#### WEEKEND REVIEW

##### Premier Division

With four of the top seven playing on Sunday, Saturday's games offered a chance for their rivals to steal a march on them.

But only Tonbridge Angels took full advantage. The in-form Kent team moved up to fifth place and into a play-off spot with a 3-1 home win over Billericay in a thrilling game. Two up in the first half-hour through Lee Browning and Lewis Taylor, they saw their lead halved by a Harrison Chatting strike with 25 minutes to go. It was the 88<sup>th</sup> minute before Browning clinched the point, firing home from a tight angle.

Leaders Sutton were one of the teams who did play on Saturday, but they dropped two points in a 1-1 home draw with Concord, who went ahead with a Harry Elmes goal after 18 minutes and would have had more but for the excellence of keeper Kevin Scriven. Bradley Woods-Garness replied with his 10<sup>th</sup> league goal of the season soon after the interval but that was it for Sutton and only a goalline

clearance by Karim El-Salahi denied Concord a late winner.

Lowestoft, who were fifth, dropped out of the play-off positions after a 0-0 home draw with Carshalton in front of 733 spectators at Crown Meadow. Both sides hit the woodwork, Sam Gaughan for the Trawlerboys and Leon Noel for the Robins. The Suffolk club are sixth but still very much title contenders, ten points behind Sutton but with five games in hand.

Sunday's games completed a weekend when none of the top five at the start of it managed a victory. Kingstonian and Bury Town, second and third respectively, battled out a 1-1 draw at Kingsmeadow on Sunday to remain in those positions. Bobby Traynor put K's ahead two minutes before half-time with his 18<sup>th</sup> goal of the season. He has scored 15 times in the league and now shares the lead with Cray's Laurent Hamici in the race for divisional scoring honours. Traynor has been the top scorer in his division in each of the past two seasons.

Bury were given a boost in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute when the home side's Dean Hamlin was sent off for a 'professional foul'. Sam Reed equalised seven minutes later and the ten men had to survive something of a bombardment in the closing stages to hang on to a point.

Cray, in fourth place, were beaten 2-1 at home by Hornchurch in the other Sunday affair. Urchins, now just one point off a play-off spot themselves, dominated for long periods but failed to make the most of their possession, condemning them to a nervous finish after Tyrone Sterling profited from a rare loss of

concentration in the visiting defence to head Cray's goal in the 77<sup>th</sup> minute. After that Hornchurch stood firm to retain the advantage provided by two Jonathan Hunt goals.

He put them ahead with a tenth-minute penalty after Lewis Smith was brought down but Urchins struggled to create clear chances and it took a fluke to double their lead in the 57<sup>th</sup> minute, when everyone missed Hunt's low cross from the right and it found the far corner of the net.

Back to Saturday, and two goals by Frankie Sawyer earned Croydon Athletic a 2-1 home win against Folkestone in the battle of the bottom two. He netted six minutes before half-time and, after the bar had denied Antonio Gonnella an equaliser, scored again on 77 minutes. Simon Austin got a late consolation for Folkestone who remain ahead of Athletic on goal difference.

Maidstone slipped one place to 20<sup>th</sup> but did well to escape with a 0-0 draw against another of the division's form sides, Harrow, after playing for the last ten minutes with only nine men. Jay Saunders was sent off after an hour and Laurence Harvey later followed him to the dressing-room.

Hastings, whose game at Wealdstone was postponed, dropped into the bottom four thanks to Aveley's 1-0 home victory over Horsham. A goal by Orlando Smith 12 minutes after the break ended Horsham's unbeaten run.

Hendon, in the bottom half of the table but with plenty of games in hand over most of the sides above them, displayed their play-off potential by beating Tooting 4-1. The unlucky Terrors lost top scorer Rob Haworth with an injury in the warm-up and found themselves trailing at half-time to a Lubo Guentchev double. Reece Hall pulled one back with 16 minutes left and Tooting might have drawn level before late goals by Eddie Munnely and Lee O'Leary settled it.

There were no away wins among the eight games in the division, the other result being a 2-0 victory for Canvey against Margate. Rob King opened the scoring after 20 minutes and finished it with a penalty seven minutes later. Margate had a penalty of their own with five minutes left but James Russell saved Shaun Welford's kick.

## **Division One North**

A rare goal by defender Ryan Sammons earned table-topping East Thurrock their 11<sup>th</sup> successive Division One North victory. They beat visiting Great Wakering 3-2 after trailing twice.

Former Hornchurch striker Ross Wall, making his debut for Wakering after a brief stay at Aveley, put his new side ahead after nine minutes. Kris Newby levelled it with his 20<sup>th</sup> goal of the season only for Dan Trenkel to restore the visitors' lead before the break. Max Cornhill made it 2-2 six minutes into the second half and Sammons won it 20 minutes from time with his first league goal since September 2008.

There were seven matches in the division and Maldon were the only other home team to collect even a point. Ollie Berquez put them ahead after eight minutes but Potters Bar hit back with a goal in each half. Jose Espinoza equalised and Luke Croll's penalty put them ahead. They would have moved up to third place if it had stayed that way, but Berquez nabbed his second in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute and it was Maldon who climbed into third spot while their opponents slipped out of the play-off positions.

Romford took over fifth place with their second 3-2 away win of the week. A Paul Kavanagh penalty set them on their way at Cheshunt and Toran Senghore added another two minutes after half-time. Brad Harrison replied on the hour and also converted a last-minute penalty, though that came shortly after Perry Burns had put Boro 3-1 up.

Wingate never got going against Ware and dropped back to fourth place after a 2-0 defeat. Sam Berry put Ware ahead in the 24<sup>th</sup> minute and Murat Karagul made sure on the hour. Wingate hit the woodwork three times but Ware were worthy winners.

Waltham Forest did win on their home ground, but they were playing away to landlords Ilford in a crucial match at the foot of the table. It was their second successive 1-0 win though Ian Luck, who scored the decider against Leyton seven days earlier in what proved to be the defeated side's final game, was sent off after 55 minutes in this one.

Forest bounced back to take the lead through Brian Okwera ten minutes later and held it despite being reduced to nine men for the last 15 minutes after Joel Palmer became the seventh player dismissed in the last five meetings between these clubs. Defeat left Ilford in 21<sup>st</sup> place, effectively bottom after Leyton's demise.

Grays came from behind to collect a welcome 2-1 victory at Harlow. Danny Brown's 36<sup>th</sup> minute penalty gave Harlow the lead but Simon Thomas levelled moments before the break and Alex Osborn hit the winner nine minutes into the second half.

Heybridge were seconds away from their 12<sup>th</sup> league game without a victory when Nathan Smith struck to snatch a 4-3 win at Tilbury. Dockers twice took the lead in the first half through Ben Bradbury and Jack West, Swifts hitting back through Luke Callander and Taylor Hastings. Callander then put them ahead in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute, but Bradbury's penalty, after Manlee Brown was tripped, made it 3-3 with ten minutes left.

Tilbury will be badly hit if the league directors decide to delete Leyton's matches from the table when they meet later this month. Dockers stand to lose six points and, if that were to happen today, they would be only a point above Ilford at the bottom.

Romford would climb above Wingate into fourth place while, in mid-table, Harlow and Heybridge would both move up three places. Enfield would drop by the same amount.

### **Division One South**

Horsham YMCA pulled off the shock result of the season on Saturday. Bottom of the table, and leaking goals at a furious rate, they seemed to have little chance of any reward from their home game against table-topping Metropolitan Police.

But they stunned even their own fans by becoming only the second side to beat the Met this season, and they did it convincingly with three unanswered goals. Gavin Gordon's sixth-minute header gave them a surprise lead and, apart from a shot by Neil Lampton which hit a post, the Police rarely looked capable of hitting back. Solomon Henry, a new signing from defunct Leyton, made it 2-0 soon after the interval and Matt Simpson's 80<sup>th</sup> minute

header completed a memorable day for the home side.

Ironically, though, the result made little difference to either side's position in the table. The top three managed only one point between them so the Police remain three points clear of Whitehawk while the bottom three all won, leaving YMCA still four points adrift of Whyteleafe, who dropped into the relegation zone for the first time. They should have visited Merstham on Friday but the match was postponed.

The team who profited most from the day's improbable results were Bognor Regis Town, in fourth place but now hot on the heels of the clubs above them. They swamped Fleet 5-0 with Jason Prior's hat-trick taking him to 21 goals for the season, 15 of them in the league.

Prior powered in the opener after five minutes and, after Luke Nightingale made it 2-0, completed his treble eight minutes after the interval. Fleet had a chance to pull one back midway through the second half but Craig Stoner saved Darren Wheeler's penalty and a last-minute strike by Dan Royce wrapped it up.

Whitehawk, in second place, went down 2-1 at Faversham in a battle of the two sides promoted to the division last summer. Hawks have made a much greater impression than their hosts, who lie in mid-table, but this was Faversham's day. Dane Luchford put them ahead after eight minutes and Damian Abel added another just after the half-hour. Hawks applied intense pressure after the break but had to settle for a Josh Jones goal after 64 minutes.

Leatherhead, in third place, narrowly averted defeat as they drew 1-1 with Worthing at Fetcham Grove. It should have been comfortable for the Tanners but, after Chris Boulter's header gave them a 26<sup>th</sup> minute lead, they squandered a succession of chances. They paid the price when Tom Lawley punished a fumble by keeper Chico Ramos to equalise with five minutes left and Tom Manton almost stole all the points for the visitors in added time when he fired against the bar.

Walton Casuals strengthened their hold on fifth place with a 3-0 victory over the team immediately behind them, Burgess Hill. A Charlie Ide double in the first 11 minutes set

them on their way and they survived intense pressure by the Hillians before Omar Vassell made quite sure in the 88<sup>th</sup> minute.

At the other end of the table, meanwhile, Whitstable climbed out of the bottom two, winning 2-1 at Godalming despite missing a penalty and having a man sent off. Louis Smith put them ahead after five minutes but top scorer Ian Pulman was unable to double the lead from the spot. That miss looked costly when, on the hour, Scott Heard was given his marching orders after conceding a penalty which Rishi Nankani converted. But the ten men hung on and Lloyd Blackman won it for them with ten minutes left.

Corinthian-Casuals, 20<sup>th</sup> at the start of play, also moved up a place after a 2-1 home win over Chatham. All the goals came in the last 12 minutes of the first half. Darren Chalke's powerful header put Casuals in front, Leroy Huggins replied from the spot and Saheed Sankoh scrambled in what proved to be the winning goal. Billy Shinnars almost equalised in the 74<sup>th</sup> minute, hitting a post, but Chatham were down to ten men a minute later when Kane Rice was dismissed and finished with nine after Brad Potter suffered the same fate near the end.

Chipstead also finished with nine men as they had a day to forget at Eastbourne Town, where they were beaten 2-0. First to go was Jason Goodchild, who departed along with Eastbourne's Ryan James after a 55<sup>th</sup> minute incident. Billy Harding followed them to the dressing rooms shortly afterwards for retaliating to a bad challenge. And, to complete a miserable day for the visitors, keeper Martin Grant was taken to hospital after a collision. The Eastbourne goals came from Evan Archibald in the 39<sup>th</sup> minute and Aaron Hopkinson in the 75<sup>th</sup>.

Young Dulwich striker Paul McCullum made a name for himself during the club's fine FA Youth Cup run and the 17-year-old confirmed his potential with all three goals in their 3-0 win over troubled Sittingbourne, who can no longer afford to pay their players. McCullum kept a cool head to take chances in the 25<sup>th</sup>, 45<sup>th</sup> and 75<sup>th</sup> minutes.

The final game was at Ramsgate, where Walton & Hersham drew 1-1. Jean-Michel Sigere netted their equaliser on the stroke of half-time after Paul Axon had given the Rams

a 34<sup>th</sup> minute lead. A superb save by Gareth Williams from a Warren Schulz header denied the hosts a late winner.

## **Ryman Youth League**

The Ryman Youth League continues to suffer badly from the weather, with ten of this week's 15 matches being called off.

Among the games that were played, West Division leaders Hayes & Yeading went down 3-2 at home to Northwood, who were 2-0 up in 20 minutes through Damilola Thomas and Dwayne Cole-Parkes. Cyrus Longdon-Hughes pulled one back before half-time and when Joel Jacobs made it 2-2 in the 58<sup>th</sup> minute Hayes looked set to stretch their lead in the table. But Sean Hollowed grabbed Northwood's winner five minutes later.

Harrow travelled to Fleet with both clubs looking to double their season's points tally and it was Harrow who did so with a 2-0 victory. Mark Whiskey and Leon Thomas scored their goals late in the first half.

Kingstonian doubled their Central Division lead to six points, recovering after conceding an early goal to beat Thamesmead 3-2. Josh Wilson put Thamesmead ahead after only 52 seconds but K's rallied midway through the first half with goals from Jack Wadmore and Alistair Dewar in the space of five minutes.

Karl Ellis made it 3-1 ten minutes into the second half but Thamesmead considered themselves unlucky not to take a point after Ade Jinadu's overhead kick put them back in the picture with ten minutes left.

The other match in the division provided Carshalton with their second win of the season thanks to a lone first-half goal by Sonny Ayres at Whyteleafe.

Two Alex Strange goals in the last seven minutes gave Burgess Hill a convincing-looking 3-0 home victory over Horsham YMCA. Until then the bottom club in the South-East section had been trailing only to an early Josh Fawcett goal.

The international season then gets under way in the spring with the Under 18's Centenary Shield against Northern Ireland, Wales, Scotland and the Republic of Ireland. The latter two matches are scheduled for live coverage on Sky Sports.

Jamie is a student at Glyn Technology School - partners in the Kingstonian Academy - and has been an outstanding member of the Kingstonian Under 18's team for three seasons. His older brother Danny is a former Kingstonian player at both youth and senior level who is currently on a university scholarship in the United States.

### **MAIDSTONE UNITED FC**

**Maidstone United Football Club launch fund-raising campaign for a new £1.6 million stadium**

The directors of Maidstone United Football Club (Holdings Limited) have announced the details of the fund-raising campaign to raise sufficient funds to build the new stadium at James Whatman Way.

The total stadium cost of £1,6million will be financed from current owners' new capital (£250,000), a Football Foundation Grant (£150,000), with the remaining funds to be provided by new investors buying new shares in Maidstone United Ground Ltd., the company which owns the new ground. The target amount to be raised is £1,200,000 with the target date for closing the fund-raising end April 2011.

The plan to offer the new shares in the ground-owning company rather than in the overall business, including the football club, is to give investors the incentive of a substantial and tangible asset and to isolate them from the risks inherent in the football club business. However the football club will be the main tenant of the ground and a privileged user of all the facilities.

Terry Casey, co-owner and Director, said: "Investors will feel totally involved in the running of the football club as well as the ground operating business but they will be sheltered from any real risk in the football club itself. Instead they have a share in a business which we forecast could be highly profitable. And if that were not enough they will know they are helping an entire community - including the various pan disability teams we manage - by providing excellent new local

sports and social facilities. It's the perfect option for them really."

The directors are seeking individuals willing to invest a minimum of £150,000, which would give them 6% of the share capital of Maidstone United Ground Ltd. There are plans in hand to meet with several business people over the next few weeks and to undertake a campaign to identify potential investors.

Oliver Ash, co-owner of Maidstone United and also co-owner of French first division rugby club Brive, said: "We are going out to attract a few high net worth individuals who appreciate what we are trying to do and want to come on board. They will recognise what an important venture this is for the whole town. We'll also be open to discuss with representatives of our fantastic supporters how they might be able to join together as a group to be part of the fund-raising. Clearly though the project will only work if we can attract one or two major investors to the project."

### **The New Ground**

Not only will the new ground enable the club to return to Kent's county town, after an absence of more than 20 years, it will also be the first football ground in the country to be built featuring a 3G pitch.

The synthetic surface, already tried and tested by clubs in Scotland and mainland Europe, will enable the stadium to be used by the club's Ryman League Premier Division team, their 30+ community teams, as well as other local clubs, businesses, community groups and schools.

Club chief executive Bill Williams, a former professional footballer with Portsmouth, West Bromwich Albion and Queens Park Rangers, said: "Some clubs have gone from grass to a 3G surface but our football ground will be the first in the country to go with 3G from the outset. It is a bold move but we believe that for the non-league game to survive in the future, other clubs will opt for this high-quality synthetic surface.

"The majority of non-league clubs cannot survive on matchday revenues, sponsorship, advertising and other commercial activity. Using an artificial surface gives us the opportunity to make the business financially viable and provide excellent facilities for our own teams. Equally importantly we have a venue that community groups, schools and

others can hire to play sport and maintain a healthy lifestyle.

"Another important factor is that the surface is all-weather. We have all seen in recent weeks the chaos caused by postponements due to frost, snow or too much rain."

Maidstone United Football Club last owned a ground in the town in 1988. In the years that followed the club were promoted into the Football League, went into liquidation, reformed and steadily climbed from the lowest level of amateur football up to the Ryman League Premier Division.

In October 2010, businessmen Oliver Ash and Terry Casey took over the club from former chairman Paul Bowden-Brown. They commissioned a review of the existing design and the costs of developing the new facility, which will be located on the outskirts of the town. They have also paid off a mortgage-loan and are purchasing the freehold of the site, along with an adjacent strip of land.

### **WEALDSTONE FC**

Jonathan Barden of Wealdstone FC and Middlesex has been selected in the 18-strong squad that will represent England Schoolboys at international level this season.
