup>th</sup>-placed Harrow, who moved three points clear of Leatherhead, with a game in hand, after a 3-1 home win over East Thurrock.

They had a flying start when Danny Leech scored from a first-minute corner but Rocks dominated for long periods after that. Kye Ruel levelled the scores on 18 minutes and Harrow were lucky not to fall behind before Leech struck again just after the hour.

They were even luckier with their third goal in the closing stages; a defender sliced a clearance against a post and the rebound cannoned into the net off keeper Richard Wray.

Hastings remained six points clear of the drop zone with a 1-1 home draw against Canvey, who had the better of things and took the lead through

Bradley Woods-Garner six minutes before half-time.

They should have stretched their advantage but their failure to do so enabled Zac Attwood to rescue a point with a 72<sup>nd</sup>-minute header.

Lewes revived their play-off hopes with their first win of the year. Nathan Crabb's second-minute strike was enough for a 1-0 home win over Carshalton.

But Concord's late charge up the table lost momentum as they were held to a 1-1 home draw by Wingate.

Tony Stokes put them ahead with a penalty two minutes before half-time but Wingate keeper Bobby Smith denied them further goals and substitute Ola Williams squared matters in the 74<sup>th</sup> minute.

An exciting game between Kingstonian and Bury Town on Sunday ended in a 1-1 draw, slightly strengthening Bury's hold on fourth place and lifting K's to eighth, still seven points adrift of a play-off position.

An end-to-end affair in the sunshine somehow remained goalless until the 78th minute, when a foul by Ian Gayle allowed Lee Smith to give Bury the lead from the spot.

K's replied within two minutes through substitute Louis-Rae Beadle, making his debut for the club, and it finished all square, just as every other meeting of the sides has done.

John Sands had a late chance to win it for Bury but shot wide.

FEW pundits expected Tilbury to be among the promotion candidates this season, but Paul Vaughan's men have maintained a strong challenge throughout and they moved up to fourth on Saturday with a 5-2 win at Waltham Forest.

The sides exchanged penalties in the first half, with Alex Read putting Dockers ahead on 23 minutes and Addian Clifton replying on the stroke of half-time – or not quite, as it turned out, for there was still enough time left for Tom Webb to put Tilbury 2-1 up at the break.

Anthony Iyaki headed Forest back on terms five minutes into the second half but they could not respond after another Read penalty in the 72nd minute – his fifth goal in two games.

Late strikes by Gary Henty and Joe Collins made it convincing.

Tilbury's neighbours Grays reclaimed fifth place thanks to a late Ilford own goal after letting a 2-0 lead slip at Rookery Hill.

Joao Carlos scored in the 33<sup>rd</sup> minute and added another just after half-time to put Grays in command, and Rob Carter then missed a penalty for the visitors in the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute.

But Grays failed to clear the ball and Carter found the net. When Danny Gabriel made it 2-2 on the hour Ilford were scenting a third successive victory which would have done them a power of good in their survival fight.

Instead, Loui Hazlewood sliced Nathan Gordon's cross into his own net to give relieved Grays maximum points.

Harlow, who were fourth, dropped two places after a 3-1 defeat in a crunch clash at third-placed Needham Market.

The Marketmen were second best almost all afternoon but David Cowley's 35<sup>th</sup>-minute goal was all Harlow had to show for their efforts.

They paid the price in the last ten minutes as a Deakan Napier double either side of one by Duane Wright allowed Needham to open up a six-point gap between themselves and Tilbury.

The top two both won as well, so Leiston stay four points clear of Enfield Town who are in turn seven ahead of Needham.

Leiston enjoyed a 4-0 home win over Chatham, who did not deserve to be so heavily defeated. The first half was even but the only goals went to the leaders, through Michael Brothers in the seventh minute and Gareth Heath in the 34<sup>th</sup>.

Heath struck again on 69 minutes to end Chatham's resistance but, despite heavy pressure, Leiston could score only once more, when Rhys Henry made the most of Heath's pass with ten minutes left.

Enfield were given a fright before completing their 3-2 win at bottom club Ware. It looked simple enough for Enfield as Mark Kirby netted after 14 minutes, Leon Osei added another after 38 and Tom Quarry's own goal made it 3-0 at half-time.

They were cruising until two Ware debutants made their mark towards the end.

The much-travelled Jamie Richards scored in the 80<sup>th</sup> minute and former Waltham Abbey man Jon Shields pulled another one back with three minutes of normal time left.

Apart from Harlow, the day's other big losers were Brentwood, whose 1-0 defeat at Sudbury saw them drop from fifth place to ninth, still only three points behind Tilbury.



A game of few chances was settled by a Jamie Griffiths strike after 40 minutes and Sudbury edged up to eighth.

Immediately ahead of them are Redbridge, who will be disappointed to have been held to a 1-1 home draw by a Thamesmead side they beat 4-1 in Kent only ten days earlier.

Joe Afusi hit the post for the visitors before Shane Wyllie put the Motormen ahead at the end of the first half.

James Donovan equalised with a powerful header in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute and the bar denied Joe Gardner a winning goal which would have lifted Redbridge into a play-off slot.

Potters Bar almost closed the gap on the other play-off contenders, but had to settle for a 1-1 home draw with relegation-threatened Great Wakering after conceding a penalty in the fourth minute of added time.

Joe O'Brien's 30-yard free-kick in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute looked certain to be the only goal of the afternoon.

But then Matt Bennett brought down Dan Williams and Jack Carlile converted from the spot to earn Wakering a vital point. They stay 21<sup>st</sup> but now trail Ilford only on goal difference.

The frustration of letting two points slip was not the final one for the home side, who had Anton Agdomar sent off in the short time that remained.

There was another 1-1 draw at Waltham Abbey, where Adam Flanagan headed visiting Maldon into a well-deserved lead at the end of the first half only for Tim Shaw to reply five minutes after the restart.

An eighth-minute goal by Hussein Isa gave Romford a 1-0 win at Heybridge, who came closest to an equaliser when Luke Callander hit the bar.

Cheshunt fielded three new signings against Soham, the first home game for new manager Tony Faulkner, and one of them, John Megicks, hit the bar in a goalless draw. Soham's Scott Carter was sent off midway through the second half.

THE battle for the title is as tight as ever after the top three all picked up full points on Saturday.

Bognor maintained their one-point lead, with a game in hand, by hitting four unanswered goals at Burgess Hill.

James Crane headed in a cross from Ashley Robinson to provide a 25<sup>th</sup>-minute lead but Rocks

had to wait until the 72nd minute for their second, from Ben Johnson.

They doubled their tally in the last two minutes with strikes from substitute Sonny Cobbs, his first touch, and Kane Wills.

Whitehawk had to work hard for their 2-1 home win over Merstham, who had the upper hand for much of the afternoon.

Visiting keeper David Wilkinson saved a Paul Armstrong penalty and it looked as if he would be fully rewarded when Liam Wright gave Merstham an 82<sup>nd</sup>-minute lead.

But Hawks responded in the style of title-chasers, with Lee Newman and Joe Keehan netting in the last five minutes.

Dulwich trimmed Whitehawk's goal-difference advantage over them to two with a convincing 3-1 win at Folkestone, whose eighth-minute opener from Josh Burchell turned out to be a false dawn.

It was all Dulwich after that. Ishmail Kamara, in the 24<sup>th</sup> minute, and Kalvin Morath-Ginbbs, in the 58<sup>th</sup>, both headed home from Kevin James corners, and James added the third with an 83<sup>rd</sup>-minute penalty.

There is now a 13-point gap between Dulwich and fourth-placed Maidstone, who could only manage a 1-1 home draw with Eastbourne.

Baff Addae put Stones ahead on the half-hour but Kai Bichard replied on 58 minutes and Eastbourne looked the more likely winners after that.

Worthing were held to a 0-0 home draw by Corinthian-Casuals in an uneventful affair but the point was enough to lift the Sussex side into fifth place ahead of Folkestone.

For much of the season it has appeared that the current top six were the only contenders for promotion, but while it has turned into a three-horse race at the top the rest must now be looking nervously over their shoulders.

Coming up fast on the rails are Godalming, who are within four points of Worthing with a game in hand after a 2-0 home over Ramsgate.

The clubs started the day level on points, though Rams had played one extra match, and it was G's who boosted their challenge with a goal late in each half.

Dan Read put them ahead on 39 minutes and, although the visitors upped their game after the break, Jamie McClurg clinched victory with seven minutes left.

That enabled Chipstead to climb to eighth and very much into contention with a 2-0 home win of their own.

Jordan Brown opened the scoring on 19 minutes and the Brickies, short of goals all season, never looked likely to respond before Rob Watkins netted the second with 20 minutes left.

Greg Andrews found his goalscoring touch in no uncertain terms for Walton & Hersham, striking four times in 17 first-half minutes to set up a 5-3 win at Crawley Down.

Tom Burton put the hosts ahead on 16 minutes but Andrews converted penalties in the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> minutes, then completed a nine-minute hat-trick. Hassan Nyang promptly pulled one back for the Anvils but Andrews got his fourth and Graeme Purdy made it 5-2 just before the break.

Jamie Cade reduced the arrears four minutes into the second half but that proved to be the end of the goal feast.

They would have been happy with even one goal at Walton Casuals, where Faversham battled out a 0-0 draw. At least Casuals gained their first point in five games

And finally . . . Whyteleafe's game against Hythe had to be abandoned after 30 minutes - because of a bee!

You might want to laugh, but in all probability referee Ashley Slaughter does not see the funny side of it.

The unfortunate official suffered a severe allergic reaction after being stung and had to be treated on the pitch for a considerable time before being taken to hospital.

Hythe were leading 1-0 at the time with a Nick Reeves goal.
