I have to advise that Bruce Badcock, on reaching normal retiring age, has decided that at the end of the current season he wishes to retire from his full time position as League Secretary, a position he has held for the past 6 years, in order that he can spend more time with his family. However Bruce has offered to assist the League on a part time basis assisting in other areas of the ever expanding League Administration. It is intended that Bruce will remain as League Secretary until the Annual General Meeting on 18th June 2011.

Macron Manager of the Month

The award is given to the manager whose team has the best record during the month in question and there was a clear winner in the Premier Division. Tommy Warrilow's Tonbridge Angels played six games in December and January and had a perfect record until Lowestoft came back from 3-0 down to force a draw in Kent on Saturday. Nevertheless, Tonbridge averaged 2.67 points per game, well clear of Harrow Borough (2.22), Lowestoft Town (2.14) and Bury Town (2.13).

Division One North was tighter, with two teams dropping only two points and one dropping three. The award goes to Danny Laws of Needham Market, whose

side won eight and drew one of the nine matches they played for an average of 2.78 points per game. Waltham Abbey also had a single draw marring a perfect record but played only five games (2.60). Redbridge won their first four games but slipped up in their fifth on Saturday, when they were beaten 2-0 at home by Enfield Town to finish with an average of 2.40. There would have been a slight problem had they won the prize because the manager under whom the run started, Kris Taylor, resigned due to business commitments at the end of December and was replaced by Jody Brown.

The top three teams in Division One South all showed good form during December and January. They also fared better than most with the weather, playing ten games each. In the whole league only Kingstonian matched that figure. It was Bognor, with seven wins, two draws and one defeat for an average of 2.30 points per game, who had the best record. So the award goes to their managerial team of Jamie Howell and Darin Killpartrick. Whitehawk also won seven but lost two for an average of 2.20 while Metropolitan Police won seven and lost three (2.10).

Macron Team Performance of the Month

This is usually for the best single performance during the period in question and, unlike the other awards, it also includes cup matches. So Wealdstone's excellent 0-0 draw at Newport County in the FA Trophy came under consideration, as did their 6-1 victory at Concord on Saturday. The judges also considered performances by Bury Town, Horsham, Sutton United and Tonbridge Angels. In the end, though, the prize was given to Harrow Borough for a January double; a 6-1 home victory over Canvey Island and, ten days later, a 7-1 win at Horsham.

A number of teams came into the reckoning for the Division One North prize and it would have been a very tough decision until Saturday, when Heybridge Swifts ended a poor run of form by going to leaders East Thurrock United and beating them 2-1.

There was not much doubt about the destination of the Division One South award, although nominations included Championship Manager Cup victories away to Premier Division opposition by Fleet Town and Metropolitan Police. But when a club five points adrift at the



bottom of the table hosts the league leaders, who have lost only once, and proceeds to beat them convincingly, all other performances are left very much in the shade. So the winners are Horsham YMCA for their startling 3-0 victory over Metropolitan Police on January 15th.

Sells Goalkeeping Academy Good Hands

Lowestoft Town goalkeeper Andrew Reynolds could not have been best pleased to concede three first-half goals when his side visited Tonbridge Angels on Saturday. But it ended on a more cheerful note for him; the Trawlerboys fought back to gain a point, and Reynolds was still the winner of the latest "Sells Goalkeeping Academy Good Hands" award for the Premier Division, which is given to the first-choice goalkeeper of the club conceding the fewest goals per game. Lowestoft had, in fact, conceded only one goal in their six outings before that for a final average of 0.57 per game.



Waltham Abbey's Harry Ricketts earned a mention in his club's dispatches for an outstanding first-half display in Saturday's 2-0 home win over Grays Athletic. It also clinched his Good Hands award; his club let in four goals in five games, an average of 0.80.

Walton & Hersham may not be having the most successful of seasons but they were the only Division One South side to concede less than a goal a game during December and January. They let in eight in nine matches, an average of 0.89, and the award goes to their main man Gareth Williams.

EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING - LEYTON FOOTBALL CLUB

At their meeting last week the Board of Directors of the Ryman League received an email from Louise Sophocleous as a Director of Leyton Football Club confirming that she was withdrawing Leyton FC from the League.

The implication from the email was that this was with immediate effect but the Board were concerned at the fact that a wish was expressed to allow the youth team to remain in the Youth League and this could not therefore be considered to be a resignation.

The Club are currently under suspension from the League for failing to pay the second tranche of their subscription which was due on 1 December and the Club failed to fulfil one match before that suspension was applied.

The Board therefore decided, having taken all matters into consideration, that Article 8 be applied and that an Extraordinary General Meeting be called for 20th February 2011 to put a Special Resolution to all member clubs that Leyton Football Club be expelled from the League. In accordance with that Article, the Club remain in suspension until such time as the General Meeting takes place.

The League do not propose to issue a further statement until after the General Meeting has been held

WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Sutton United are five points clear at the top of the Premier Division after their most prominent challengers, Bury Town and Lowestoft, dropped points yesterday (Saturday). It looked as if Sutton might do the same in a tight match at another of the leading sides, Cray. But Craig Dundas eventually made the breakthrough in the 70th minute and Bradley Woods-Garness secured a 2-0 victory with five minutes left.

Bury broke the deadlock at Hornchurch when Sam Reed cracked in a 63rd-minute free-kick. Urchins had come from behind with two late goals to beat Margate in midweek and threatened to do the same when Duane Jackman, who had returned to the club from Bishop's Stortford earlier in the day, made it 1-1 after 80 minutes. But it was Bury who came closest to a winner; Reed hit a post and home defender Ronnie Fletcher headed against his own bar. Hornchurch's Tommy Black was shown a straight red card in added time.

A week earlier Lowestoft were seven points behind Sutton with five games in hand. It's often said that points on the board are more

valuable than games in hand and the Trawlerboys' strong position has faded away after three successive draws. The latest was a disappointing 1-1 result at home to lowly Hastings, who took the lead through Sam Adams soon after the interval but were pegged back by Michael Frew midway through the half. The gap between Lowestoft and the leaders is now ten points and they have used up one of those games in hand. Hastings, meanwhile, were the only club in the bottom five to collect a point.

Tonbridge evicted Lowestoft from third place, though they had to wait a long time for the only goal of their game against relegation-threatened Aveley, who came close on several occasions. It came after 77 minutes from Frannie Collin, now out on his own as the leading scorer in Premier Division matches with 16.

Harrow continued their goalscoring feats, thrashing Horsham 6-0 at Earlsmead to follow up their 7-1 away win over the same opponents last month. It was the fourth time in eight games that they had scored five or more, a total of 24 goals, though the other four games in the sequence have produced only two.

As usual, Rocky Baptiste and Troy Hewitt did the damage. Baptiste added four goals, including a penalty, to the three he scored at Horsham, taking his season's tally to 21 in all competitions, and Hewitt got the other two to reach 20. They are the only club in the league with two men who have scored 20 or more. More important, the victory lifted Borough into a play-off spot for the first time, though Kingstonian were able to reclaim it when hosted and beat bottom club Croydon on Sunday.

Plenty of other teams are still in the hunt, including Canvey who beat Hendon 4-1 in an eventful game. The visitors had players sent off at regular intervals and did well to concede only two goals in the last 15 minutes when they were reduced to eight men.

Hendon were leading by a 12th minute Jamie Busby penalty before the first red card was shown to Daniel Sintim after 32 minutes. Rob King equalised with the resultant penalty. Jay Curran put Canvey 2-1 up 11 minutes after half-time and the visitors lost Kevin Maclaren immediately afterwards. Next to go was

Michael Peacock after 75 minutes, and Danny Heale curled the free-kick that followed past what must have been a severely undermanned wall. It was not until the last minute, however, that the islanders made their three-man advantage count further as Leon Gordon completed the scoring.

Billericay and Carshalton both moved into the play-off race with 1-0 victories. The Essex club had to wait until the 78th minute for Phil Anderson's winner at Margate and Carshalton left it even later before Paul Johnson converted Joel Ledgister's deadly pass in the 89th minute to supply three points at home to Folkestone.

Concord's challenge suffered a setback as they went down 3-2 at Tooting after taking a 16th minute lead through Tony Stokes. Jamie Byatt soon levelled matters, Sol Pinnock celebrated his move from Dulwich this week by putting the Terrors ahead and a Karl Beckford penalty made it 3-1 at half-time. Ashley Miller pulled one back, but not until the 90th minute. Harry Elmes thought he had equalised in the sixth minute of added time but the wild celebrations were halted when Concord realised that he had been ruled offside.

Maidstone remain in 21st place after falling foul of Richard Jolly in a 4-2 home defeat by Wealdstone. The Sutton loanee made it seven goals in two games – the first time in his prolific career that he has scored successive hat-tricks - and you fancy that Wealdstone may not be able to extend his stay, which is due to finish on 21st February.

Another recent signing, Kieran Knight, put the visitors ahead after 11 minutes. Tommy Whitnell replied and, after Jolly's first on 38 minutes, Danny Hockton made it 2-2 at the break. Jolly scored again on 65 minutes and completed his treble within a minute. His short stay at Wealdstone has produced a total of eight goals, two more than he had netted in the first five months of the season for Sutton.

Frustrated Croydon Athletic remained at the foot of the Premier Division after a 2-1 defeat at Kingstonian on Sunday. Denied three points by fog in midweek, they were this time the victims of a controversial equalising goal.

Danny Elgar's 15th minute strike seemed certain to give Croydon a half-time lead but, moments before the break, Joe Dolan chested

the ball forwards in a goalmouth scramble and, to the surprise even of the home camp, the officials decided it had crossed the line.

K's went on to win it with 11 minutes left when Bobby Traynor rifled in his 16th league goal of the season from a tight angle, reclaiming his joint lead in the Premier Division scorechart. Victory lifted K's back to fourth after they had dropped out of the top five on Saturday, while Harrow slipped out of the play-off place they had held for 24 hours.

Division One North

A surprise defeat, only their third in 24 games, for Needham Market on Saturday warned the Division One North leaders that the title race is still very much alive. Having had two goals disallowed for offside, they went down 2-0 at Cheshunt, conceding twice in nine minutes midway through the second half. Brad Harrison and Josh Hutchinson were on target for the Ambers.

East Thurrock stayed hot on their heels, though they had to work hard against a visiting Waltham Abbey side with play-off ambitions. Max Cornhill put Rocks ahead on 53 minutes and when Joe Keith made it 2-0 from the spot after 70 minutes the points looked in the bag until Steve Cawley hit back four minutes later to make it a tight finish.

The top two are well clear of their closest pursuers, Wingate and Maldon, who in turn have a useful cushion on the teams chasing them.

A single goal by Ahmat Rifat after only three minutes was enough for Wingate at home to Ilford and they stay five points ahead of Maldon, who are in turn five points clear of fifth-placed Romford.

Ollie Berquez, who converted two penalties in a midweek win over Cheshunt, earned ten-man Maldon a 2-1 home win over Tilbury with a 78th minute spot-kick, just two minutes after Aaron Matthews wiped out Joe Sweeney's first-half goal for the hosts. Grant Cooper was sent off with the score at 1-0.

Romford moved back into a play-off spot by beating Ware 3-0 at the Mill Field. Paul Kavanagh gave them a 15th minute lead with a free-kick and Kurt Smith fired home from long range just before half-time. There was a double dismissal soon after the break,

Romford's Richard Oxby and Ware's Sam Berry seeing red. Petrit Elbi, just back from Brentwood, marked his return to Romford colours by completing the scoring in the 85th minute.

Six teams, including Waltham Abbey, are within five points of Romford though Boro have two or more games in hand on all of them.

Sudbury are up to sixth after their 1-0 home win over Harlow, Dubi Ogbonna firing home from the best part of 30 yards after 63 minutes, and behind them are Brentwood who scored in the first and last minutes to beat visiting Redbridge 2-0. Ryan Doyle got the first with a penalty, awarded after only 16 seconds when Sos Yao was upended, and Steve Butterworth hit the clincher in added time.

Potters Bar dropped from fifth to eighth after going down 3-2 at home to Grays. Penalties made the difference; Josh Urquhart missed one for the home side after 57 minutes with the score at 2-2 and Simon Thomas converted for Grays shortly afterwards. An Alex Osborne double had put Grays two up in 14 minutes and a pair from Jose Espinoza squared it by half-time.

Enfield Town are right in the hunt after their 3-1 victory at Great Wakering. Most of the action came in the first 25 minutes, which brought three goals and a red card; Liam Hope put Town ahead from the spot, Dan Trenkel headed an equaliser and Danny Forward restored the visitors' lead. Then Mitchel Stuart-Evans, who was sent off on his debut for Aveley last month, suffered the same fate in his third game for Wakering. The next significant action did not come until the 87th minute, when Bryan Hammatt clinched the points.

There was no joy for the clubs at the wrong end of the table. Tilbury, Redbridge and Ilford were all beaten, as recorded above, and so were Waltham Forest. A Tom English penalty gave reviving Heybridge a first-half lead at Cricklefield and Michael Toner increased it 13 minutes from time. Lukman Mojeed, who was sent off in midweek, pulled one back but that was all.

Division One South

Earlier in the season Metropolitan Police were the last team in the league to drop a point and the last to be beaten. But that promising start

is a long way behind them now and on Saturday they suffered their second home defeat in four days against a side in the bottom half of the table. This time it was Worthing, who hit three unanswered goals at Imber Court.

Tom Lawley and Terry Dodd gave Rebels a 2-0 half-time lead and, in between the goals, the Police had Eddie Smith sent off. They managed to avoid further damage until the 90th minute, when George Gaskin made it 3-0.

The boys in blue slipped to third place, overtaken by Whitehawk who beat Sittingbourne 4-0 at East Brighton Park. Sam Gargan scored in each half and, after the visitors had Sam Collins sent off in the 70th minute, Josh Jones added two more.

Bognor, meanwhile, strengthened their grip on the leadership they captured in midweek with a 2-0 home victory over Godalming. Ben Johnson gave them the lead after just 25 seconds but no goal feast followed, though Johnson added another 20 minutes after the interval.

Leatherhead, who are fourth, beat Chatham by the same scoreline. Greg Andrews opened their account five minutes before half-time with his 23rd league goal, doubling his lead over Needham's Craig Parker in the golden boot race, and set up the chance for Jack MacLeod to wrap it up in the 81st minute.

Burgess Hill remain fifth despite dropping two home points to Whitstable in a 1-1 draw. An early own goal by Ashley Ulph, making his league debut after moving from Maidstone, was hardly the start he or the Oystermen wanted but Ian Pulman squared it after a good move in the 28th minute. He has netted 17 of Whitstable's 42 goals in all competitions.

Faversham are breathing down the Hillians' necks after their 3-0 home win over Eastbourne. Dane Luchford put the hosts ahead after 25 minutes and they finished it off in the last 16 minutes with strikes from Justin Ascheri and Tom Hickman.

Walton Casuals would have taken over fifth place by beating Ramsgate in Surrey but went down 3-2. Mark Lovell and Paul Axon scored first-half goals for Rams either side of Dan Lawson's effort for the home side. Warren Schulz made it 3-1 seven minutes after the

break and although Charlie Ide pulled one back on the hour Casuals could do no more, even though Rams had Ollie Gray sent off. Ide almost snatched a point at the death but his shot struck a post.

Casuals are now only one place ahead of neighbours Walton & Hersham. Gary Frewen hit a hat-trick as the Swans won 5-2 at 21st-placed Whyteleafe, who might have hoped for better after their dramatic 5-4 triumph over the Met in midweek.

Newcomer Albjon Blokku took only three minutes to score a debut goal for the visitors and Frewen made it 2-0 before young Ryan Thomas hit back with his third goal in two games. Chris O'Flaherty missed from the spot when he had the chance to equalise and Chris Wales headed Swans' third in the 64th minute. Frewen added two more before Leafe got another penalty and Dan Frith converted.

Leafe stay five points ahead of Horsham YMCA, who went down 3-0 at home to Corinthian-Casuals. Glenn Boosey opened the scoring on the half-hour, Shaun Lucien added another on 50 minutes and Sam Robinson notched the third before YM's Tony Reid was sent off. He conceded a penalty for the offence but Robinson fired wide.

Dulwich are threatening to make a late run at the play-off places and they showed the necessary determination as Nyren Clunis netted in the last minute to give them a 3-2 victory at Merstham, who led 2-0 with half an hour to go. Ross White opened the scoring in the 31st minute and Joao Andrade put Merstham further ahead in the 54th minute. Ray Powell started the comeback just after the hour and Rob Gradwell made it 2-2 with 20 minutes left.

Powell has scored for three of the clubs in the division this season, which he started with Walton & Hersham before joining Chatham. Michael Toner yesterday completed a similar feat in the northern section, adding a goal for Heybridge to previous efforts for Ware and Tilbury. Allan Tait had already completed a Premier Division treble, scoring for Horsham, Folkestone and, most recently, Kingstonian.

The other match in the division was a 1-1 draw at Fleet. Darren Wheeler's 52nd minute penalty gave the hosts the lead against

Chipstead, for whom Ray Freeman, who had earlier hit a post, replied with 13 minutes to go.

Ryman Youth League

Both last season's finalists have been eliminated from the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup. Following the earlier exit of holders Woking, runners-up Brentwood were beaten 2-0 in a first-round tie at Welling this week. Aaron Harriot and Cabrel Noufang scored in the first half.

With the weather at last relenting, four ties were played in the second round and three of them resulted in away wins. Staines were the highest scorers, romping to a 6-1 victory at Fleet with two goals apiece from Mario Quiassaca and Aaron Weston.

Ryan Quirke struck on the half-hour to set Lewes on their way to a 3-1 victory at Chipstead and a late goal by an unspecified Cole – Lamin or Julian – saw Northwood through 2-1 at Ashford (Middx).

The only home team to advance were Walton & Hersham, and they took their time. Barnet (Amber) held them scoreless for 90 minutes but Elliott Hayden and George Griffiths found the net in extra time and Walton won 2-0.

Kingstonian are ten points clear in the Central Division of the Ryman Youth League, though they were held to a 2-2 home draw by Sutton in their latest outing. Karl Ellis rescued K's after Josh Gallagher and Michael Bello, with a penalty, had responded to Alistair Dewar's 20th minute opener for the leaders.

Chris Webster scored twice as Whyteleafe beat Thamesmead 3-1 in the same division.

Burgess Hill went to the top of the South-East Division with two unanswered goals at bottom club Horsham YMCA. Alex Strange and Josh Fawcett netted in the first half-hour. Whitehawk needed a home win over Worthing to take over first place themselves but went down to a lone Ryan Peake goal after 75 minutes.

Ashford (Kent) pulled off their first victory of the season, 3-0 at Eastbourne Town. Dexter Gondongwe scored a morale-boosting opener after four minutes, Jordan Wright made it 2-0 just before half-time and Tom Scorer added the third.

The weather would not be completely denied as a frozen pitch put paid to the only scheduled West Division game of the week, in which Hampton were due to host Barnet (Black).
