WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

The Premier Division title race is wide open after Saturday's battles between the leading pair and their immediate pursuers, which both went the way of the hunters.

The biggest crowd of the day, 720, turned up to watch third-placed Bury Town host leaders Sutton, and the majority looked doomed to disappointment after Karim El-Salahi gave the visitors a second-minute lead with an intended cross. But Lee Reed squared it after 14 minutes and the game swung decisively in the closing stages of the first half. Sutton had Francis Quarm sent off, James Scowcroft gave Bury a deserved 2-1 lead eight minutes later and that was the end of the scoring. So Bury take over second place, three points behind Sutton with a game in hand.

Cray are up to third after their 2-0 home win over second-placed Kingstonian. Chris Saunders nabbed the opener after seven minutes, pouncing when Rob Tolfrey could only parry a shot from Laurent Hamici, and John Guest got the second just after the hour.

K's slid all the way down to fifth place, below Tonbridge who maintained their outstanding form with a 5-1 romp at Tooting & Mitcham. A complete massacre was on the cards by the ninth minute, when Frannie Collin's free-kick, Ade Olorunda's volley and Jay May's 25-yarder had fired the Angels into a 3-0 lead.

Tooting then held out until the last minute of the half, when Danny Walder made it four. Reece Hall gave the Terrors just a glimmer of hope with a goal seven minutes into the second half but they got no closer and the impressive visitors hit the woodwork twice before Lewis Taylor wrapped it up towards the end.

None of those teams would now be considered favourites for the title. That status surely belongs to Lowestoft, who are only sixth but are seven points off the pace with five games in hand on Sutton and at least three on all the other sides above them.

They brought an abrupt halt to Croydon Athletic's recent revival with four unanswered goals at Crown Meadow. Croydon held out until five minutes after half-time when Matt Nolan, last season's top scorer but hit by injury this time round, netted his first Premier Division goal. Adam Smith added a couple, the second a penalty, in between which Russell Stock celebrated his return to the club with a goal.

It was another clean sheet for the solid Trawlerboys defence, who are conceding less than a goal every two games; just nine in 19 outings. Sutton, who have let in 23 in 24 matches, are the only other Premier team not conceding more than a goal a game.

Two more clubs, Concord and Hornchurch, are within three points of the play-offs. Hornchurch were held to a 0-0 draw at Carshalton, who held out after the 75th minute dismissal of Anthony Joseph.

Concord moved above them with a 3-1 victory at Horsham. Just as they had on Tuesday, Horsham took an early lead at home, Ben

Andrews scoring after six minutes, and also as per Tuesday it went badly wrong after that. Hornets at least made it tougher for Concord than for Harrow, who won that midweek match 7-1. It was the 56th minute before Steve King equalised and it was still all square with six minutes left. By then, though, centre-back Michael Hector had been dismissed for the second game in a row and goals by Nicky Cowley and Gary Ogilvie saw the Essex side through.

Four of the bottom five were beaten, the odd ones out being Folkestone who ended Harrow's storming run with a lone-goal victory at Cheriton Road. Frankie Chappell did the damage in the 54th minute. That lifted Folkestone off the bottom and dumped Croydon back there.

Folkestone also moved above Maidstone, who were beaten 3-0 at Canvey. Rob King scored two minutes after the start and converted a penalty two minutes before the end, with Danny Heale making his contribution just after half-time.

Hastings continued their miserable run with a 2-0 defeat at Margate, for whom James Pinnock netted in the 27th and 88th minutes. They remain 19th but the bottom four are all on the 18-point mark.

Aveley are one point better off, though they were beaten 1-0 at home by Billericay. Benson Kpaka scored after 65 minutes, though the visitors' day was marred when they had James Lawson sent off near the end.

The gap between the bottom five and the rest is now seven points after Wealdstone's 1-0 victory over Hendon. Stones boosted their strike force with two impressive signings during the week but, ironically, their winner was an own goal by Daniel Sintim after 33 minutes, an unlucky deflection of a Lee Chappell free-kick.

Division One North

It maybe too early for title races to be settled, but Needham Market took a huge step towards Division One North honours when they beat leaders East Thurrock 3-0 in Suffolk on Saturday. The Marketmen are now five points off the pace with four games in hand. That's in a table with Leyton's record deleted, as clubs are assuming it will be when the matter is considered at a league meeting this week.

That table is used throughout this report and is shown in brief form at the end; the official table can be found elsewhere.

The result ended Rocks' bid for a league record run of victories at 12 (and if anyone knows what the record is, please advise. The best that has come to light so far is 16 but that has surely been bettered during the last 106 years) and, to make things worse, they will lose top scorer Kris Newby for three games after he received a straight red card early in the second half.

Bradley Barber had broken the deadlock in added time at the end of the first half and he struck again with a header on 63 minutes. Sam Newson added the third, flattering the hosts a little, with ten minutes left.

The other main talking-point of the day came at the relegation end of the table where, improbably enough, the bottom six all won. So only Enfield Town significantly improved their position, advancing five places with a 4-0 home win over Ware (and still being three places lower than they are with Leyton's record included). Jon Moore scored after 20 minutes with the rest coming in a 16-minute burst after the hour mark, from Liam Hope, Leon Osei and Adam Wallace.

A goalless first half at Rookery Hill turned into a 4-1 home win for Grays against Thamesmead. Eljay Worrell's 50th minute opener for the host was swiftly wiped out by Gabriel Momodu only for Alex Osborn to restore Grays' lead almost as promptly. John Docker, who created the first two goals, made it 3-1 as the game went into added time and Stephen Demetriou added another.

Grays are well clear of the bottom four, a group topped by Redbridge who came from two goals down to win 3-2 at Heybridge. Having ended their long wait for a victory in their previous outing, Swifts were looking good again as Taylor Hastings and Tom Broadhurst handed them a 2-0 half-time lead. Kevin Coyle replied for the Motormen on 65 minutes and nine minutes later they were in front thanks to a Kevin McLeod double, the first of them direct from a corner.

Ian Luck has had an eventful time in his four games for Waltham Forest, all of which they have won. He scored the match-winning goal in his first game, received a red card in his

second and claimed the first goal in a 2-0 victory next time out. His fourth outing was at home to Sudbury on Saturday and Luck fired a hat-trick in Forest's 3-2 success. Luck opened the scoring with a 23rd-minute penalty and struck again in the last minute of the first half, shortly after Tom Devaux made up for conceding the penalty by netting an equaliser. Lee Townrow levelled it again on the hour but Luck would not be denied and claimed a last-gasp decider.

Goals at either end of the first half from Harry Cook and Jack West earned Tilbury a 2-0 home win over Harlow, which means that Ilford stay at the foot of the table despite a shock 1-0 victory at play-off contenders Potters Bar. Junior Appiah scored after three minutes and the hosts could not respond. Indeed, Ilford could have won more convincingly.

It was a case of alas Smith and Jones for Cheshunt, who crashed 4-0 at home to third-placed Wingate & Finchley. Mainly Jones, who profited from some poor defending to bag a hat-trick in the bag by the first minute of the second half, with top scorer Leon Smith adding another in the 62nd minute. It could have been five, but Ahmat Rifat missed a last-minute penalty.

Waltham Abbey impressed as they came from behind to win 3-1 at Great Wakering, who went ahead in the 14th minute through Joe Gardner. Steve Cawley levelled it nine minutes later, Tyler Campbell put Abbey ahead four minutes before the break and Kieran Ogunkoya got the third moments into the second half.

Brentwood gave Steve Witherspoon a successful start to his second spell as manager with a 2-0 home win over fifth-placed Romford. Sos Yao did the damage with goals in the third and 63rd minutes, his second double in three games since joining the Blues.

Division One South

Division One South leaders Metropolitan Police bounced back in style from their shock 3-0 defeat at Horsham YMCA seven days earlier, thumping Fleet 4-1 at Imber Court on Saturday to remain on top of the table. It took them 42 minutes to open the scoring, Steve Noakes heading home against his former club, but it was 3-0 by the first minute of the second half as James Greenaway and Chris Bourne struck either side of the break. Darren Campbell pulled one back before Craig Watkins wrapped it up with his 16th goal of the season.

The strength of Bognor's ever-growing challenge was confirmed as they romped to a 5-1 victory at Whyteleafe, led by Luke Nightingale's hat-trick. With Whitehawk having a day off, the Rocks needed only a point to take over second place but they were in no mood to settle for that. Nightingale opened his account on 11 minutes and Jason Prior netted his 23rd of the season to make it 2-0 at half-time. Chris O'Flaherty's missed penalty seemed to have denied Leafe a chance to get back into it before the interval but he did score two minutes later.

There was no way back for the home side, however, as headers by Nightingale and Ben Johnson made it 4-1 by the 12th minute of the second half. Nightingale completed his treble with his 19th of the season as time ran out.

Bognor are just two points behind the leaders but Leatherhead, in fourth place, lost ground as they were held to a 2-2 home draw by Walton Casuals, themselves in the final play-off spot but eight points behind the Tanners.

Mark Nicholls put Casuals ahead and Greg Andrews equalised with a penalty, his 22nd goal of the season. All have come in the league, putting him five ahead of his nearest challengers for the golden boot: Prior, Needham's Craig Parker and East Thurrock's Kris Newby. Andrews set up the chance for Tommy Hutchings to fire Tanners after 62 minutes but a tame shot by Alfie Arthur took a strange bounce and squared matters eight minutes later.

Burgess Hill are two points behind Casuals with two games in hand after Lloyd Cotton's goal on the hour earned all three points at

Merstham, thanks also to some fine goalkeeping by Joel Harding as Merstham piled on the pressure in the closing stages.

Sittingbourne put their off-field problems, including the loss of top scorer Tom Bradbrook to Margate, behind them to stay in the play-off hunt with a 1-0 victory at Walton & Hersham. The important action came after six minutes when home keeper Gareth Williams upended Ryan Golding and was sent off, with Billy Manners converting the resultant penalty. Both sides later hit the woodwork.

Dulwich romped to their second 4-1 away victory of the week, this time at Worthing. Terry Dodd gave Rebels a 19th minute lead but Junior Kadi's penalty squared it within a minute and a header by young Paul McCallum, who has been invited for trials at West Ham, put Dulwich in front seven minutes before the break. Late goals by Nyren Clunis and Rob Gradwell completed the scoring as the visitors moved into the top half of the table.

A first-half double by Ashley Brown earned Faversham a 2-0 home win over bottom club Horsham YMCA and a 38th minute goal by Tim Rivers was enough for Eastbourne Town in a close battle with visitors Godalming.

Whitstable edged further away from the relegation places with a 0-0 draw at Chatham. They climbed to 19th, above Corinthian-Casuals whose home game with Chipstead was called off because of a floodlight problem.

Ryman Youth League

Maidstone's Jack Simon was the unlucky man in this week's Ryman Youth League games. He fired a hat-trick in the last 15 minutes of their game at Tonbridge but could not save their unbeaten record in the South-East Division. Tonbridge were leading with goals from Jack Leighton and Sam Beale before Simon opened his account and both Angels scored again to make it 4-1. Simon struck twice more in the closing stages, but in vain.

Stones stay on top of the table, a point ahead of Whitehawk who are in turn a point ahead of Burgess Hill after the Hillians moved into third place by hitting five unanswered goals at Horsham. Jack Agate and James Ballamy netted in the first half, with Kit Tregear, Josh Fawsett and Harry Bannister completing a bad couple of days for Horsham, whose first team were beaten 7-1 at home on Tuesday.

There was one game in the Central Division and Leatherhead tightened their grip on third place with a 4-2 victory at Metropolitan Police. The boys in blue took a fifth-minute lead through Harry Curd but Daryl Jeeves equalised before the interval and Rory McDonald put the Tanners ahead soon after the restart. There was a late flurry of goals as James Bell made it 3-1, Jack Hills pulled one back and Dale Malcolm finally clinched the points five minutes into added time.

The only other game in another week badly hit by the weather saw Faversham beat Ashford (Kent) 3-0 in the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup. All the goals came in the second half. Ashford have maintained a presence in the Youth League despite the collapse of their first team in the summer.
