WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Dartford are the 2010 Ryman League champions. And they clinched the title in real style on Saturday with a 6-2 away win at their nearest rivals, Kingstonian.

They went into the game needing just two points from their last seven matches – but they were in no mood to hang about. Elliot Bradbrook and Ryan Hayes put them 2-0 up in the first 13 minutes and, after Simon Huckle replied for K's, Danny Harris headed home to restore the two-goal gap before the interval. Bradbrook punished a defensive mix-up three minutes after half-time to put the result beyond real doubt. Bobby Traynor made it 4-2 with his 34th goal of the season before Darts had the last words through Hayes and top scorer Lee Burns.

The Kent side went to the top of the table on the first Tuesday of the season and were never caught. They dropped their first points in their fifth game, a 1-1 home draw with Wealdstone, and then reeled off eight more victories to open up a huge gap at the top. Their first defeat did not come until November 28, when they went down 1-0 at home to Hornchurch, and they did not drop an away point until they lost 1-0 at Billericay on February 2. So far they have won 14 of their 16 games on the road.

For Kingstonian it was the third defeat of the week and, although they remain second, Sutton are one point behind them with two games in hand after their 2-1 victory at Canvey. Anthony Joseph got their winner after

Richard Halle had scored for the islanders early in the second half to wipe out Sonny Cobbs' 18th minute opener.

Boreham Wood stay fourth after a goalless draw at Wealdstone, for whom Danny Spendlove hit a post, while Hastings remain in fifth place despite a 2-1 home defeat by relegation-threatened Sussex rivals Bognor who defied the loss of goal ace Jason Prior, injured in the warm-up. Patrick Cox and Dan Beck scored early in each half for the Rocks, Sam Adams pulling one back.

Hastings are two points behind Boreham Wood and both have three games left. A point further back, with two games in hand, are Tonbridge, and Aveley are one point behind them with yet another game in hand.

Tonbridge strolled to a 3-0 win at Horsham after Anthony Storey's free-kick gave them an early lead. Another Storey free-kick was headed home by Sam Long just after the break and Jay May added a late third.

It was much harder going for Aveley, who trailed 2-1 after 90 minutes at Margate but stunned their hosts with a double in added time to win 3-2. A Dan Young levelled matters before Danny Gabriel grabbed a dramatic winner, his first goal since moving from Waltham Forest. That was a cruel blow for Margate, who remain in the bottom four and have played three more games than the teams below them. Their first-half lead provided by a Nick Barnes penalty was wiped out by Martin Tuohy, who claimed his 20th league goal of the season in the 73rd minute. But when Jay

Saunders restored Margate's lead in the 86th minute it looked all over.

David Ray's 89th minute header for Carshalton gave them a vital 2-2 home draw with Harrow, for whom Rocky Baptiste netted twice. The Robins replied to his first-half opener five minutes after the interval, when Richard Orlu was sent off for a foul which produced a penalty. Byron Harrison's kick was saved but he converted the rebound. Baptiste, though, headed home four minutes later to put the ten men in front again. Ray's late effort lifted Robins to 17th, above Ashford (Middx) who are suddenly in trouble after going down 2-1 at Hendon, their sixth successive defeat. They are a point ahead of Margate and two ahead of Bognor, whose chances of survival were massively improved by today's win.

First-half goals from Peter Dean and Casey Maclaren put Hendon in command but Kevin Maclaren's own goal after 65 minutes gave Ashford hope. Then, down to nine men after the dismissals of Russell Canderton and Brian Haule, they could have salvaged an unlikely point in the last minute, only for Berkley Laurencin to save Paul Johnson's penalty.

Maidstone are next to bottom after going down 1-0 in a dull affair at Hornchurch. The highlights were a superb save by home keeper Darren Behcet from Danny Hockton's header, which denied Stones a half-time lead, and Ross Wall's neat lob to win it in the 70th minute.

Waltham Abbey remain at the bottom after Danny Charge and Dave Wareham were on target in a 2-0 win for visiting Billericay whose keeper, Paul Nicholls, was a busy man in the early stages.

Colin Lockett's ninth penalty of the season gave Cray a 1-0 home win over Tooting and they are now, surely, safe from the drop. Paul Vines had several chances for Tooting but, for once, his marksmanship was faulty.

Division One North

Lowestoft Town, for many years among the powerhouses of the Eastern Counties League, finally took the decision to move into regional football after winning the championship in 2009. And they have been swiftly rewarded, capturing the Division One North title at the first attempt. They needed only one point from their home game against Cheshunt on

Saturday but, like Dartford in the Premier, they were in no mood to mess about.

It looked as if a crowd of 1,139 would truly have a day to remember as the Trawlerboys romped into a 4-0 lead in the first half-hour, with Gary McGee's quickfire hat-trick making them the first club in the League to have two players with 20-plus league and cup goals to their credit. He has 21, Matt Nolan 31. Jamie Godbold was their other scorer this time. They were to add only one more, from Joe Francis seven minutes after the break, and Tom Tresadern scored a late consolation for Cheshunt to make it 5-1 before the Suffolk party began in earnest.

Success in the FA Cup and the consequent backlog of league fixtures meant that it was some time before Lowestoft established themselves at the top of the table but they have always looked likely champions. The only serious hiccup came when they went down 1-0 at home to Ilford on the second Saturday of the season but they dominated that game and it had the air of a freak result. They were not to be beaten again until February and they have lost only once away from home, a 5-0 thrashing at second-placed Concord which exactly avenged the result at Lowestoft in August. They have so far rattled in 108 league goals and, with four games left, have the power to add plenty more.

East Thurrock, meanwhile, completed the play-off line-up with a 5-2 home win over Ilford. The inevitable Sam Higgins got them going with his 36th goal of the season after four minutes. Sam Berry made it 2-0 and, in the second half, Kris Newby netted twice before Steve Sheehan got the fifth. Troy Hewitt scored in added time at the end of each half for Ilford, his second coming from the spot. It was his fifth goal in two games.

The other three teams who have qualified for the play-offs enjoyed mixed fortunes. Concord were beaten 2-1 at Heybridge, all the goals coming in the first quarter, but are still favourites to finish second. Tom English gave Swifts a fifth-minute lead and Danny Heale replied before Reece Morgan's 20-yard strike proved decisive.

Wingate & Finchley, in third place, demolished Harlow 6-0 with the help of a Chris Chase double. Ahmet Rifat got the opener and Chase made it two before the prolific Leon Smith grabbed his 28th of the season. Gary

Burrell added a fourth before the break and second-half goals came from Chase and Craig Ellis.

Enfield Town slipped back to fifth after being held to a 1-1 home draw by Redbridge. Dave Blower's own goal gave Motormen the lead midway through the first half and, despite being reduced to ten men when Wayne Grant was red-carded, they held out until six minutes from time before Stuart Blackburne tapped in a pass from Adam Wallace. Had Redbridge held out they would have secured their place in the league for next season by moving out of the reach of 21st placed Leyton, who held out for a 0-0 draw at Great Wakering and thus made sure that Harlow would finish bottom though, as it happened, Harlow's heavy defeat would have settled that issue anyway.

Leyton's only real hope now is that Ilford lose their appeal against a potential nine-point deduction for fielding a suspended player. If Ilford suffer the penalty they will be only two points ahead of the east London rivals.

Five games in this division could not affect the promotion or relegation issues. Romford were the only home winners in those games, beating Maldon 2-0. Matt Toms put them ahead after 24 minutes and Chris Thomas added a second in the closing stages.

A pair of Scott Orphanou goals gave Northwood a 2-1 victory at Ware, ending their run of seven straight defeats. Matt Turpin pulled one back before Northwood's Sam Phillips and Ware's Danny Swift had a late disagreement and both saw red.

Tilbury's Nathan Gordon scored the only goal of their game at Waltham Forest. Andy Thomas hit a post for Forest before Gordon headed the winner on the hour. Potters Bar went ahead after nine minutes through Jordan Watson and looked set to turn it into victory over visiting Thamesmead until Kayan Kalipha replied with ten minutes left to make it 1-1.

It was the same scoreline at VCD, who hosted Brentwood. The hosts had two efforts cleared off the line before Danny Penny put them ahead in the 36th minute. Brentwood had Darren Blewitt sent off on the hour but equalised with 15 minutes left through Piers Wixon.

Division One South

Substitute Ben Godfrey was the hero as Croydon Athletic retained their status as Division One South title favourites on Saturday. Jack Pallen's 27th minute goal for Chatham threatened to produce a surprise defeat for the leaders until Godfrey scored twice in the last eight minutes to keep Croydon four points ahead of Folkestone, who have a game in hand.

Folkestone themselves scored three for the first time since December 1, Brendon Cass claiming a double in their 3-1 victory at Whitstable. It was 2-0 after 18 minutes, Darren Smith adding a penalty to Cass's opener. Steve Lloyd replied for the lowly hosts on the hour and only ten minutes were left when Cass made sure.

Worthing are seven points behind Folkestone, having played a game more, after their 1-1 home draw with Merstham. Ben Williamson gave Rebels a 25th minute lead but Dale Marvell's penalty squared it before the break.

The Rebels are now only one point ahead of charging Leatherhead, who made it nine wins on the trot with four unanswered goals at Eastbourne. Mark Simmons made the breakthrough with a long-range shot in the 25th minute and Greg Andrews doubled the lead ten minutes later. Jon Coke's penalty four minutes into the second half put the result beyond doubt and Andrews notched his second in added time. It looks grim for Eastbourne, three points adrift at the foot of the table with only two games left.

Godalming came from behind to win 2-1 at Whyteleafe. Mark Hammond's free-kick put Leafe in front eight minutes before half-time but it was 1-1 at the interval thanks to a Arjan Tajbakhsh penalty, after he had been tripped, and Williams won it just before the hour. Godalming retain fifth place with games in hand on all the sides above them.

Fleet, who have played two games more, remained a point behind them thanks to Eddie Smith's strike soon after half-time in a 1-0 home win over Corinthian-Casuals. The other two main contenders, Burgess Hill and Sittingbourne, saw their hopes hit by away defeats and both may now have too much to do. The Hillians' six-game winning streak was ended by a lone Will Jenkins goal at Walton & Hersham. He pounced when a Martin Grant effort came back off the bar.

Sittingbourne succumbed to a goal in each half at Ashford, who took a giant step towards safety. Laurence Harvey opened the scoring on the half-hour and Mitch Sherwood converted a penalty soon after the break.

If Sittingbourne can revive their promotion hopes they will do it the hard way. They play Cray Wanderers in a Kent Senior Cup semi-final at Bromley on Tuesday, then face home league games against Chipstead and Godalming on the next two nights. It will be free admission for all for the latter game. A trip to Walton Casuals on Saturday completes the exhausting spell of four games in five days, and then they must travel to promotion rivals Godalming and Burgess Hill on Tuesday and Thursday of next week.

Walton Casuals gave themselves a chance of staying up with a 3-1 victory at Met Police, their second success in three games after they had gone without one since Boxing Day. Steffan Gaisie scored twice in the first 26 minutes as they moved out of the bottom two, climbing above Whitstable on goal difference. Paul Honey's penalty eight minutes from time gave the Met late hope, only for Mu Maan to reply with the clincher. Whitstable's three games in hand could still be decisive.

Dulwich took a 20th minute lead through youngster Nyren Clunis at home to Horsham YMCA, for whom Terry Dodd replied before half-time. There was a double blow for Dulwich eight minutes from time when Ellis Wilson-Joseph was sent off and Luke Gedling converted the free-kick. But Frankie Sawyer saved the ten men, making it 2-2.

Chipstead and Ramsgate battled out a goalless affair. Two Ramsgate goalies shared the clean sheet, Sam Mott replacing the injured Danny Twyman at half-time.

Youth League

A wonder goal by Maidstone's Alex Flisher was a highlight of the week's Ryman Youth League programme.

The league's top scorer, Nathan Faulkes, had struck twice in the last six minutes of the first half to give Stones a 2-0 lead at Tilbury but Alex Teniola replied in the 65th minute to give Dockers some hope. It was short-lived. From the kick-off the ball was laid back to Flisher and, from his own half of the centre circle, he lofted the ball Beckham-style into the net. Ivan

Tihati scored a second for Tilbury and so Flisher's super strike proved to be the decider in a 3-2 Maidstone victory which preserved their unbeaten league record and took them to the top of the East Division.

The other game in that section was a 3-3 draw between the bottom two, Welling and Thamesmead. Ryan Wall's 90th minute goal denied Thamesmead two points.

Top scorers of the week were Corinthian-Casuals, who hammered Chipstead 8-2 in the Central Division. Chipstead scored first through Jake Wilgoss, who also pulled it back to 2-2 after Matt Robinson and Kieron Charles-Whitton had put Casuals in front. Casuals scored twice more before half-time and added four more after the break, with Robinson claiming a hat-trick.

That result did not affect the leading positions. The important result came at Sutton, where two penalties by Bajrush Halili led the home side to a 3-1 win over Carshalton. They remain unbeaten and are two points behind leaders Croydon Athletic with three games in hand. Tooting completed their season with their one and only draw, a goalless affair against Kingstonian, and retained second place for the moment.

Woking struck a blow in their quest for the West Division crown with a 4-1 home win over Hayes & Yeading. George Frith grabbed two of the goals as Woking retained their eight-point lead over Ashford (Middx). Woking, though, have only one game left while Ashford have four to play and Hayes, three points further back, have five.

Ashford maintained their challenge by hitting back from 2-0 down to win 4-3 at Harrow, for whom Romaine Walker netted twice in a losing cause. Lewis Wombwell got the decider in the 76th minute.

South Division champions Lewes moved closer to a perfect season with their tenth win out of ten. They had to fight to see off visitors Burgess Hill, the only goal of the game coming from Scott Manning in the 64th minute.

It means that Lewes will finish at least ten points clear of the field. Worthing, 11 points adrift at the moment, beat Horsham 4-0 in their last game to give themselves a good chance of taking the runners-up spot. Leatherhead

are two points behind them and have one game left – but that is against Lewes.

Kieran Lunn hit a 19-minute second-half hat-trick as Leatherhead, 1-0 down at the interval, stormed to a 4-1 victory at Horsham YMCA. Eastbourne could also finish second but must beat YMCA by a four-goal margin in their final outing.

It was a good week for Sutton, who also progressed to the last eight of the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup. Halili was their match winner, scoring an extra-time goal to provide a 2-1 victory at Wimbledon. Brentwood also reached the quarter-finals with a 2-1 success at Cray, and were joined by Maidstone United on Friday evening – 2-1 winners at Eastbourne Town.
