WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

An eight-minute hat-trick by Joel Ledgister turned an uninspiring Premier Division game at Tooting into a Carshalton rout on Saturday. There was no sign of what was to come as the two sides slugged it out for 53 scoreless minutes. Then Ledgister enjoyed his purple patch and suddenly Carshalton led 3-0. Gary Noel made it four goals in 15 minutes with a penalty and he added another in the closing stages to leave Tooting on the wrong end of a 5-0 hiding.

With none of the sides above them in action, Cray had the chance to take over second place by winning at Canvey on Saturday. But they were beaten 4-2 and, to a degree, had only themselves to blame. They did not name a goalkeeper among their substitutes and so defender Aaron Day had to play the whole match between the posts after Dave King was injured in the warm-up. Then they had Danny Phillips sent off in the 63rd minute.

Day kept the islanders at bay until five minutes before half-time, when Danny Heale netted. Rob King and Jay Curran scored either side of Phillips' exit before Mark Willy's 74th minute header opened Cray's account and Allan McLeod reduced the margin further in the third minute of added time. There was enough time left for another goal, but it came from Canvey's Alex Rhodes.

So Bury move above Cray into fourth place after their 2-0 victory at Hastings, who have now gone four games without scoring at the Pilot Field. James Scowcroft put them ahead on the half-hour and Roscoe Hipperson added another before the interval.

Croydon Athletic, who moved off the bottom of the table with a midweek victory, had a glimpse of further success at Harrow before going down 3-1 in the only other fixture. Troy Hewitt's volley gave Harrow a 12th minute lead. They were always on top but Danny Elgar equalised in the 36th minute and Courtney Harris almost put Croydon in front on the hour, when he headed against the bar. Wayne Walters ended Harrow's frustration with ten minutes left and Rocky Baptiste fired home from 25 yards to clinch it.

Division One North

Football's a team game, of course, but Great Wakering skipper Dan Trenkel must have his doubts after scoring FIVE times on Saturday and finishing the afternoon as a loser.

Visiting Potters Bar somehow emerged as 6-5 winners of an extraordinary Division One North encounter. Four times they took the lead in the first half and four times Trenkel replied. And when Trenkel put his side ahead for the first time with a 75th-minute penalty he must have thought that his team would reward him for his efforts. Instead, substitute Leon Skinner made it 5-5 with nine minutes left and poor Trenkel could only watch in despair as Jose Espinoza snatched a last-gasp winner.

Espinoza had started the goal spree after three minutes. Elvis Balic, Tom Pett and Chris Doyle, with a penalty, also gave the visitors the lead before half-time, with Trenkel's answering salvo coming after nine, 22, 32 and 44 minutes, the first of them a penalty.

The last five-goal haul in the Ryman League was by Gary Noel, now of Carshalton, who contributed the lion's share to Croydon Athletic's 7-0 thrashing of Ashford (Kent) on the opening day of last season.

"It was a crazy game," Trenkel said. "It's great personally to score five, but I'd much rather not score and win 1-0. I am not going to moan about the rest of our side, after all they created five great chances for me to score, and as for the defending, well, I am part of that. It's one of those once in a lifetime games and although it is memorable for me, it is tinged with disappointment that we couldn't at least get a point."

On another day the game at Ware would have been captured all the headlines in the division. Title favourites Needham Market conceded three penalties, had three men sent off, and yet lost by only the narrowest of margins.

It all started in the first minute when Needham keeper Danny Gay saved Matt Mitchell's penalty. James Evans gave the visitors an 18th minute lead but Mitchell made amends for his miss with a 29th minute equaliser, only to have another penalty blocked by Gay on the stroke of half-time. Chris Sargent put Ware ahead on the hour and Dan Roles made it 3-1 moments later. Then, in the 70th minute, Roles was brought down by Gay and the keeper was sent off. Rhys Barber took over to face the day's third penalty while Mitchell was not given a chance to complete a hat-trick of misses, handing his duty over to Ryan Wade who made no mistake.

Trailing by 4-1 and one man, Needham's task looked hopeless. But then Ware had Sam Ruff dismissed, Craig Parker pulled one back in the 86th minute with his 20th goal of the season and Christy Finch cut the gap further as the game went into added time. Needham tried to retrieve the ball from the back of the net in a hurry and a scuffle broke out, at the end of which the visitors had Sam Newson and Nathan Stone sent for early baths, leaving Ware to hold out for a 4-3 victory.

And that was not the end of the unusual events in this division. Both Maldon and Brentwood collected three away points despite having to play for more than 20 minutes with nine men.

For Brentwood, admittedly, it was only a one-man disadvantage and they had established a 3-0 cushion in the first half-hour at Waltham Forest with two goals by Ryan Edgar sandwiching one by Ellis Remy. The flashpoint came on the hour when Ted Llewellyn and Forest's Brian Suchley were sent off after a clash, to be followed six minutes later by Brentwood's Dean Green. But there was no further scoring.

Dean Fenton's goal after 50 minutes proved to be Maldon's winner at Enfield but they made it hard for themselves. Paul Shave received his second yellow card in the 55th minute and Lee Blackburn suffered the same fate in the 69th.

The other four games were peaceful by comparison. Leaders Wingate went down 2-1 at promotion rivals East Thurrock, who scored 30 minutes into each half through Hakeem Araba and Max Cornhill. Sam Sloma made it an interesting finish when he scored direct from a corner with four minutes left.

Derek Hawtin struck five minutes from the start and eight minutes from the end of Ilford's 3-0 victory at Leyton. Ian Cooper made the most of a free header to score the other one after 28 minutes.

Waltham Abbey beat visiting Thamesmead 2-0. After Tyler Campbell's solo effort in the 40th minute they had to wait until added time for Emmanuel Osei's clincher.

The final game in the division was at Tilbury, where Cheshunt fought out a 0-0 draw. Chris Stowe hit the bar for Dockers.

Division One South

THE big match in Division One South on Saturday was at second-placed Whitehawk, who entertained unbeaten Metropolitan Police.

But Hawks gave themselves a huge handicap when Jamie Brotherton was shown a straight red card after only 12 minutes and the Police went on to win 2-0, recapturing second place. Ty Smith put them ahead after 28 minutes and Craig Watkins clinched it with his 12th goal of the season 13 minutes from time, following up

after a shot by Ron Edwards was parried by Alan Mansfield.

The Metropolitan Police are seven points behind Leatherhead with four games in hand after the Tanners dropped two points in a goalless draw at Faversham. It looked as if Faversham's efforts to deny the league's top scorers would come to nothing when they conceded a last-minute penalty. But Simon Overland saved Jack MacLeod's kick.

Burgess Hill moved up to fourth spot after Danny Curd's 56th minute header provided the only goal of their game at Sittingbourne.

There was little in the way of efficient defence at Godalming, where Dulwich ran out 5-3 winners. A header by Scott Bennetts gave the hosts a tenth-minute lead which was promptly wiped out by a Kevin James free-kick. Gerry Gonnella netted twice in three minutes just after the half-hour and Paul McCallum, whose midweek hat-trick earned Dulwich their fairytale FA Youth Cup tie against Newcastle, added his second senior goal in the 58th minute. Rob Gradwell made it 5-1 before James Hennessey managed a couple of late goals for the losers.

The Youth Cup game has been arranged for Thursday December 9 at Champion Hill, kicking off at 7pm. Admission will be £4 (£2 concessions).

The only other player in the division to score twice was Denva McKenzie, who struck in the 33rd and 35th minutes to earn Chipstead a 2-0 home win over Worthing.

Fleet's Johnnie Dyer became the first Ryman League player to reach the 20-goal mark in all competitions (beating Needham Market's Craig Parker by a few minutes) with his 71st minute effort at Ramsgate. It put his side in front for the second time, but an 89th minute penalty by Mark Lovell meant that it finished 2-2. Rams had Ollie Gray sent off in the short time that remained. Debutant Chad Coombes had claimed Fleet's opener on 51 minutes, with Paul Axon replying three minutes later.

Corinthian-Casuals are off the foot of the table, and out of the bottom two, after coming from behind to see off Merstham 2-1 at Tolworth. Louis Clark's goal early in the second half looked likely to be enough for Merstham, but

Saheed Sankoh equalised in the 75th minute and Rob Stevenson won it three minutes later.

Horsham YMCA are now bottom after going down 3-0 at home to Walton Casuals. Danny Buckle gave the visitors a half-time lead which was stretched by Michael Barima and a Steve Newman own goal.

Whyteleafe twice took the lead in their 2-2 draw at Eastbourne. Chris O'Flaherty opened the scoring midway through the first half, with Brad Manton replying just before the break. Kwabena Agyei restored Leafe's advantage six minutes after the restart but Eastbourne equalised again through Evan Archibald in the 62nd minute.

There were no goals at Walton & Hersham, where the home side had their pick of the chances as they shared the points with Chatham.

FA Trophy

Division One North side Sudbury produced the Ryman League's result of the day in the third qualifying round of the FA Trophy. They made the 700-mile round trip to take on Zamaretto League leaders Truro in Cornwall and enjoyed the journey home after a Steve Wareham double gave them a 2-1 victory.

Wareham put them ahead after 28 minutes but it looked as if Truro would have to make the marathon trip to Suffolk in midweek when former Fulham star Barry Hayles, scorer of 120 Football League goals, equalised after 77 minutes. They were spared the excursion when Wareham volleyed his second with four minutes left, though only a post prevented Truro skipper Martin Watts making it 2-2 at the death.

The league's other long-distance travellers were Hornchurch, who had a mere 230 miles to travel to reach Zamaretto Division One side Bideford. Urchins, too, enjoyed the return journey after winning 3-0. They missed a succession of chances in the first half but finally made the breakthrough when Rickie Hayles finished off a Dave Collis corner in the 66th minute. Elliot Styles headed home another Collis corner in the 80th minute and substitute Tommy Black made the most of a fleeting appearance with a brilliant solo goal.

Three other Ryman clubs met Zamaretto Premier opposition, achieving two wins and an away draw.

Wealdstone were hanging on for much of their visit to Brackley but stole victory in the 89th minute when Peter Dean squeezed the only goal of the game past home keeper Billy Turley.

Lowestoft, too, grabbed a last-gasp winner as they beat Swindon Supermarine 2-1 at Crown Meadow. There was a flurry of action around the 20-minute mark when Joe Francis put the Trawlerboys ahead only for Ben Wells to reply instantly for the visitors. There was plenty of action at both ends, with Jamie Godbold hitting the bar for the hosts, but no more scoring until the 89th minute when a Francis shot was parried and Jamie Forshaw buried the rebound.

Grays had to settle for a 2-2 draw at Cirencester after twice taking the lead through Simon Thomas. He opened the scoring after 24 minutes from Dean Pennant's cross and Matt Sysum levelled matters two minutes before the break. It was Thomas again on 50 minutes but this time Ciren were quickly back on terms through Carl Brown and that ended the scoring.

Andy Forbes scored 23 goals for Eastleigh during their one and only Ryman League campaign, 2004-05, but otherwise this phenomenal goalscorer for Hampshire clubs has made little impression in Ryman circles. He looks set to change that after joining Sutton from Woking, initially on a three-month loan. Forbes already has six goals to show for his short stay at Gander Green Lane after firing a hat-trick to see off Billericay in Saturday's all-Premier Division tie.

Two of them were penalties, netted at either end of the first half to give Sutton a 2-0 lead. Anthony Robinson put the visitors back in it soon after the break and, after Forbes completed his treble on 76 minutes, Seb Schoburgh revived Billericay again. Bradley Woods-Garness clinched Sutton's 4-2 win over his former club with a long-range strike in added time.

The other all-Ryman tie produced a shock as Division One Harlow whipped Premier side Maidstone 3-0. The damage was done in a short spell either side of half-time by Harlow debutant James Peagram, who opened the scoring in the 40th minute, struck again immediately after the interval and set up the third for Che Stadhart in the 54th minute.

Four Ryman clubs had to face Conference South opposition. Only Bognor survived, and by the skin of their teeth. They drew 2-2 at home to Hampton, the equaliser coming from James Fraser in the sixth minute of added time. Bognor went ahead with a 32nd minute own goal but Ian Hodges levelled four minutes later and Dean Inman's tap-in after 74 minutes seemed to have settled it.

A goal in the 11th minute of each half by Richard Gillespie accounted for Folkestone at Eastleigh. A superb free-kick by Darren Smith just after the hour put the Ryman side back in the picture but they could not avert a 2-1 defeat despite the return from injury of their top striker James Dryden.

Luis Cumbers scored after 59 minutes to condemn Tonbridge to a 1-0 defeat at Welling and Romford could not recover from a fifth-minute goal by Ali Chabaan as they went down 3-0 at Boreham Wood. An own goal by Matt Toms made it 2-0 after 36 minutes and Sam Hurrell's free-kick completed the scoring with ten minutes left.

So Monday's draw for the first round proper, when Conference Premier clubs enter the competition, will include eight Ryman League clubs. Four from the Premier Division and two from Division One North are definitely through while two clubs, one from each section of Division One, will be involved in replays.

Ryman Youth League

Thamesmead were the top Ryman Youth League performers in another week when the programme was badly hit by rain. They recovered from a 2-0 half-time deficit to win 3-2 at Metropolitan Police in the Central division with a last-minute goal by Josh Wilson.

Matt Cornish and Jordan Bird gave Police their two-goal lead in the first 26 minutes. Wilson began the comeback early in the second half, Arlie Desanges squared it in the 67th minute and Wilson struck again to give the visitors all three points.

That was the only game played in the division and the West section fared even worse, with no matches getting under way.

Four games were completed in the South-East division and Maidstone went to the top of the table thanks to a 76th minute goal by James

Withers which earned a 1-0 victory at Eastbourne.

Previous leaders Whitehawk were held to a 1-1 draw at Ashford (Kent) and the result was the same at Burgess Hill, where Welling were the visitors.

Worthing recovered to beat visitors Tonbridge 3-2 after conceding a second-minute goal to Sam Beale, who scored again after the hosts had gone 3-1 up with Shaun Charles netting the all-important third.

Wingate & Finchley enjoyed a remarkable 5-2 home victory over Aveley in the first round of the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup. Millers led 2-0 after 27 minutes and that remained the score until there were only eight minutes left. Then Wingate scored twice to save the game and added three more in extra time.

Ryan Robinson got the only goal as Chipstead won their first-round tie at Leatherhead to avenge the first team's 1-0 defeat on the same ground in the Championship Manager Cup 24 hours earlier.

Woking, the Youth League's last survivors in the FA Youth Cup, went down 4-2 at home to Cheltenham in the second round despite taking the lead through Jack Mazzone. The visitors were 4-1 up shortly after half-time and George Frith's late goal was merely consolation.

Dulwich's under-18s, who do not play in the Ryman Youth League, reached the third round by beating Yeovil and were handed a dream tie at home to Newcastle United (see separate story).

PITCH INSPECTIONS

The procedures for pitch inspections are documented on page 92/93 of the current League handbook and on the Information Page on the League website.

The League Secretary, Bruce Badcock, must be informed in advance in all cases of the date and time when a pitch inspection has been requested, and then of the outcome once the inspection has been completed and a decision taken. This will enable the current status for matches that are in doubt or have been postponed to be carried on the League website.

With the continued uncertain weather approaching, home clubs must make provisional arrangements for pitch inspections in advance of match day.

In the first place the Match Referee must be contacted. If the match referee is unavailable or lives too far away to sensibly attend, then another Level 3 Contributory League referee should be used.

If for any reason this is not possible, permission must be obtained for a Level 4 official (Contributory League assistant referee) to undertake the inspection from the League

Secretary, Bruce Badcock, or from the FA Appointing Officers Dave Cook or John Jones.

Where the match referee does not make the inspection, in ALL cases the inspecting official must speak to the match referee from the pitch/ground for the decision to be confirmed.

A match postponement form must be completed at the time, signed by the inspection official, and sent (faxed) to the League Office as soon as possible. The FA (Dave Cook) do not require a copy.
