WEEKEND REVIEW

FA Cup

The Ryman League's interest in the FA Cup is over for another year, but both Harrow Borough and Hendon can be proud of their performances in Saturday's first-round ties.

It was Harrow's third appearance in the first round and an emotional occasion for long-serving manager David Howell, who had been involved in both previous visits to that stage - as a player in 1983, when Harrow reached the second round in a season when they captured the Isthmian title by 17 points, and in 2000 as assistant manager.

His side faced a formidable test against League Two leaders Chesterfield at Earlsmead and were beaten 2-0. But they held out until the 74th minute and the second goal did not come until stoppage time. Not surprisingly, the visitors created the better chances and Nick Jupp had to perform some heroics between the posts to keep them at bay.

But it was by no means one-way traffic and Harrow's neat passing led to a number of corners. From one of them, soon after half-time, fabled FA Cup warrior Rocky Baptiste had a good chance which he put over the bar. The home side also had a first-half penalty claim turned down for a Dwayne Mattis challenge on winger Kenta Nakashima.

Troy Hewitt, the hat-trick hero of the previous round, had a header cleared off the line before full-time training began to have its effect in the last 20 minutes and Scott Boden escaped his

markers to head the Spireites into the lead from a corner.

Harrow refused to lie down and Hewitt put another header narrowly wide before Craig Davies finally put the tie beyond their reach.

"We just couldn't test the keeper enough," said the disappointed Howell. "We could and should have got at least a replay."

Hendon, on paper, faced an easier task at Conference South club Chelmsford but were given the runaround in the first half. Last year's Ryman League top scorer, former East Thurrock marksman Sam Higgins, put the Clarets ahead after eight minutes with his eighth FA Cup goal of the season and Billy Bricknell, Billericay's top scorer last season, made it 2-0 around the half-hour mark.

The stroke of luck Hendon needed came just before half-time. Aaron Morgan pounced on a weak back-pass and was brought down by Chelmsford keeper James Pullen, who was promptly sent off. Jamie Busby drilled the penalty past substitute keeper Ashley Harrison.

Brian Haule went close to an equaliser early in the second half and it was looking promising for the Greens until they were stunned by Anthony Cook's 30-yard rocket which made it 3-1 in the 68th minute.

Back came Hendon and Busby converted Lee O'Leary's pass to give them fresh hope with 11 minutes to go. They launched a desperate late assault in which Casey Maclaren and Lubo Guentchev went close but Chelmsford held out.

Premier Division

Sutton United moved four points clear at the top of the Premier Division with a comfortable 3-0 win at Maidstone on Saturday.

After a slow start to the game, Tom Davis put Sutton ahead in the 25th minute and the points were settled by goals shortly before and after the interval from Andy Forbes and Tom Kavanagh.

Lowestoft went one better, beating bottom club Horsham 4-0 at Crown Meadow to move into second spot, at least until Kingstonian play on Sunday. They wrapped it up even more quickly; Adrian Forbes put them ahead with a long-range cracker after 20 minutes, Danny Bloomfield and Joe Francis made the most of defensive errors by the 35th minute and Stuart Ainsley completed the scoring a minute after half-time.

Billericay and Bury moved into the play-off places with away victories. Sean Bonnett-Johnson gave the Essex club a half-time lead at Carshalton, who replied four minutes after the restart with a Byron Harrison penalty, his 13th goal of the season. Anthony Robinson restored Billericay's lead ten minutes later and Bertie Brayley made it 3-1 with a late goal. Saturday's win at Carshalton was the first time Billericay had won there since 1986

Bury took the points at Margate with a lone goal by James Scowcroft ten minutes after the interval. Margate had a number of chances, including a Curtis Robinson shot which hit the bar, before Scowcroft's 30-yard scorcher won it for the visitors.

Frankie Curley lifted Hornchurch to sixth place, playing the major role in their 2-0 win over Concord who slid from fourth to ninth. Curley headed home a Dave Collis free-kick in the 51st minute and, 12 minutes later, met a Collis corner with another header which was deflected against a post by a defender for Lewis Smith to finish. A fierce match produced ten bookings, including two for home winger Tambeson Eyong who was dismissed for kicking the ball away with six minutes left.

Canvey moved above their island rivals thanks to a Hussein Isa goal in the 64th minute which was enough to account for visiting Folkestone. Alex Rhodes almost added a second with a long-range strike that keeper Jack Delo managed to deflect against the inside of a post.

The Kent club remain in the bottom four, as do Aveley who went down 1-0 at Tooting. Geoff Pitcher converted a penalty just after the half-hour. Millers felt they should have had a penalty of their own before half-time but their appeals were rejected.

Kingstonian did the damage in the first half as they reclaimed second place in the Premier Division table with a 3-1 home win over Hastings on Sunday.

Dean Lodge scored after 25 minutes and Simon Huckle after 30, but the highlight was a superb move six minutes before the break which ended with Lodge backheeling the ball for Bobby Traynor to claim his 12th goal of the season. John Beales replied for Hastings with 20 minutes left but K's ran out comfortable winners.

Traynor's goal was his ninth in the league, putting him level with Laurent Hamici at the top of the Premier Division goalscoring chart - but not for long.

Hamici took his tally to ten, and his overall haul to 13, with a deflected free-kick in the 54th minute of Cray's home game against Wealdstone. It proved to be the only goal and lifted Cray to fifth place in the table.

Division One North

Potters Bar Town, third in Division One North, travelled to leaders Needham Market on Saturday and managed to keep the formidable home strike force off the scoresheet.

But Bar did the job for them; a freak own goal by Jordan Watson when he was hit by an attempted clearance in the 21st minute was enough to give the Marketmen all three points, though only thanks to Danny Gay's penalty save from Tom Pett as the visitors dominated the rest of the game.

The unlucky losers slipped down to eighth place in the congested top half of the table and Harlow, who were second, drop to sixth after a 4-3 home defeat at the hands of Cheshunt. A bizarre own goal played its part here, too. Jon Stevenson managed to find the wrong target from the opposition half after 37 minutes to put Cheshunt on terms at 2-2. Chris Meikle gave them the lead two minutes later and Darrell Cox netted his second of the game shortly after half-time to make it 4-2. David Cowley

reduced the arrears in the 72nd minute but, even though Cox was sent off with ten minutes left, the visitors held out. Earlier, Cox's 12th minute opener had brought an immediate reply from Steve Ferguson before Leon Hunter put the Hawks 2-1 up.

Wingate took over second place, coming from behind to win 2-1 at Enfield. The hosts had the better of the first half but Richard Morton's 12th minute goal was wiped out by David Laird three minutes before half-time and the free-scoring Leon Smith hit the winner midway through the second half, his 10th league goal of the season and 13th in all.

Romford, boasting the league's tightest defence, are up to third after a 75th minute goal by Alex Read was enough at Waltham Abbey. It might have been 4-3: Romford hit the woodwork three times and cleared three Abbey efforts off their own goal-line.

A single goal also did the trick for Maldon at Ilford, though after having a penalty saved by the excellent Pape Diagne they had to wait until the 89th minute for Craig Arnott's strike which put them in fourth place.

The final play-off spot is now occupied by East Thurrock, 2-0 winners in their derby at Tilbury. Kye Ruel put them ahead in the 56th minute and Tilbury debutant Billy Crowther was shown a second yellow card shortly afterwards. But it was the 90th minute before a Kris Newby penalty made sure of victory.

Former Wycombe player Kevin McLeod fired a second-half hat-trick as Redbridge moved out of the bottom two for the first time this season with a 4-1 home win over Waltham Forest, the only side below them at kick-off time. Ellis Skidmore maintained his fine form by heading an eighth-minute opener for the Motormen. Forest should have drawn level when Anton Agdomar was sent off in the 45th minute but Adam Bolle missed the resulting penalty. The ten men doubled their lead through McLeod 11 minutes into the second half and although Forest, still seeking their first win of the season, replied at once through Brian Okwera, they went down to ten men themselves shortly afterwards when Joseph Ellul was dismissed. McLeod wrapped up the points with goals in the 72nd and 86th minutes.

Another debutant was sent off at Thamesmead, who drew 2-2 with Sudbury.

Gabriel Momodu's early goal for the hosts provided a lead which they held until the 54th minute, when Rhys Darg equalised. A Momodu penalty in the 66th minute restored the advantage but in the last minute Richard Avery, just signed from Faversham, handled on the line and was dismissed before James Baker levelled matters from the spot.

There was a dramatic finish at Heybridge, where their clash with improving Great Wakering looked certain to end in a 0-0 draw. Then Ashley Hawkins netted an 86th minute goal for the visitors only for their celebrations to be halted by a Tom English reply two minutes later. But there was still time for Wakering to have the last word with a Bradley Walsh winner.

Top scorers of the day were Ware, who whitewashed Leyton 5-0 at Wodson Park. Murat Karagul opened the scoring after 18 minutes and Matt Turpin headed the second on the stroke of half-time. Luke Marshall stretched the lead with another header in the 70th minute and Ware wrapped it up with two late penalties, one apiece for John Megicks and Ryan Wade.

Essex rivals Grays and Brentwood battled out a goalless draw at Rookery Hill, with former Crystal Palace striker Simon Thomas missing Grays' best chance.

Division One South

Greg Andrews maintained his bid for the League's golden boot with his 14th goal of the season, all in Division One South, as leaders Leatherhead moved six points clear with a 2-1 win at Sittingbourne.

He converted a penalty a minute before half-time to put Tanners ahead and Mark Simmons added another on the hour with a free-kick that hit a post and went in off keeper Mark Reed. Tom Bradbrook replied eight minutes later with his 10th league goal – he and Wingate's Leon Smith are Andrews' closest challengers – but it was not enough.

Second-placed Metropolitan Police, the only unbeaten team in the league, let a lead slip and had to settle for a point for the third time in a week. They drew 2-2 at Chipstead, who had Ray Freeman to thank for an equaliser in added time. Craig Brown gave the Police a deserved lead in the 23rd minute but they could not increase it and Freeman broke clear from

halfway to make it 1-1 eight minutes before the break. Ty Smith's penalty soon after half-time looked as if it would decide it but some top-class goalkeeping by Joe Gant denied the Met further goals and Freeman punished their failure to clear a last-gasp cross.

Bognor are a point behind the Police after their 2-1 victory at bottom club Corinthian-Casuals. They had to work for it. Casuals led at half-time through a deflected Midi Nsubuga free-kick and, after Jason Prior headed the equaliser midway through the second half with his 14th goal in all competitions, James Fraser grabbed the winner with six minutes left.

Faversham will be wondering for some time how they dropped two points at Ramsgate. Dane Luchford put them ahead after 78 minutes and when he headed a second with five minutes left it looked all over. Rams threw everything forward, Sam Cliff pulled one back in the 89th minute and Warren Schulz fired home a 20-yard free-kick in the fourth minute of added time to make it 2-2.

Fortunes swung late in the afternoon at Whitstable, too. The Oystermen took a fourth-minute lead through Stuart Vahid and, after Mark Anderson made it 1-1 soon after the interval, Ian Pulman put the hosts in front again with a penalty on the hour. They stayed ahead until seven minutes for time, when Johnnie Dyer claimed his 18th goal of the season (his eighth in the league), and Darren Wheeler converted a penalty in the 86th minute to give Fleet a 3-2 victory.

Walton & Hersham are beginning to find some form after their poor start to the season and they enjoyed a 3-1 home win over Merstham, who had gone seven league games without defeat. Dean Thomas put Walton ahead and Michael Corbett replied to make it 1-1 at the break. The Swans regained the lead through Scott Todd in the 74th minute and Gary Frewen's late header made sure.

Worthing were the day's most convincing winners, hitting four unanswered goals at home to Whyteleafe. Ryan McBride made the most of a defensive blunder to open the scoring on 32 minutes and Jamie Groves added another four minutes later. Terry Dodd and Tom Manton doubled the score after the break.

Godalming also scored two in four minutes towards the end of the first half, James Hennessey and Gavin Smith the marksmen, and Graeme Purdy completed a 3-0 home win over Horsham YMCA 20 minutes into the second period.

Ben Godfrey's 35th minute goal gave Whitehawk maximum points at Dulwich, who were denied an equaliser by the woodwork for the second successive Saturday. Kevin James was the unlucky man this time.

Leroy Huggins touched in Nick Hegley's initial effort on 31 minutes as Chatham beat visitors Burgess Hill 1-0, while Eastbourne Town and Walton Casuals failed to manage a goal between them at the Saffrons.

Ryman Youth League

Match of the week in the Ryman Youth League came in the Central division, a nine-goal duel between Walton & Hersham and Leatherhead. Dale Malcolm put Leatherhead in front after 18 minutes but they were behind within ten minutes as Anthony Lapersonne and George Griffiths hit back for the hosts.

Malcolm made it 2-2 on 33 minutes and completed a first-half hat-trick in added time, though Griffiths got his second during the extra minutes as well and it was 3-3 at the break. Rory McDonald put the Tanners 4-3 up midway through the second half and, after Lapersonne squared it again with five minutes left, Malcolm netted his fourth to give his side a 5-4 victory which cut Kingstonian's lead in the division to eight points.

Second-half goals by Gary Percy and Frank Niamke gave Chipstead a 2-0 win at Whyteleafe in the division's other game.

Hayes & Yeading opened up a three-point lead in the West division. George Isaac got the decider as they came from two down to win 3-2 at Fleet. Third-placed Ashford Town (Middx) had a 4-0 home victory over Barnet Amber.

Whitehawk's goalless draw at Tonbridge was enough to take them to the top of the South-East section, while Oliver Lockyer scored twice as Burgess Hill beat Horsham 4-0.

There was a shortage of league fixtures as many clubs played their first-round ties in the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup.

Reece Hall scored both goals for Tooting in their 2-1 win at Eastbourne and Ted Howard's double helped Sutton through 3-1 at Horsham YMCA.

Matthew Rose-Hazel netted twice in Kingstonian's 3-1 home win over Woking and Jack Simon was on target twice in the last 17 minutes as Maidstone came from behind to beat Merstham 2-1.

Lewes needed extra-time goals from Ryan Quirke and Charlie Franks to clinch a 3-1 victory at Worthing while Staines' tie at Met Police was goalless even after the extra half-hour and Staines won 5-4 on penalties. Also through are Hampton, Maldon, Ashford (Kent) and Thamesmead.

There was one second-round tie. Bradley Ambrose gave Hendon a third-minute lead at Barnet (Amber), who equalised though Ifeyani Allen with five minutes left. Ambrose struck again ten minutes into extra time and Hendon won 2-1.

Carshalton were beaten 1-0 at Rushden in the first round of the FA Youth Cup and Northwood went down 3-1 at home to Dulwich. Paul McCallum scored twice for Dulwich, who are at home to Yeovil in the second round. They do not play in the Ryman Youth League, however; that competition's sole survivors are Woking, who will face Cheltenham or Oxford United.

BILLERICAY TOWN FC

Saturday's win at Carshalton Athletic was the first time Billericay have won there since 1986.

HASTINGS UNITED FC

There has been some recent publicity about adjustments that have been made to the playing budget at the Pilot Field, and the Club released the following statement ON Tuesday, 2nd November to clarify the issues that have sadly necessitated this course of action.

"At the start of the 2010/11 season, a budget was determined in line with various anticipated circumstances, this budget being set higher than had been the case in previous seasons. The simple rationale for increasing the budget, despite the economic downturn, was to improve the quality of the playing squad, which would hopefully have been reflected in greater success on the pitch, and in turn, the Club achieving the minimum average home attendance of 525 required to meet its forecast.

This forecast is reviewed on a weekly basis, especially after exiting both the FA Cup and the FA Trophy at the first hurdle, and although the team has performed well on several occasions, performances have not been consistent. It is believed that this fact, allied to the current financial climate, has contributed to a fall in attendances to a current average of only 458, resulting in a loss of revenue against that forecast, with recent attendances showing a continued downward trend.

Other factors have also detrimentally impacted upon the budget this season, the lower than anticipated attendances having a knock-on effect with a reduction in other matchday sales income for example. And although the Club is constantly "prospecting" for business, it has become increasingly difficult to source revenue through sponsorship, advertising and use of the Social Club, the latter of which continues to be poorly supported, despite numerous attempts over the years to increase its revenue.

As is good practice in any business, Hastings United will continue to review the budget versus its forecast throughout the entire season, reacting accordingly to any significant changes. The Club recognises that supporters will all want to watch a successful team, but this must be tempered with financial prudence to ensure that Hastings United is here for the long term. As for the current financial position, it should be noted that the Club is cash positive and still has no debt. The Club also recognises that manager Tony Dolby and the team will have difficult decisions to make in the coming weeks, and with more challenges lying ahead, it is vital that everyone at the Club provides as much support as possible both on and off the field.

For now, coach Mike Rutherford has left the Club, along with goalkeeper Clark Masters, in the wake of the cut in the playing budget. Having two goalkeepers of Ryman Premier standard was not likely to be sustainable in the long term, and Mike had been having trouble making it to some training sessions of late due to other commitments, but the Club would like to thank both for their contributions, and wish them every success in the future. Reductions to the playing budget are always unwelcome of course, but it must be stressed that taking such action now will ensure that there should not come a week when the kitty is empty and nobody gets paid for their efforts, a situation that the Club will seek to avoid at all costs."

LEATHERHEAD FC

Manager Mick Sullivan has recently made some new additions to the Leatherhead squad – Andy Ottley, a wide midfielder from Godalming Town and Des Boateng, a central midfielder from Maidstone United. Returning to the team is Bentley Graham, after his month's loan to Whyteleafe. Leaving the squad are Tom Williams and Rob Stevenson, who have both gone to Corinthian-Casuals; Francis Luke, who has moved to Beaconsfield and goalkeeper Adrian Jones.

MARGATE FC

Margate Football Club midfielder Darren Marsden looks set to quit the club citing increasing work commitments. Darren has been one of Margate's most consistent performers this season making 14 appearances and scoring two goals. The former Herne Bay midfielder signed for Margate during the summer.

Manager Iain O'Connell said: "I'm disappointed that Darren is going but I know he was going to find it impossible to do the travelling required in our league on a Saturday. I would like to thank Darren for his efforts at Margate and wish him well for the future."

Margate defender Sam Groombridge has signed for Ryman League Division One South Whitstable Town on a one month loan deal.

With Margate's regular back line playing consistently well, Sam has found his opportunities limited with the first team, having made four appearances this season to date. The 22 year old defender joins former team mates Jim Sherman, Kieran Morris and Louis Smith at the Belmont.
