WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Premier Division leaders Sutton United were involved in late drama at Hornchurch on Saturday. Fifth-placed Urchins had the upper hand for long periods but could come no closer than a Tommy Black shot which hit the post in the first half.

Then, in the 86th minute, Sutton showed table-topping quality when Leroy Griffiths finished ruthlessly to give them the lead with their first clear chance of the afternoon. It should have been enough, but four minutes into added time Tommy Kavanagh shoved over Lewis Smith and Kieron St Aimie made it 1-1 from the spot. Nevertheless it was the first point Sutton had collected at Hornchurch Stadium since 1963.

With emotions running high, there was a flare-up after the final whistle which brought red cards for Sutton's top scorer Bradley Woods-Garness and Hornchurch winger Tambeson Eyong.

Despite the dropped points, Sutton extended their lead as the three teams behind them were all beaten. Bury, now seven points behind in second spot, went down 2-1 at home to Concord. Harry Elmes put the visitors ahead after 21 minutes and Tony Stokes made it 2-0 shortly before the break. Sam Nunn replied in the 73rd minute and a goalline clearance denied Chris Henderson an equaliser.

Tonbridge remained five points further back after going down to a lone goal by Danny Heale after 20 minutes at Canvey. Heale pounced when John Easterford's header was blocked on the line.

Lowestoft suffered a first half to forget at Kingstonian. Michael Frew had an early penalty saved by Rob Tolfrey and Andy Fisk had a goal disallowed for a marginal offside decision shortly afterwards. Then Fisk was sent off before the half-hour mark when he

was shown his second yellow card. Paul Vines then gave K's a 44th minute lead and Sam Clayton had time to make it 2-0 before the interval.

There was no further scoring and the Trawlerboys, Sutton's main challengers not so long ago, are clinging to a play-off spot by a thread.

Billericay moved above them into fourth place, though they made hard work of their 2-0 victory at bottom club Maidstone. Micah Hyde had a penalty saved by Stones keeper Andy Walker just before half-time and it was the 84th minute before Tony Boot broke the deadlock. New signing Charlie Allen, the son of former West Ham favourite 'Mad Dog' Martin, added another.

Canvey's win lifted them moved up to sixth, behind Lowestoft and ahead of Hornchurch on goal difference. Kingstonian and Concord are two points behind the trio, so fourth to ninth places are covered by just three points.

Cray and Harrow are two points further back. Cray took a fifth-minute lead with a Joe Vines header at home to Horsham but had to settle for a draw when Anthony Storey equalised from the spot, after a foul on Jamie Brotherton, with six minutes left.

Harrow, meanwhile, went down 3-2 at Tooting. Kurt Morlese scored for them in the fourth minute and Rocky Baptiste converted a last-minute penalty. In between, though, Reece Hall and Jason Henry netted for the Terrors in the closing stages of the first half and Henry struck again the 72nd minute.

It looks ominous for the bottom four after Hastings moved five points clear of the relegation zone, and to within a point of Horsham, with a 3-1 home win over 21st placed Croydon. Sam Adams had a penalty saved by Charlie Mitten three minutes before the break but converted the rebound. Hastings were awarded another penalty 11 minutes after the break and Adams had the confidence to take it despite the fact that he had also failed from the spot in midweek. This time he made no mistake. Sean Ray headed the third goal in the 69th minute before Croydon were given slim consolation by Stefan Joseph's reply in added time.

Folkestone grabbed a useful point from a 1-1 draw at Wealdstone. Peter Dean put Stones ahead on the half-hour and they stayed in front until seven minutes from time, when Simon Austin saved the visitors with a fierce volley. Stones skipper Lee Chappell was sent off for his protests.

Aveley's hopes of staying up were dented as they forfeited a 2-0 half-time lead and drew 2-2 at Carshalton. Ryan Salmon put the visitors in front after ten minutes and they changed ends in joyous mood after Kenny Beaney added a second from the spot just before the interval.

But Fulham loanee Matt Reece halved the deficit within five minutes of the restart and Millers suffered a further blow when Ryan Andrews was sent off on the hour. Joel Ledgister headed the equaliser shortly afterwards.

There was just one 'meaningless' game between two sides who seem certain to be in this division next season, and what a remarkable affair it turned out to be. Margate powered into an early 2-0 lead at Hendon with goals from Craig Cloke and Tom Bradbrook, and when Danny Dyer was sent off after 22 minutes it seemed to end Hendon's recovery chances.

But Bilal Aite-Ouakrim pulled one back in the 52nd minute and six minutes later it was doubly all square: ten men apiece when Tommy Osborne was sent off for handball, two goals apiece when Jamie Busby converted the penalty.

Seven minutes later it was Margate's turn to be on the spot when James Pinnock was brought down and Wayne Wilson put the visitors 3-2 up. Somehow it stayed that way: Busby had another penalty saved by Jamie Turner, Margate went down to nine men in the 77th minute when Jamie Rogers collected his second yellow card and, finally, Busby hit a post.

Division One North

With East Thurrock taking a day off, Needham Market had the chance to return to the top of Division One North by winning their game in hand at home to lowly Ilford on Saturday. And there seemed little doubt that they would do so when Nathan Stone put them ahead with one of the quickest goals in the league's 106-year history, timed at just EIGHT seconds.

Enter Nathaniel Gordon. The Ilford striker fired a surprise equaliser after 14 minutes and went on to complete a sensational hat-trick with two goals in eight second-half minutes. The Marketmen pulled themselves together and the experienced Kris Lee pulled a goal back in the 75th minute, his first for the club. Craig Parker made it 3-3 from the penalty spot with two minutes left, his 31st goal of the season. The draw was not enough for Needham, still a point adrift of the leaders, while Ilford moved seven points clear of bottom club Waltham Forest.

Brentwood are 14 points behind Needham in third place but have an eight-point cushion over the sides behind them after they chalked up their eight successive victory. Defender Darren Blewitt was the hero of their 2-1 home win over Ware, scoring in the 20th and 71st minutes. His second goal came two minutes after Sam Ruff had equalised, and two minutes before Ware's Chris Sargent was sent off.

Maldon & Tiptree moved back into fourth spot thanks to an Ollie Berquez double at Cheshunt. The hosts took the lead after only three minutes with a header by Peter Antoniadou and held it until seven minutes after half-time, when Berquez converted a penalty for handball. He then netted the winner in the 71st minute.

Wingate & Finchley now trail Maldon on goal difference after a 2-0 home defeat by Great Wakering. Leon Smith hit a post for the hosts in a goalless first half but Wakering gained the upper hand after the break and scored twice in the last ten minutes through Joe Gardner and Toran Senghore, their recent signing from Romford.

Goal difference also separates Wingate from sixth-placed Harlow, who won 2-1 at Redbridge. Steve Ferguson headed their opener after 25 minutes and David Cowley got the second moments before half-time. More might have followed, but the Motormen hung on and gave themselves a chance of a point when Kyle Fraser-Allen scored with 15 minutes left.

Michael Shinn's second-half double earned AFC Sudbury a 2-0 victory at Waltham Abbey and brought them within a point of the three sides above them, with much better goal figures than any of them. Shinn broke the

deadlock after 65 minutes and made sure eight minutes later.

In eighth place, one point behind Maldon and with at least two games in hand over all the teams above them, are Romford, who beat Enfield Town 2-0. So tight is the race that the defeat sent Enfield tumbling from fifth place to ninth. Ben Turner broke the first-half deadlock with a 45th minute penalty and Alex Read converted Kurt Smith's cross in the 72nd minute.

Two sides on the fringe of the promotion race met at Heybridge and it was the hosts who came out on top, beating Grays 3-1. Chris Lewis put them ahead after seven minutes and provided the cross for Reece Morgan to make it 2-0 shortly before half-time with a spectacular diving header. Jared Small pulled one back in the 57th minute and Grays were the better side after that. Their efforts were in vain and Luke Callander clinched it for Swifts with two minutes left.

Potters Bar strolled to a 3-0 victory at Thamesmead after taking a first-minute lead when Chris Doyle hit a post and Jose Espinoza buried the rebound. They also netted in the last minute through Ashley Harrison-Barker, after Tom Pett made it 2-0 shortly before half-time.

Bradley Barnes struck twice, after nine and 72 minutes, as Tilbury won 2-0 at Waltham Forest to push their hosts closer to the drop.

Division One South

Leatherhead manager Mick Sullivan celebrated his return to the helm in style on Saturday. His side saw off Division One South leaders Bognor 3-2 in a thrilling game.

Several of the league's most prolific marksmen were in action and it was one of them, Tommy Hutchings, who gave Tanners a third-minute lead with his 22nd goal in all matches. Jason Prior responded six minutes later, heading his 23rd league goal and 29th in all, and Tim Bond put the visitors ahead on the half-hour.

Tanners responded through Mu Maan in the 42nd minute and then regained the lead moments before the interval. Greg Andrews curled in a free-kick for his 25th goal in the league. It maintained his lead in the race for the golden boot, just ahead of Needham's Craig Parker who scored his 24th later in the

day. It was actually Parker's 25th but one of them was against Leyton and was deleted from the records when Leyton left the League. Prior was denied his 24th by a post in a goalless second half but Tanners held out to delight Sullivan, who resigned on the Tuesday before last but returned to his post this week.

Bognor's defeat gave Metropolitan Police the chance to draw level with them at the top of the table and they thought they had done just that when Eddie Smith put them ahead after 80 scoreless minutes at Imber Court. But lowly Eastbourne snatched an 89th minute equaliser with a header from Medi Koroma.

To complete a rare off day for the leading trio, Whitehawk went down 1-0 at home to Walton & Hersham. Ashley Quashie glanced in a header after 52 minutes to win it, although Hawks were denied a last-minute equaliser by Ryan Adams' goalline clearance.

The Sussex side are six points behind the Police and seven ahead of Leatherhead, who have three games in hand on everyone else in the top half of the table.

Tanners look certain to make the play-offs, having moved seven points clear of fifth-placed Burgess Hill after they drew 1-1 at Faversham. Will Berry made the most of a defensive error to put Hillians ahead after 25 minutes but Faversham claimed a point with an 82nd minute header from Ashley Brown. Burgess Hill now lead Walton & Hersham only by virtue of having scored two more goals.

Walton Casuals kept their hopes alive with a 3-0 home win over Merstham. Chris Drake fired them ahead after 53 minutes and added another in the 66th minute. Kofi Lockhart-Adams made it three in added time.

Dulwich are also still in the picture thanks to a 2-0 win at bottom club Horsham YMCA. The hosts must have feared another substantial addition to their goals-against column after a solo effort by Nyren Clunis and a flying header by Rob Gradwell in the first quarter of the game. But it proved to be the end of the scoring and it was YM's Tony Reid who came closest after that, hitting the bar.

YMCA are now 12 points adrift at the bottom with only seven games to play after Corinthian-Casuals revived their survival hopes with a 3-2 home win over Sittingbourne. Jamal Carr

scored the winner in added time and that could turn out to be a precious goal in the final reckoning. The Brickies took the lead through Ryan Golding a minute before the interval but Casuals hit back with goals by Scott Hassell on 56 minutes and Saheed Sankoh 13 minutes later, both set up by Dave Hodges. A Nick Reeves penalty made it 2-2 after 80 minutes but Hodges did it again as he provided the chance for Carr's decider.

Casuals remain 21st but are only three points behind Chatham, who also scored in added time to claim a vital point. Kane Packer headed them into the lead on the hour at Chipstead, who replied almost at once through Kofi Quartey. Chips went close more than once before Josh James put them 2-1 up in the 88th minute, only for the visitors to scramble a 93rd minute equaliser credited to Jason Barton.

Ian Pulman continued his goalscoring form for Whitstable, becoming the sixth player to reach 20 Ryman League goals this season and adding his 21st a minute later. That was at Worthing, where Pulman's quickfire double midway through the first half was enough for a 2-1 victory. Steve Metcalf pulled one back with seven minutes left.

Meshach Smith, just signed on loan from Wimbledon, made a swift impression for Whyteleaf with a fourth-minute opener at Fleet. The hosts replied through Michael Murphy two minutes before the interval but it was Leaf who came out on top 2-1, Kwabena Agyei scoring the winner after 71 minutes. Fleet had Leigh Rumbold sent off towards the end.

Ramsgate took the points at home to Godalming when Stuart Vahid was brought down in the 56th minute and Mark Lovell notched the only goal of the game from the spot.

Ryman Youth League

Welcome progress was made this week in the weather-hit Lucas Fettes Youth Cup, with the second round being completed at last and half the third-round (last 16) ties also being played.

Sutton were the most convincing winners. Lewis Wilson fired a hat-trick in their 5-0 second-round victory over Dulwich, who had such a fine run in the FA Youth Cup before going out to Newcastle United. Also in the

second round, Delarney Ewerse and Sonny Ayres scored in the last 15 minutes as Carshalton came from behind to beat Whitehawk 2-1, while Jack Simon netted twice as Maidstone wrapped up the round with a 3-1 win over Cray.

The third-round ties produced plenty of goals and all eight teams involved held the lead at some time during their games. Seven of the goals came at Tonbridge where Jack Funnell put the hosts ahead only for Faversham to gain the lead by half-time. The second half belonged to Tonbridge, however, and Funnell scored again as they won 5-2.

Extra time was needed at Northwood, where Romaine Walker scored his second of the night and Dwayne Cole-Parkes added another to see off Hendon 4-2 after the Greens had scored first.

There was an extra 30 minutes at Burgess Hill, too, and Bradley Murray notched his second of the game in the 115th minute to give Staines a 3-2 victory after they had twice fallen behind, initially as early as the second minute when Oliver Lockyer scored for the Hillians.

Jordan Lang and Scott Faber were both on target in the space of nine second-half minutes as Lewes overturned a half-time deficit to win 2-1 at Kingstonian.

There was plenty of Ryman Youth League action as well, much of it in the West Division where four matches took place. Woking made the most of Staines' cup involvement, knocking them off the top of the table by winning 3-1 at Fleet. Timmy Taylor, Adam Bicknell and Jack Mazzone were all on target for Woking in the first 17 minutes and Fleet's reply did not come until the last knockings, when Jake Beale hit their consolation.

Fleet remain next to bottom after the team below them, Barnet (Black), lost 3-0 at Hampton. All the goals, including a Ben Chekib double, came after half-time.

Ashford (Middx) snatched a 2-1 victory at Barnet (Amber) despite finding themselves behind with five minutes to go. A Max Webb levelled the scores and Conor Moody popped up with a late winner. The activity in this

division was completed by Harrow's 2-0 victory at Hayes. Poju Adesilu opened the scoring on the hour and Dan Tomlin doubled the lead five minutes later.

There was a welcome Central Division win for bottom club Thamesmead. Josh Froggatt scored the only goal of their game at Chipstead after 12 minutes. Metropolitan Police, two down soon after the interval, escaped with a 2-2 home draw against Walton. James Cottee got the equaliser with nine minutes to go.

There were three matches in the South-East Division but none of the top four were involved. Bottom club Horsham YMCA suffered their tenth defeat in 11 attempts, beaten by a lone Dec Jenkins goal at Worthing, and neighbours Horsham, one place above them, moved nine points ahead by beating Eastbourne 3-1. Luke Johnson put Eastbourne ahead and Timi Ojo started the comeback.

Ashford (Kent) stayed ahead of Horsham on goal difference as Liam Walsh and Gary Penfold earned them a 2-0 victory at Welling.
