Respect Co-ordinator for the Ryman League

This is the second season we have run the Ryman League Respect Programme, in line with the FA National Initiative.

Having achieved the Regional Silver and the National Gold Awards for the 2011 / 12 season, it was always going to be difficult to retain those titles.

The League did achieve the regional Silver Award this time round, but despite equalling our on-field performance of the previous season we were denied the prestige of the Gold Award. The adjudicating panel favoured our counter parts in the Northern Premier League on this occasion, even though they had declined to take part in the Disciplinary pilot scheme.

Despite a lot of work behind the scenes football, as we know, is a results business and the deciding factor was no doubt that the Northern Premier League had reduced their dissent cautions for the 4th season running.

The League is, in numerical terms well behind the NPL, and a big effort by all Clubs will be needed if we are to the awarded Gold in 2014. The challenge we have set ourselves is increasing members to 72 clubs (an increase of 10%), but managing to keep the cautions at the same level, or dare I say, reduce this season's total of 512.

Collectively we can achieve this. Let's get that total below 500.

The Board has a few ideas for next season that are being addressed, and we will have more information at the pre-season meeting.

In the meantime, thank you for your support, enjoy the summer, and see you in August.



At the wrong end of the table, Tooting & Mitcham United's performance could not have been more contrasting, 2011/12 saw them receive one dissent caution, but sadly it all changed this season, with a total of 14.
