## ALL THE ACTION

### FA Trophy

WEALDSTONE failed in their bid to reach the FA Trophy final yesterday (Saturday) when they were held to a 0-0 draw by Newport County at Grosvenor Vale in the second leg of their semi-final, thus going down 3-1 on aggregate.

Stones were anxious for an early goal to put the pressure on the Welsh side, but strong defence by the Conference Premier side ensured that they had little chance to get it.

Some fine saves by home keeper Jonathan North kept his side in with a chance. At the other end, Richard Jolly was never given the opportunity to add to his 13 Trophy goals and, although Stones never gave up, Newport clinched a maiden Wembley appearance against York City in the final.



### Premier

ON A Saturday when Horsham's relegation from the Ryman Premier was confirmed, there was potentially decisive action at the other end of the table as Billericay opened up a four-point lead at the top.

They produced a solid display to win 2-0 at relegation-threatened Leatherhead while their rivals slipped.

Always on top, Billericay took the lead just before half-time when Jay May headed home a cross from Dave Collis. Harrison Chatting added the second in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute.

Cray moved back into the play-off places with a 2-1 win at second-placed Hornchurch, the sixth home defeat for the title challengers.

Leigh Bremner squeezed a low shot inside a post to put Cray ahead in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute only for Martin Tuohy to reply within 60 seconds, his 21<sup>st</sup> league goal of the season.

Skipper Joe Vines clinched three precious points for the visitors when he arrived unchallenged at the far post to convert a low cross in the 88<sup>th</sup> minute.

Lowestoft are seven points off the pace, though they have a game in hand, after their 2-

2 draw at Lewes. It could have been worse: Nathan Stone saved the Trawlerboys in the final minute of added time with his first goal since his switch from Leiston.

Nathan Crabb scored twice in the first 13 minutes as play-off hopefuls Lewes took an early grip, and Steve Robinson almost made it three when he hit the bar.

Dean Sinclair's penalty two minutes before the interval handed the Trawlerboys a lifeline which, eventually, they grabbed.

They are only three points ahead of Suffolk rivals Bury, who made short work of Horsham with a 3-0 home victory.

Lee Smith volleyed home Kieran Leabon's pass in the 14<sup>th</sup> minute, Leabon himself made it 2-0 on 32 minutes and Lee Reed slotted in the third seven minutes later, after which Bury were content to cruise.

Horsham's relegation, with seven matches left to play, was confirmed by a late goal which gave ten-man Harrow a 2-1 home victory over Met Police, in the process dealing a blow to the Met's play-off challenge.

Danny Buckle headed Harrow into a 26<sup>th</sup>-minute lead which they held until Eddie Smith equalised with another header in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute.

When Aryantaj Tajbakhsh was sent off in the 85<sup>th</sup> minute it seemed that Harrow could hope for a draw at best, but Simeon Akinola forced in their winner in added time.

The result lifted them above Hastings on goal difference and the pair are six points clear of the relegation zone. The bottom four all lost without managing a goal between them.

Leatherhead, in 19<sup>th</sup> place, look to be the only one of the quartet with any chance of survival.

Tooting are 11 points short of safety after their 1-0 defeat at East Thurrock, where they held out for 82 minutes before Sam Collins turned in Kye Ruel's cross to settle it.

Tooting in turn are four points ahead of Aveley, who were beaten 2-0 at Kingstonian.

The match was notable for a return to goalscoring form by Bobby Traynor, who had netted only once in the previous 14 league matches.

He volleyed K's into the lead midway through the first half and headed another shortly before the interval.

If Traynor, the top scorer in his division for the past three seasons, is back to his best K's will fancy their chances of closing the six-point gap between themselves and a play-off spot.

Canvey, a point ahead of K's, maintained their hopes by inflicting Carshalton's 11<sup>th</sup> home defeat of the season.

It was settled by a single goal by Dean Mason two minutes before half-time.

Hendon slipped out of the top five with a 2-0 defeat at Concord. Tony Stokes put the Beachboys ahead after 34 minutes and Hendon had Michael Lewis sent off soon after half-time.

Stokes netted again on 71 minutes, his 21<sup>st</sup> league goal of the season, and the race for the golden boot in the division is now an intriguing one.

Margate's departed Kwesi Appiah still shares the lead with Wealdstone's Richard Jolly on 22 goals. Tuohy and Stokes are one behind, with Wingate's Leon Smith on 19 and East Thurrock's Sam Higgins on 18.

Jolly must be favourite because of his side's backlog of fixtures: their FA Trophy heroics have left them with 12 matches to play.

Smith boosted his total with Wingate's second goal in their 3-1 home win over Hastings.

Leon Fisher's early goal was Wingate's only reward for dominating the first half and Hastings hit back soon after the break through Bradley Goldberg.

Ross Parmenter's chip allowed Smith to restore Wingate's lead seven minutes later and David Laird wrapped it up with 15 minutes left.



## North

TILBURY striker Alex Read maintained his unstoppable form as his side won a crucial game in the play-off battle yesterday (Saturday).

His two goals took his haul to ten in four games and earned Dockers a 2-1 victory at Brentwood, who stay in ninth place and find themselves eight points short of the play-off places.

Daniel Ailey gave Brentwood a 12<sup>th</sup>-minute lead but Read equalised with a free-kick in the 33<sup>rd</sup> minute and converted a penalty on the stroke of half-time after he had himself been fouled.

Brentwood's misery deepened when Peggy Lokando was sent off in the second half.

Dockers stay fourth on what was a big day for the top five, who all won while their pursuers all slipped up.

There was no change in the situation at the top as Leiston stayed four points clear of Enfield Town with a 2-1 home win over Waltham Abbey.

The visitors took a surprise lead through Adam Bolle in the 11<sup>th</sup> minute but Luke Hammond replied moments later and his corner was headed home by Leon Ottley-Gooch just before the half-hour for what proved to be the winner.

The Abbots were a little unlucky to gain no reward for a spirited performance in the second half.

It was easier for Enfield, who thrashed Ilford 5-0 to dump the Foxes back into the bottom two. Leon Osei opened their account in the 16<sup>th</sup> minute, Liam Hope added a penalty and Michael Ewang made it 3-0 at the break.

Hope struck again with 20 minutes left, passing Needham's Sam Newson to become the division's top scorer with 22 league goals, and Tyler Campbell finished it off.

Needham themselves stayed three points clear of Tilbury in third place, letting a 2-0 lead slip at Potters Bar before edging home 3-2 thanks to a Joe O'Brien own goal.

Duane Wright put the Marketmen ahead on 13 minutes and Angelo Harrop doubled the lead nine minutes after the break.

The Scholars, with their play-off hopes fast fading, pulled one back in the 64th minute through James Gershfield.

Reece Loudon's free-kick squared it with 12 minutes left only for O'Brien's mishap to provide Needham with their 96<sup>th</sup> league goal of the season two minutes later.

Grays remain a point behind Tilbury in fifth place after coming from behind to win 2-1 at bottom club Ware.

In a far closer contest than the league table would have predicted, Ware went ahead with a Grant Cooper own goal after 19 minutes.



Lee Flynn's deflected free-kick levelled it before half-time and Jake Hall nabbed the winner eight minutes into the second half.

Grays' day was marred when their experienced midfielder Kenny Beaney received a second yellow card in the closing stages.

Sudbury and Redbridge dealt a blow to each other's hopes with a 1-1 draw in Suffolk.

The Motormen should have had all three points after James Robinson gave them a 20<sup>th</sup>-minute lead. He later hit the bar with a penalty and the hosts punished him when Nathan Clarke equalised in the 88<sup>th</sup> minute.

So Sudbury stay sixth, now three points behind Grays, while Motormen move up to seventh, three further points back but with a game in hand in all the sides above them.

Harlow are a point further back and they, too have a game in hand which is, in fact, a vital home match against Redbridge on Tuesday.

The Hawks were beaten 2-1 at mid-table Romford, conceding an 82<sup>nd</sup>-minute winner to Kurt Smith two minutes after drawing level with a Mark Taylor penalty. Boro had initially taken the lead with a Jack Barry header on the stroke of half-time.

Great Wakering moved out of the relegation zone with a 2-2 home draw against Cheshunt but will be annoyed that they failed to take full points.

Lewis Sparrow gave Wakering a good start with a fifth-minute strike but Sam Ruff replied two minutes before the break. Jack Carlile missed a penalty for the home side, who regained the lead through Dan Williams in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute.

Cheshunt then had Jordan Lumsden sent off but the ten men earned a penalty in added time and Josh Hutchinson made no mistake.

Soham took to the field for the first time under new manager Steve Fallon, who previously masterminded Histon's rise from the Eastern Counties League to the Conference Premier play-offs, and battled out a 0-0 draw at Waltham Forest.

It looked as if the outcome would be the same at Heybridge until Frazer Walker headed a 90<sup>th</sup>-minute winner for Thamesmead.

Chatham and Maldon drew 1-1, with Joe Fuller giving Chats a 15<sup>th</sup> minute lead which Sos Yao wiped out midway through the second half.



## South

THREE days after an impressive 3-0 win at Maidstone had given Folkestone's play-off chances a considerable boost, it all went wrong for them as they crashed to a 5-0 defeat at lowly Walton & Hersham yesterday (Saturday).

Greg Andrews gave the Swans a 27<sup>th</sup>-minute lead with a top-class strike and although that was the only goal of the first half, Folkestone finished it with ten men after the dismissal of top scorer Stuart King.

Jason Henry scored twice in as many minutes soon after half-time and Andrews netted twice more to make it seven goals in two Saturdays for the back-to-form predator.

Folkestone drop back to fifth, level on points with Worthing, who climbed two places to fourth, and Maidstone, who slipped to sixth.

Worthing cruised to a 3-0 home victory over Faversham. Ryan McBride opened the scoring after four minutes and headed another just before the half-hour, with Paul Kennett adding the third soon after the interval.

Maidstone were set to bounce back from Wednesday's defeat as they took a 2-0 lead at third-placed Whitehawk. Shaun Welford got both goals, a header after 21 minutes and a classy effort eight minutes before the break.

But Hawks hit back to make it 2-2 with goals from Sam Fisk on the hour and Jerahl Hughes in the 71<sup>st</sup> minute. Only two outstanding saves by John Whitehouse prevented them completing the turnaround.

Godalming are within a point of the other play-off contenders after winning 2-1 at Hythe to end the home side's distant prospects of a top-five place.

Darren Wheeler converted a 13<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty to give them the lead and, after Dave Cook headed the equaliser in the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute, Jamie McClurg quickly put G's ahead again. Hythe pressed hard to no avail.

Those dropped points for Whitehawk were good news for the top two, who are now three points ahead of them.

Bognor retained the leadership, on goal difference from Dulwich and with a game in hand, with a 3-1 victory at Chipstead, another side whose play-off hopes now look to have gone.

After a goalless first half, Terry Dodd gave Rocks the lead in the 49<sup>th</sup> minute.

He made it 2-0 with a 25-yard drive in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute and James Crane added another moments later.

Stuart Axten's own goal provided some consolation for the hosts.

Dulwich won 2-0 at Whyteleafe, who remain eight points adrift at the foot of the table.

Frankie Sawyer opened the scoring on 32 minutes, popping in the rebound after Ishmail Kamara's header hit the bar, and Calvin Morath-Gibbs clinched the points with ten minutes left.

Whitstable put any relegation fears firmly behind them with their fourth successive victory.

Scott Heard scored two goals in six minutes around the half-hour mark in their 2-0 home win over Walton Casuals.

Eastbourne, beaten only three times away from home all season, maintained that record with a 2-1 win at Sittingbourne.

Scott Kirkwood gave them the lead, against the run of play, right on half-time and Matt Geard headed a second eight minutes after the break.

A Bradley Spice free-kick gave Sittingbourne vain hope with 17 minutes to go.

Fabio Saravia's 15<sup>th</sup>-minute goal was enough to give Merstham maximum points at Corinthian-Casuals.

Ramsgate came from behind for a 2-1 victory at Crawley Down.

Jamie Cade gave the Anvils the lead after 57 minutes and Hassan Nyang was denied a rapid second by a post before Joe Taylor levelled it on the hour.

Ian Pulman got the winner with 12 minutes left after dispossessing keeper Mark Zawadski.
