WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

For the second successive Saturday it was a day for the pursuers in the Premier Division play-off race. Defeats for Hornchurch and Kingstonian, in fifth and sixth places, and victories for the six clubs immediately below them mean that Wealdstone, in 12th spot, are only four points away from the top five as the race for post-season play becomes feverish.

Sutton remain aloof from the scramble behind them, retaining their nine-point lead with a comfortable 3-0 home win over Hendon. Leroy Griffiths nodded them ahead after six minutes and, although Aaron Morgan hit a post for the visitors soon afterwards, they offered

little threat after that. Richard Jolly, the division's top scorer, doubled the lead on 34 minutes with his 20th league goal (ten apiece for Sutton and Wealdstone) and Craig Dundas added the third on 64 minutes. Hendon's gloom deepened when Morgan received a second yellow card in added time.

A hat-trick by Craig Nurse led second-placed Bury to a 4-1 victory at Horsham. With two games in hand, Bury will hope to keep the title race alive at least until they travel to Sutton on 9th April.

Nurse opened the scoring on 15 minutes but Horsham held out until the interval and even equalised just before the break through Pat Harding. Nurse restored Bury's advantage three minutes after the restart, scored again on 67 minutes and might have had a couple more before Lee Reed wrapped it up in the closing minutes.

Carl Rook's diving header in the 38th minute goal was enough to give Tonbridge the points at home to bottom club Maidstone, who were denied a point by Lee Worgan's late save from Danny Hockton.

That lifted the Angels to third place, above Lowestoft who disappointed most of the 824 fans at Crown Meadow by going down to a lone 76th minute goal by Mark Willy for Cray.

A single goal did the trick for Billericay, too, as they reclaimed the final play-off slot. Adam Flanagan converted a long throw from Junior Luke two minutes after the interval to account for visitors Tooting & Mitcham.

Hornchurch were beaten at Harrow, another 1-0 scoreline, and slipped back to sixth. A scrappy goal by Wayne Walters in added time at the end of the first half was a suitable decider for an untidy game. Urchins tried to rally after Danny Leech was sent off for bringing down debutant Kieron St Aimie in the 71st minute, his second dismissal in successive home games, but Harrow held out.

Cray are up to seventh and Concord to eighth, above Kingstonian whom they beat at Thames Road. The impressive Tony Stokes put Concord ahead after 49 minutes, set up the second for Ashley Miller after 68 and then hit a post. Paul Vines, who has completed a full transfer to K's after a loan spell, pulled one back in the 89th minute for a scoreline that flattered the visitors.

Concord's neighbours Canvey are a point behind them with two games in hand after Alex Rhodes fired a first-half hat-trick at Croydon Athletic, where the islanders won 4-0. Rhodes got his first on 11 minutes and completed his treble in the last ten minutes of the first half. John Easterford added the fourth with 15 minutes left.

Next in line are Harrow, who lead old rivals Wealdstone on goal difference. Stones recorded the division's fifth 1-0 win of the day, a 27th minute goal by Alex Dyer settling their game at Aveley and maintaining their late charge towards the leading places.

Folkestone completed a quartet of defeats for the bottom four, crashing 3-1 at home to Hastings who thus moved three points clear of the drop zone. Russell Eldridge put Hastings ahead with a free-kick in the 15th minute but the hosts equalised through Darren Smith seven minutes before the interval.

They did themselves no favours, however, when Robbie Kember was sent off in the 54th minute. Ollie Rowe restored Hastings' lead with a long-range shot in the 76th minute and Kenny Pogue made sure of three vital points.

That result left the bottom two, Croydon and Maidstone, seven and eight points adrift of safety respectively, and there will surely be no way back for the losers when they meet at Maidstone on Tuesday.

A Tom Bradbrook double earned Margate a 2-1 home win over Carshalton in their mid-table

contest. He turned in Wayne Wilson's cross in the 12th minute and the visitors were denied an instant reply when Jamie Turner tipped Joel Ledgister's free-kick on to the bar. Turner did the same on 34 minutes from Luke Pigden's free-kick but this time the ball bounced behind the line to level matters. Bradbrook headed the decider two minutes after the break.

Division One North

Brentwood Town continued their upsurge in form with a stunning 7-2 victory at Great Wakering yesterday (Saturday), firmly establishing them in third place in Division One North. The Blues have been unstoppable since they were shaken up by a 6-0 home defeat by Enfield and now look certain to capture a play-off spot.

A Ryan Edgar double either side of a Sos Yao strike put them three up inside half an hour. Joe Gardner gave Wakering a little hope with a 38th minute reply, only for Steve Butterworth to restore the three-goal margin before the interval. Ross Wall pulled another one back midway through the second half but Yao made it 5-2 and the visitors wrapped it up with late goals from Jacob Dingli and Rob Whitnell, the latter's first since his move last month from Witham, where he was by some distance the Essex Senior League's top scorer.

Needham Market's title bid faltered again as they were held to their third scoreless draw in recent weeks, this one at Enfield. They were unlucky not to do better; Craig Parker and Sam Newson both hit the woodwork in the second half.

They still have two games in hand on leaders East Thurrock but are now five points adrift. Rocks won 2-0 at Sudbury, taking the lead just after half-time when a foul on Reiss Gilbey allowed Kris Newby to score from the spot, his 20th league goal and 25th in all. Hakeem Araba stretched the lead just after the hour and a straight red card for Jack Wignall left the hosts with little hope of a recovery.

Wingate and Maldon, the other two clubs in the play-off spots, seemed fairly happy to settle for a 0-0 draw at the Abrahams Stadium. Maldon's Chris Chase came closest to scoring against his old club.

Harlow have been making inconspicuous progress of late but they are certainly on the map now. David Cowley's double earned

them a 2-1 home win over Thamesmead and lifted them to sixth place, just a point behind Maldon with two games in hand. Cowley's lob after 20 minutes was wiped out by Stuart King five minutes before the break, but the Harlow man won it midway through the second half, finishing off good work by Getro Kilapi.

Romford are still very much in the picture after their 2-1 success at Potters Bar. Paul Clayton and Kurt Smith netted in the first half-hour, with Bar's reply coming after 75 minutes through Louis Collins, whose cross found a way past everyone.

Grays continue to make progress, though it is not yet reflected in the table where they remain 12th. Their 4-0 thumping of bottom club Waltham Forest brought them within seven points of Maldon with four games in hand. Forest held out until the 45th minute, when Duran Reynolds scored, and the visitors then had keeper Jason Willis dismissed in added time. Grays soon took advantage, with Danny Morgan and John Docker striking in the first five minutes of the second half. Jared Small added the fourth.

Forest now face a desperate battle for survival. Landlords Ilford left them five points adrift when a 25-yard strike by defender Carl Paul in the 88th minute provided the only goal of their home game with Cheshunt.

No-one else looks likely to be drawn into the relegation struggle. Two of the teams just above it, Tilbury and Redbridge, met at Tilbury and it was the visitors who eased any lingering worries with two unanswered goals. Julian Edwards and Craig Arnott were the second-half marksmen.

The Motormen moved above their victims and also overtook Ware, who went down 1-0 at home to Waltham Abbey. A seventh-minute penalty by Steve Crawley decided it.

Division One South

One landmark was reached in Division One South on Saturday, though it is not one that will fill Horsham YMCA with glee. Shaun Elliott's goal for Walton & Hersham seven minutes after half-time, their second in a 3-0 home win, was the 100th YM have conceded in the league. Gary Frewen should have brought up the ton, but he missed a penalty just before the interval. Bakary Bojang had opened the scoring and Chris Wales added the third.

YMCA, ten points adrift at the bottom and 15 short of safety, look doomed to the drop but Walton remain in the play-off race, a point behind fifth-placed Burgess Hill who ended Fleet's recent run of wins by trouncing them 6-0 at Leylands Park. It took them 37 minutes to open the scoring through newcomer Sonny Cobbs, who went on to complete a hat-trick. Happy manager Gary Croydon commented on Facebook, "When you need a goalscorer sign a good centre-half, play him midfield and see what happens."

Cobbs led the second-half romp with goals in the 57th and 75th minutes, in between which Sam Tucknott and Danny Curd also found the net. Tucknott then claimed the sixth.

It was a good weekend for the leading clubs in the division, with the top six (including Leatherhead, (who played on Friday), all collecting three points. Luke Nightingale scored his 100th goal for leaders Bognor after 69 minutes of their 2-0 home win over Faversham. Jason Prior opened the account with a 16th-minute penalty, his 27th goal of the season. The visitors had Dane Luchford sent off before half-time and Nightingale doubled the score with his 23rd of the campaign.

Metropolitan Police stayed a point behind after snatching a controversial 2-1 victory at Whyteleafe. Steve Noakes netted the winner in added time, with Leafe insisting that the referee had already whistled to award a penalty. Veteran striker Rob Haworth had given the Met a 21st minute lead with his first goal since his switch from Tooting and he headed against a post soon afterwards. A moment of slack defence seemed to have cost the Met two precious points when Kwabena Agyei levelled it in the 88th minute.

Police manager Jim Cooper said, "The ref seemed to award us a penalty only to allow play to continue for a second, allowing Steve Noakes to score." And he admitted, "With our scoring boots left at home today we might have missed the penalty anyway."

Third-placed Whitehawk, the league's top scorers, took their haul to 83 with their 3-1 victory at Whitstable. All their goals came from Sam Gargan, the first after 41 minutes. The Oystermen wasted a chance to reply when Lloyd Anderson saved Lloyd Blackman's penalty and then did it again when the referee ordered a retake. Blackman made amends

with a goal on the hour but Gargan soon restored Hawks' advantage and clinched it with his hat-trick goal. He became the seventh Hawk to boast a double-figure goal tally, five of them having reached that mark in league games alone.

Walton Casuals had their play-off hopes dented by a 1-0 defeat at Sittingbourne, who kept themselves in with a chance. There was controversy here, too. A Walton player was red-carded in the tunnel after Nick Reeves won the game with a penalty in the fifth minute of added time.

More spot-kick drama at Chatham, where Billy Shinnars put the hosts ahead with a penalty in the 78th minute and Worthing salvaged a 1-1 draw in similar fashion through Mike Hockett in the 87th minute.

Two goals by Jason Thompson could not avert a 3-2 defeat for Chipstead at Dulwich. He opened the scoring after 15 minutes only for Junior Kadi and Ray Powell to put the hosts ahead by half-time. Thompson equalised on 68 minutes, forcing the ball home after his penalty was saved, but Vernon Francis won it six minutes later. Chips had Jason Goodchild sent off near the end.

Stuart Vahid scored his first goal since returning to Ramsgate from Whitstable last month and it gave them the points at Eastbourne. It came after 37 minutes following some slack defensive work.

Two goals in five minutes midway through the first half maintained Godalming's improved form as they beat visiting Corinthian-Casuals 2-1. Gabriel Odunaike and Gavin Smith were on target. Casuals, now five points adrift of Chatham in 21st place, upped their game in the second half and Kane Sergeant pulled one back after 72 minutes. They could not find the net again and James Evans missed a penalty for G's in added time. That made a total of eight penalties in the division, four of them missed.

Ryman Youth League

For the first time in many weeks the full Youth League programme went ahead with no postponements and Northwood's Romaine Walker emerged as the star with all four goals in his side's 4-3 home win over Hayes in the West Division. Walker hauled his side back

on to level terms three times and then hit the deciding goal after 84 minutes.

Both Barnet teams in this division lost at home. Barnet Black went down 3-2 to Staines, for whom Mario Quiassaca scored twice as they went to the top of the table. Jeremy Okolo netted twice for Hampton in their 3-1 win over Barnet Amber.

Harrow beat Fleet 2-0 with both two goals coming in a minute of action divided by the half-time interval. Peter Morales and George Moore were on target.

South-East Division leaders Whitehawk were held to a 1-1 draw by Horsham and that enabled Lewes, in third place, to move within three points of them with three games in hand.

Unbeaten Lewes had to fight for their 5-3 win over Horsham YMCA, who have only one point to their credit. Layton Schaaf scored two of the home goals, all five of which came in the space of 25 mid-match minutes. Louis Mash netted twice for YMCA.

Jack Meade grabbed a last-minute winner for Welling at Tonbridge and the Wings, who have lost only once, are 12 points off the pace with five games in hand. Danny Nicholl scored twice as they opened up a 3-1 lead but Tonbridge hit back and Ryan Waterman's 77th minute effort almost earned them a point before Meade made it 4-3.

The Jenkins brothers, Lewis and Dec, were both on target for Worthing in their 3-1 victory at Horsham, who played twice in the week.

Kingstonian are on the brink of the Central Division title. Matt Robinson's 70th minute goal accounted for Carshalton and it means that if they win their last game they cannot be caught even though everyone else in the division has played at least two fewer games and some have as many as six in hand. This latest K's victory, however, leaves only Leatherhead still in title contention.

They maintained their hopes by coming from behind to beat Walton & Hersham 2-1. Charlie Hamsher netted the winner in the 82nd minute.

Ben King scored twice for Sutton but they went down 3-2 at home to Chipstead thanks to Ryan Robinson's second-half double.

There was one game in the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup and Thamesmead went through to the third round with two unanswered first-half goals from Sam Coker at Billericay.

A single goal by Jacob Cook proved to be the winner for Ryman Youth League club Burgess Hill Town in Thursday's Sussex Youth Cup final. Cook struck after 65 minutes as the young Hillians beat Horsham-based Broadbridge Heath 1-0 at Lancing.

On the previous night Ashford Town (Middx) lost out in the final of the Middlesex Youth Cup. They faced Harefield, who had beaten them earlier in the season in an FA Youth Cup tie with a goal in the last minute of extra time. And history was to repeat itself as Jack Reader scored in the 120th minute to give Harefield a 1-0 victory which they achieved despite being reduced to ten men after an hour.

CHAMPIONSHIP MANAGER CUP – SEMI-FINALS

Dulwich Hamlet will face Wingate & Finchley in the final of the Championship Manager Cup on Wednesday, 30th March.

Dulwich booked their place in style on Tuesday with a thumping 5-1 victory at holders Leatherhead while Joe O'Brien's double earned Wingate a 2-1 home win over Maldon & Tiptree.

Kevin James put Dulwich ahead after seven minutes, firing home from a cross by Ray Powell. Tanners struggled to break through an effective visiting defence but drew level on the half-hour when Mu Maan finished from close range after a penetrating run by Tommy Hutchings. A low drive by Nyren Clunis quickly restored the Dulwich lead and a Powell header made it 3-1 at half-time.

Although under pressure for much of the time, Tanners almost hauled themselves back into it when Greg Andrews hit the bar. James effectively settled matters with a free-kick midway through the second half and Calvin Morath-Gibbs completed the rout with 15 minutes left.

The first half was goalless at Wingate, with Maldon twice going close. Michael Deane's effort was cleared off the line by Dan Nielsen and, in stoppage time, Jack Haverson headed against a post.

Nielsen turned from hero to villain five minutes after the break when he inadvertently headed a Maldon free-kick into his own net.

His blushes were spared when O'Brien struck twice in the next 12 minutes. He equalised with a free-kick from the edge of the box and, after Haverson had another header turned against a post by home keeper Dan Lee, Maldon's misfortune was compounded when an O'Brien shot was deflected against a post and over the line.

Therefore, with immediate effect players are not allowed to wear these garments and I would ask you to inform your member clubs of this decision.”
