The award for the “Team Performances of the Month” recognises a particularly noteworthy performance by a Club during the month from any of its first team matches in all competitions played.

Concord Rangers Football Club, who three seasons ago were playing in the Essex Senior League, travelled to sixth placed Hastings United for a midweek match in their Premier Division debut season. Following an excellent performance by the Essex team, they were able to return home with three points from an emphatic 3-0 win. The Club have therefore won the Macron Premier Division Team Performance award for August/September.

A second Essex club, Brentwood Town, are winners for the Division One North Team Performance award for their FA Cup replay win against AFC Hornchurch. Having held the Premier Division club to goalless draw in the first match in their Second Round Qualifying tie, Brentwood deservedly won the replay with a last minute goal from Darren Blewitt.

Clubs in Division One South were stunned on Tuesday evening, 21st September to hear news of Whitehawk Football Club's tremendous 6-0 home win against high flying Sussex neighbours Burgess Hill Town. A goal up in the first minute, three goals in each half, with two coming from Jerahl Hughes, saw the Brighton based club win the Macron Team Performance award for Division One South for the month.

## WEEKEND REVIEW

### Premier Division

It's as you were at the head of the Premier Division, where the top six teams all won on Saturday, and not much different at the other end of the table where seven of the bottom eight collected one point between them.

The exceptions were Tonbridge, who recently handed manager Tommy Warrilow an extended contract despite their poor start to the season. Their faith was rewarded as Warrilow's men crushed Hornchurch 7-1, Urchins' worst defeat since they were beaten by the same score at Northwood in January 1996. Tonbridge won 7-1 at Ashford (Middx) in November 2008.

Frannie Collin led the way with a hat-trick, beating the offside trap to open the scoring in the fourth minute. New signing Claude Seanla made it 2-0 after 34 minutes but when a Ross Wall header reduced the arrears five minutes later no-one would have predicted the 5-1 half-time scoreline. Chris Piper, Collin and another newcomer, Jamie England, left Urchins in a state of shock at the break. Seanla added the sixth on 54 minutes and Collin completed his treble just before the end. It was all a bit of a contrast with Angels' previous outing, a 4-0 home defeat by Cray.

And the Wands maintained that away form with three unanswered goals at Aveley, who slipped to 20<sup>th</sup> place. Ross Lover put Cray ahead on 16 minutes and John Guest's overhead kick made it 2-0 on the half-hour. Cray suffered a huge blow when Laurent Hamici, the division's top scorer, was sent off just before the interval but Aveley could not take advantage and Mark Willy headed a late third.

Aveley drop below Folkestone, who managed a point at home to Concord but remain in the bottom four. James Hawes put Concord ahead after 70 minutes, Simon Austin replied after 82 and visiting skipper Nicky Cowley was sent off in the closing stages.

Folkestone remain in the relegation zone only by virtue of the alphabet, mind you, for Croydon Athletic have the same number of points and identical goal figures after their 4-0 defeat at Hendon. New signing Danny Wishart, an 18-year-old on loan from Hayes & Yeading, put Hendon ahead after 25 minutes

and struck again in added time at the end of the first half, though there was still enough time for Jamie Busby to make it 3-0 at the break with a solo effort. Substitute Belal Aite-Ouakrim added a late fourth.

The bottom two were both beaten, although Maidstone were unlucky to go down 3-1 at home to Carshalton. Danny Hockton almost made it 2-2 when he headed against the bar in the 89<sup>th</sup> minute, Robins broke away and Mblive Lokando clinched it. Lokando had been involved in both earlier goals, scored by Joel Ledgister after 28 minutes and Byron Harrison after 65, in between which Adrian Stone netted for Stones.

Bottom club Horsham took a 21<sup>st</sup> minute lead through Jack Page at Billericay. But a foul on Danny Charge allowed Dave Collis to level from the spot nine minutes later and it was Charge who pounced on Paul Kennett's wayward back-pass for the 76<sup>th</sup> minute winner.

So much for the bottom end of the table. What about the top? Well, Sutton chalked up their seventh successive league win to remain a point clear of Lowestoft with a game in hand. Debutant Elvis Hammond put them ahead in the first minute of the second half against Margate at Gander Green Lane. Improving Margate replied through Dean Grant in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute and would have been well worth a point. But Tom Davis grabbed Sutton's winner with 12 minutes left.

Scott Mitchell gave Lowestoft the lead on the stroke of half-time at Wealdstone and Adrian Forbes completed a 2-0 victory with a late debut goal.

Third-placed Kingstonian were also 2-0 away winners, at Canvey. Max Hustwick's header gave them an early lead and Bobby Traynor doubled the advantage seven minutes into the second half. K's had Jean-Sylvain Dossou sent off with 15 minutes left but that was no help to the islanders.

Bury Town enjoyed a two-goal away victory as well, 3-1 in their case, to stay fourth. That was at Tooting, where Kieran Leabon, who netted two late goals in Bury's midweek FA Cup win at Grays, completed a hat-trick of sorts with an early one. Tooting dominated for long spells after that without finding the net and a header by Neil Andrews doubled the lead on 72 minutes. Karl Beckford revived Terrors' hopes

with a penalty shortly afterwards but Les Reed made sure for the visitors in the 81<sup>st</sup> minute.

Hendon and Carshalton, already mentioned, remain fifth and sixth, and Hastings moved up to seventh after ending a four-match losing streak with a 2-0 home win over Harrow. The goals came in a five-minute spell midway through the second half, from Ade Olorunda and Michael Phillips, though the latter should really be recorded as an own goal; the ball came back off the woodwork and bounced in off Harrow keeper Nick Jupp.

## FA Trophy

Sudbury were given the fright of their lives in Saturday's FA Trophy tie at Merstham. Two goals apiece by Tom Webb and Steve Wareham, one by Nathan Clarke and a Russell Banyard own goal gave the visitors a 6-0 lead by the 56<sup>th</sup> minute and booked their place in the next round. Or did it?

Harry Ottaway managed a reply after 76 minutes and Dale Marvell converted a penalty a minute later. That was some consolation for the Surrey club, but then a quickfire double by Ben King brought an impossible escape within reach. There were two minutes plus added time to go, but shaken Sudbury held out for a 6-4 victory.

There is often discussion of the relative strengths of the league's two Division Ones and Sudbury's win contributed to a decisive verdict in favour of the North, who came out on top 6-2 in the eight ties pitting clubs from the regional sections against each other. It will be some time before significant further evidence can be obtained; the draws for the next round of the Trophy and the Championship Manager Cup have each produced only one such North v South contest.

The second-placed clubs in each division met at Leatherhead and that was a comprehensive win for the North as Enfield Town fired three unanswered goals. Michael Bardle's opener was followed by a goal in each half from 37-year-old veteran Bryan Hammatt.

Horsham YMCA struck an early blow for the South when Brannon O'Neill's free-kick gave them a third-minute lead at Wingate. But goals by Ahmat Rifat, Gary Burrell, a penalty, and Josh Cooper put Wingate 3-1 up by the interval and Lewis Jones added a fourth.

Redbridge, winless in the league, saw off Chatham 2-1 at Oakside. Kevin McLeod, ten years and two days after his Premiership debut for Everton, set up two goals for Alex Read in the last 18 minutes, with Lee Maskell replying in the last minute of normal time.

Just down the road, Ilford also enjoyed a rare success as second-half goals by Chuck Duru and Sam Adejokun accounted for Whitstable.

Corinthian-Casuals, without a win in the South, could not match Redbridge's success. They went down 3-0 at home to Potters Bar, with Jose Espinoza's eighth-minute opener being followed up by Ashley Harrison-Barker and Elvis Balic.

The honour of the South was maintained by Fleet and Whitehawk, the latter making their FA Trophy debut. Young Fleet striker Johnnie Dyer fired a hat-trick in their 3-1 home win over Tilbury, taking his season's haul to 11. The visitors actually took the lead through Joel Etienne-Clark in the 42<sup>nd</sup> minute but Dyer equalised before the break and completed his treble by the 64<sup>th</sup> minute.

Hawks, meanwhile, were 2-0 up in 13 minutes at Ware through Joe Gatting and Ben Godfrey. That was their lot and Sam Ruff pulled one back with four minutes left to set up a hectic finish.

Four all-South division ties produced three 2-1 away wins and one goalless draw, at Bognor where Whyteleafe were the visitors. Bognor's Jason Prior came closest to breaking the deadlock, hitting the bar in the second half.

Godalming, after suffering two defeats in the previous week by a combined total of 12-1, got back on course under their new management team with victory at Chipstead. Miles Jones gave them a half-time lead and Ellis Conroy levelled it early in the second half. The winner came with eight minutes left from Ashley Groombridge, his second goal in as many games since joining G's.

Martin Grant, back at Walton & Hersham from Whitehawk, gave them a fifth-minute lead at home to Faversham but hopes of a first win under former Godalming manager Chuck Martini were scuppered by a goal in each half for the Kent club, David Botterill and Damian Abel the scorers. It was not, incidentally, Faversham's first game in the Trophy. They

took part once previously, in 1974 as an Athenian League club, but went out at the first hurdle, 4-1 at Folkestone.

The third 2-1 away winners were Walton Casuals, a Charlie Ide goal in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute seeing them through at Eastbourne. Dan Lawson had given them a fifth-minute lead which Ashley Robinson wiped out from the penalty spot early in the second half, his ninth goal of the season.

Brentwood snatched victory from the jaws of defeat in their all-North division derby against East Thurrock. Anthony Ryan gave them a 42<sup>nd</sup> minute lead at home to East Thurrock but Kris Newby levelled with his ninth of the season before half-time and Neil Richmond put Rocks in front three minutes after the restart. Ellis Remy made it 2-2 midway through the half but Rocks seemed to have won it with an 85<sup>th</sup> minute own goal by Nikki Beale. Back came Brentwood, with Remy equalising again before Dean Green grabbed a last-gasp winner to earn his side another meeting with Hornchurch, whom they knocked out of the FA Cup in midweek.

Two goals in six minutes shortly after the interval, from experienced defender Steve Heffer and, from the spot, Dan Trenkel, gave Great Wakering a 2-0 success at Cheshunt while Thamesmead and Heybridge must meet again after a goalless draw.

That leaves five ties in which Ryman clubs met Zamaretto League opposition and it was the 'outsiders' who had the edge, winning three and drawing one.

The Ryman triumph was at Needham Market, who enjoyed their Trophy debut with a 4-2 home win over Hitchin. Craig Parker, the league's top marksman, set them on their way with his 13<sup>th</sup> of the season in the 13<sup>th</sup> minute. Dan Thrower and Sam Newson made it 3-0 by half-time and Darren Bethell added the fourth soon after the restart. Hitchin opened their account a few minutes later but their second goal did not come until moments before the final whistle.

One of the surprises of the day came at Imber Court, where mid-table Zamaretto side Biggleswade Town halted Metropolitan Police's perfect start to the season, holding them to a 1-1 draw. Trailing for most of the first half, the Met squared it through Craig

Watkins two minutes before the break but could not find the second goal that would have made it 12 wins out of 12.

Sittingbourne went down to two unanswered second-half goals at Arlesey and Maldon were beaten 3-1 at Barton with Kris Lee's goal coming too late to make a difference. Waltham Abbey went behind shortly before half-time at home to Soham, who clinched it in the last minute.

### Ryman Youth League

Wednesday was quite a night for Metropolitan Police. While the first team were hammering Godalming 8-1, the under-18s romped to a 6-2 Ryman Youth League victory in a Central division fixture at Chipstead. James Cottee netted twice.

That scoreline was matched by Maidstone at Horsham YMCA. Paul Mancktelow completed the scoring, and his hat-trick, with a last-minute penalty.

A more significant last-minute goal came from Joshua Fawcett of Burgess Hill. His strike gave the Hillians a 2-1 win over Worthing and maintained their 100 per cent record, matched only by Maidstone, after two games in the South-East Division. Two goals from Stacey Freeman helped Lewes to a 5-1 victory over Horsham and a Calum Dove double earned Whitehawk a win against Eastbourne by the odd goal in five.

Three teams have achieved two wins out of two in the West section; Hayes & Yeading lead the way after beating Barnet Amber 3-0. Staines are hot on their heels after seeing off Northwood 4-2. Mario Quiassaca scored

twice, including a first-minute opener. Ashford (Middx) landed their second successive 2-0 win, defeating Hampton with a goal in each half.

Kingstonian head the Central division with ten points from four games. Their perfect record was ended by Carshalton, who gained a 1-1 draw with a second-half goal from Delarney Ewerse. Sutton have yet to drop a point but they have played only once, and it's Leatherhead who lie second after a 2-0 win at Whyteleafe.

### FA CUP – FOURTH ROUND QUALIFYING DRAW

The draw for the Fourth Round Qualifying of the FA Cup will be made on Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> October at Wembley. The details of the draw for matches involving Ryman Football League clubs will be published on the League website, as soon as they are available.

## **CLUB GOSSIP**

### **AFC SUDBURY**

Not many players score the first goal of their career at the age of 41, but that was the feat achieved by AFC Sudbury's Richard Wilmot when he headed a dramatic equaliser in the sixth minute of added time against Maldon & Tiptree on Tuesday.

Wilmot has a good excuse for his lack of marksmanship in a career of well over 20 years, though: he is a goalkeeper.

He has always been something of a late starter; he was 23 before he made his Football League debut for Scunthorpe in April 1993, shortly after joining them from Stevenage Borough, who were then in the Premier Division of the Isthmian League. Despite keeping clean sheets in his first two games, Wilmot played only once more for Scunthorpe and returned to non-League football.
