THE CHAMPIONSHIP MANAGER CUP

Wingate & Finchley captured the Championship Manager Cup with a 2-0 win over Dulwich Hamlet on Wednesday evening. Their goals came from David Laird and Ahmet Rifat, and they owed much to the superb goalkeeping of veteran Gavin King in his first match for three months.

It was Dulwich who had the upper hand in the early stages and they would have taken the lead in the 15th minute but for King's lightning reactions to deny Lewis Gonsalves. A minute later King, who was 39 last month, did it again to foil Dean Carpenter. He should not even have been playing; a broken hand had seemingly ended his season some time ago but his replacement, Bobby Smith, is cup-tied so King stepped into the breach.

His opposite number, James Dunn, is less than half his age at 19 but he responded brilliantly when he was called into serious action for the first time shortly afterwards, tipping over Laird's free-kick which was heading for the top corner of the net. Then he pulled off another fine save when the dangerous Leon Smith, who was to be named man of the match, burst clear of the defence.

It was King's turn again in the 37th minute, Ray Powell his victim this time, and Wingate snatched the lead against the run of play six minutes later. Smith's pace again took him through and he cut the ball back for Laird to score with ease.

If the Division One North side, who had never before been past the last 16 in the competition, were more than a little fortunate to be ahead at

the interval, the goal gave them all the encouragement they needed.

They controlled the second half and in the end were worthy winners of the trophy. Smith set up three good chances that were not taken but, in amongst them, Wingate notched their second goal on 65 minutes when a good move on the left by Josh Cooper and Gary Burrell ended with a cross that eluded several players before Rifat bundled the ball over the line at the far post.

Dulwich never gave up but failed to give King any serious problems in the second half of a game, well refereed by Nigel Lugg and his colleagues, that was a credit to the Ryman Football League and proved the high standard of the football in the lower divisions.

Wingate's Leon Smith was nominated "Man of the Match" by Mervyn Day, Brand Ambassador for the sponsors Championship Manager.

Macron Manager of the Month

Canvey Island's John Batch takes the Premier Division award for his team's storming form as they make a late run towards a play-off. These awards are decided on a straightforward points per game basis and Canvey's record of five wins and a draw in seven games gave them an average of 2.29. They edged out Harrow, another team in form at the right time who averaged 2.25 from six wins and two defeats.

East Thurrock United were the only club in the league with a 100 per cent record in March.

They won six matches to open up a six-point lead at the top of Division One North and secure the monthly award for manager John Coventry. Two other sides in outstanding form were Harlow and Brentwood, who each played seven times and dropped two and three points respectively.

The Division One South prize went to the Bognor Regis Town team of Jamie Howell and Darin Killpartrick, a nice Saturday morning boost for them as they prepared their side for the all-important visit to Metropolitan Police. Bognor won four and lost one of their five games during March, which they ended a point behind the Police at the top of the table with a game in hand. Ramsgate were second in the award rankings after collecting 16 points from seven matches.

Macron Team Performance of the Month

Lee Chappell's last-minute goal earned Wealdstone a 2-1 win over leaders Sutton on March 5 and that result was voted the performance of the month in the Premier Division. At the time it seemed to keep the title race wide open and put Wealdstone well into play-off contention, though its significance reduced as the month developed, Sutton nailed down their lead and Stones faded away.

This is the only award that is not confined to league matches and Wingate & Finchley are the Division One North winners after becoming the ninth team from outside the Premier Division to lift the league cup since it was introduced in 1974. They beat Dulwich Hamlet 2-0 in the final of what is now the Championship Manager Cup.

There were a host of good performances in Division One South, where no fewer than five teams chalked up a six-hit during March. One of them was Dulwich Hamlet, who beat Fleet 6-0, and it's Dulwich who take the prize. Not for that result, however. Their 5-1 victory at holders Leatherhead in the Championship Manager Cup semi-finals was given the verdict.

Sells Goalkeeping Academy Good Hands

These awards go to the first-choice goalkeeper of the team with the best defensive record during the month and in the Premier Division that was Tonbridge, who



conceded three goals in six games. Lee Worgan is the award-winner and his club were most grateful for his efforts, which enabled them to collect nine points during the month despite scoring only five times.

East Thurrock's second award of the month goes to their goalkeeper Richard Wray. Like Tonbridge, they let in three goals in six matches though they had a rather better record at the other end, netting 15 goals.

Jack Smelt took the honours in Division One South, where he and his defensive colleagues at Ramsgate were beaten five times in seven games. Despite the high scoring mentioned above, 11 clubs – exactly half the division – conceded no more than a goal a game in March.

WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Comebacks were the story of the day in the Premier Division with two sides coming from two goals down to record vital wins and a third being denied a similar success only by the woodwork.

Harrow winger Kenta Nakashima returns to his native Japan before the end of the season and he gave his club every reason to regret it as he inspired a stirring rally from an early 2-0 deficit at Margate. Dan Langiano put Margate ahead after two minutes and they looked set to deal a massive blow to Harrow's play-off ambitions

when Tom Bradbrook made it 2-0 in the 16th minute.

It stayed that way until the first minute of the second half, when Nakashima's close-range header revived the visitors. Dewayne Clarke levelled matters nine minutes later and Harrow snatched the all-important winner with the cleverest of flicks from Nakashima in the 84th minute.

They are now the top scorers in the division and, more importantly, find themselves in third place, two points ahead of Lowestoft and Tonbridge who battled out a goalless draw in Suffolk. The Trawlerboys twice hit the bar and Matt Nolan was denied a last-gasp winner by Tonbridge keeper Lee Worgan.

A return to the comeback theme takes us to Tooting & Mitcham United, where ten-man Maidstone snatched an unlikely 4-3 victory to maintain their hopes of escaping the drop. A week earlier they were hopelessly adrift but after this second successive win they are now back with the pack at the bottom, though still six points away from safety.

Youngster Alex Flisher put Stones ahead after 22 minutes but the Terrors were level within five minutes when Jamie Byatt followed up to score after Andy Walker saved his penalty. Jason Henry put Tooting ahead on the stroke of half-time and made it 3-1 on the hour. Adam Burchell's dismissal five minutes later seemed to have ended the contest but Stones had other ideas. Tom Mills reduced the arrears and Ellis Green levelled it in the 90th minute. The celebrations had hardly died down when Gary Wharton rekindled them with a marvellous solo goal.

The other comeback kings were Canvey, where a Sam Adams penalty and a strike by Harry Beautyman gave Hastings a 2-0 half-time lead. Matt Game gave Canvey hope on the hour, Danny Heale equalised with four minutes left and they so nearly grabbed a winner when Alex Rhodes hit a post. So tight is the play-off battle that, had that post not got in the way, the islanders would be fifth instead of eighth.

Their neighbours Concord are sixth, a point behind Lowestoft and Tonbridge, after a comfortable 3-1 victory at Wealdstone. The hosts, with a severely weakened line-up, fell behind to a volley by James Elmes in the 11th

minute and Steve King added another before the interval. Gavin Massey put Stones back in the contest in the 57th minute, only for Tony Stokes to head Concord's third shortly afterwards.

Concord move above Billericay on goal difference after their Essex rivals were held to a 1-1 draw at Folkestone Invicta. James Everitt put Folkestone ahead on the half-hour from a pass by his brother Micheal. Josh Vincent was denied a second by an upraised flag in the 42nd minute and Billericay were level moments later through Tony Boot. A creditable point for Folkestone, but it did not prevent them dropping to the bottom of the table.

Canvey are a further point back, as are Kingstonian after their much-needed 3-1 win at Carshalton. The game was decided in a minute either side of half-time when Paul Vines and Sam Clayton found the net. That was perhaps harsh on the home side, who had the better of the first half, but they fell further behind to a Tom Hutchinson header in the 70th minute, leaving David Ray to head a consolation goal.

While all this was going on behind them, leaders Sutton could only manage a 0-0 draw at lowly Aveley and had their lead cut to five points by Bury Town, who were themselves hardly convincing as they beat Croydon Athletic with a penalty by Chris Henderson just before half-time. Nevertheless, the title race is very much alive again as the top two prepare to meet at Sutton in five days' time.

The bottom four are once again covered by a single point with Folkestone, who have played fewer games, just behind Aveley, Maidstone and Croydon. But the six-point gap between that trio and Hastings looks daunting as time begins to run out.

Horsham are a further point ahead of Hastings after achieving the goalless home draw which seemed to be the limit of their ambitions against AFC Hornchurch. In a poor game, Urchins were aggrieved that they had three plausible penalty appeals waved away in the second half, all for incidents involving new signing Brian Haule.

They are now four points adrift of the play-off places but still just about in contention, as therefore must be Cray, who are three points

behind Hornchurch with a game in hand. Laurent Hamici became the division's joint-top scorer with 20 league goals when he netted the 86th minute penalty clincher in their 3-1 home win over Hendon. Leigh Bremner headed Cray in front after 14 minutes and set up the second for Hamici 12 minutes later. Kevin Maclaren put the visitors back in the picture in the 57th minute and it was not until Hamici punished a foul on himself that the points were safe.

Division One North

Needham Market almost stole a march on Division One North title rivals East Thurrock United ahead of their showdown at Rookery Hill this coming Saturday.

While Craig Parker's penalty double earned Needham a 2-1 home win over Romford, the leaders looked set to drop two points at Heybridge.

But Nathan Smith's own goal edged East Thurrock in front with two minutes left in what had become a ten-a-side game and Joe Keith made it 3-1 with a free-kick in added time.

Tom Broadhurst had given Heybridge a seventh-minute lead which Hakeem Araba wiped out with a 20th minute penalty. The home side's Chris Ribchester and Thurrock's Ben Wood were dismissed in separate second-half incidents before Rocks produced their telling finale.

So Needham remain six points behind with a game in hand. Parker's spot-kicks after 14 and 33 minutes, for fouls on Rhys Barber and Jamie Godbold, took him to 27 league goals, one behind top man Greg Andrews of Leatherhead. Chris Thomas replied seven minutes after the break.

The runaway leading pair are now guaranteed to finish first and second but one of them will find themselves facing the lottery of the play-offs.

At the other end of the table, a team that play at Cricklefield Stadium will almost certainly be relegated – only one side will go down after Leyton's withdrawal – and at teatime on Wednesday that looked sure to be Waltham Forest, who were ten points adrift of landlords Ilford. But they beat Redbridge that night and followed up by thumping Ware 4-1 on Saturday.

Ryan Ware gave Ware the lead shortly before half-time but Forest stormed back after the break with two goals from Billy Healey either side of one from Josh Bonnett. When Ware had a chance to get back in it Matt Marshall's penalty was saved by Eric Pudaloff and Forest's experienced midweek signing Marvin Samuel wrapped it up.

Ilford, meanwhile, went down 2-0 at Tilbury and suddenly find their tenants just four points behind them with a game in hand. Steve Good's second-minute goal set Tilbury on their way and Ben Boyce added the clincher with 15 minutes left.

Back to the sides with Premier Division ambitions, and the firm grip Brentwood seemed to have established on third place after their nine-match winning run was further loosened by a second successive defeat, 2-1 at home to Maldon. Needing to bounce back from a shock 2-0 setback at Ilford the previous Saturday, Blues hardly got the start they wanted.

There were just 12 seconds on the clock when Lee Blackburn put Maldon ahead. Brentwood pulled themselves together and James Love equalised in the 21st minute, only for Ellis Remy to strike just before half-time to restore Maldon's lead against the club he left six weeks ago. Second-half dismissals for Blackburn and Ollie Berquez left Maldon hanging on with nine men.

Fourth-placed Harlow failed to make the most of Brentwood's slip. Bertie Brayley gave them a 10th minute lead at Great Wakering but Dan Trenkel – who was thought to have suffered a season-ending injury a while ago – made it 1-1 with a penalty 13 minutes from time after Donny Barnard brought down Joe Gardner. Harlow are four points behind Brentwood with a game in hand.

AFC Sudbury stay fifth but lead Maldon & Tiptree only on goal difference after their 2-2 draw at Potters Bar. They led twice, through Dave Wareham and James Baker, but were hauled back on each occasion by Louis Collins and a Tom Devaux own goal.

Two more clubs are a point behind in what looks likely to be a rare battle for the play-off spots. Enfield Town moved up to seventh with a 2-1 home win over Redbridge, who took a

fourth-minute lead through Kevin McLeod. It stayed that way until six minutes after the interval, when Dave Kendall equalised from Michael Bardle's cross, and a defender deflected Mark Kirby's shot into his own net for the winner nine minutes later.

Wingate & Finchley, who had no game, thus had extra time to recover from celebrating their victory in the Championship Cup Manager final on Wednesday but dropped to eighth in the table. They have one or two games in hand on their rivals, however.

Romford and Grays are a few points further back but, also with games in hand, they are not quite out of the picture yet. Alex Osborn scored after 71 minutes to give Grays a 1-0 home win over Waltham Abbey, whose deadline signing Andre Humphrey-Modeste later headed against the bar.

A second-half double by Peter Antoniadis earned Cheshunt a 2-0 home win over Thamesmead in the division's other game.

Division One South

The first of the league's three potential title showdowns took place in Division One South on Saturday and the status quo was preserved as Metropolitan Police and Bognor drew 1-1 at Imber Court.

The Met stay on top but Bognor will be happier with the result, which keeps them a point behind with a game in hand. Next Saturday (9th April) sees the top two clash in the other divisions, with Sutton facing Bury in the Premier and East Thurrock hosting Needham Market in Division One North.

Bognor had to hang on in the early stages but a mistake by Met skipper Steve Sutherland allowed Jason Prior to nip in and give the visitors the lead just after the half-hour with his 26th league goal of the season and 32nd in all. The Police hit back midway through the second half through their top scorer Craig Watkins, who finished off a pass from Ty Smith to claim his 25th of the campaign, 18 of them in the league.

The draw also provided the pursuers with new hope. Whitehawk, despite having their leading scorer Josh Jones sent off ten minutes after half-time, rallied to beat Walton Casuals 1-0 at East Brighton Park, Sam Gargan converting Richard Carpenter's through ball. Hawks are

seven points behind the Met with a game in hand.

A further point back, and with one more game in hand, are Leatherhead. The Tanners struggled to break down lowly visitors Whitstable and took 72 minutes to open their account with a header by Tommy Hutchings from a Greg Andrews corner. Hutchings struck again with a deflected free-kick, his 25th of the season, and Kev Terry completed a 3-0 win.

That quartet will sort out the top four places among themselves and Burgess Hill, 13 points behind Leatherhead, took a big step towards landing the remaining play-off spot after their 3-2 victory at Whyteleafe. Danny Curd and influential recent signing Sonny Cobbs scored in the game's first quarter, with Lloyd Cotton adding a third eight minutes after the interval. They had a scare at the end; Kwabena Agyei and Stefane Gnamore scored in the last eight minutes and Leafe had a couple of chances to snatch an unlikely point.

It was not just that result that boosted the Hillians. They have a four-point advantage and at least one game in hand on all their rivals after the three clubs who were immediately behind them all lost.

Walton & Hersham were trailing at home to Chipstead with time running out, thanks to Ray Freeman's 53rd minute goal, but thought they had grabbed a lifeline when Bakary Bojang converted a retaken penalty in the 88th minute. Then a foul on Freeman allowed Chipstead the chance to grab a last-gasp winner from the spot and Jason Thompson made no mistake.

Ramsgate were also beaten, of which more in a moment, and Walton Casuals' loss has already been mentioned.

So Dulwich moved into seventh place, shaking off the disappointment of their midweek defeat in the Championship Manager Cup final with a 3-0 victory at Eastbourne. Mind you, their hero was not even with them for Wednesday's game. Gary Drewett was a deadline signing from Metropolitan Police on Thursday and he fired a second-half hat-trick. Dulwich may have left their run too late; they are five points behind Burgess Hill, whom they visit on Easter Saturday.

From the top end of the table to the bottom. Ramsgate's defeat came at Corinthian-Casuals, who looked doomed to relegation in mid-March. Since then they have gone five games unbeaten, winning three of them, and are up to 19th. Scott Hassell put them ahead on Saturday after 81 goalless minutes and Sam Robinson made it 2-0 with a penalty in added time, though he could not take the kick before Ramsgate duo Ollie Gray and Liam Quinn were given their marching orders.

The team who now have that sinking feeling are Chatham, three points adrift in 21st place. They must have thought they could end their nine-match winless run when they hosted bottom club Horsham YMCA on Saturday but instead the Sussex side collected their first away victory of the season with a 74th minute strike by Danny Dudley. That was some consolation for the fact that, to all intents and purposes, they became the first club to be relegated. They are 15 points adrift of 20th placed Whitstable and although maths says they can still escape, it would take a 47-goal swing even if they somehow close the points gap.

The Oystermen are only three points above Chatham, however, with Corinthian-Casuals and Eastbourne, two points better off, also still in danger if Chatham can rediscover their form.

Merstham were level with the latter pair at kick-off time but are almost safe after Harry Ottaway's 21st minute goal was enough to account for Godalming.

Darren Wheeler scored in the third and last minutes for Fleet at Faversham but his spread-out double was only worth a 2-2 draw. Tom Hickman equalised after 28 minutes and put Faversham ahead immediately after half-time.

Another two-goal man was Sittingbourne's Ryan Golding, who scored twice in five minutes either side of the half-hour as his side came from behind to win 2-1 at Worthing. Luke Gedling had given Rebels the lead.

Ryman Youth League

A four-goal salvo by Aaron Weston strengthened Staines Town's grip on first place in the Ryman Youth League's West Division as they won 6-1 at Barnet (Amber). He opened the scoring midway through the first half, which ended with Staines leading 3-1, and then fired

three more goals in the first six minutes after the interval.

Second-placed Woking suffered a setback to their title chances, the damage being done early in their 3-2 defeat at Hayes. Leo Cunningham, Nicke Kabamba and Joel Jacobs put the hosts 3-0 up in the game's first quarter and a Jack Mazzone double was not enough to rescue Woking.

A seventh-minute goal by Damilola Thomas was all Northwood needed for a 1-0 home win over Harrow which improved their chances of claiming the runners-up berth.

Two Bairoh Conteh goals set Ashford (Middx) on their way against Fleet, who replied through James McBride. There were only three minutes left when Mitchell Fountain clinched Ashford's 3-1 win.

A goal in each half by Marcus Harley earned Eastbourne Town their 2-0 victory at Lewes in the South-East Division. It was a second successive defeat for Lewes, who were previously unbeaten. Horsham YMCA celebrated their first win of the season, a surprise 2-0 success against Whitehawk. Alex Malins and Charlie Abrehart were on target against a side who were on top of the table when the week began.

Burgess Hill now lead the way after a 3-2 home victory over Maidstone. Tom Stillwell netted the winner after Stones had twice fought back to equalise. Sam Beale struck twice in the second half as Tonbridge beat Worthing 2-0 while Horsham drew 0-0 with Ashford (Kent).

Central Division champions Kingstonian finished their season by beating Whyteleafe 5-2 and they will be at least five points clear of the field in the final reckoning. Matt Robinson scored their first and fifth goals.

Thamesmead made a start worthy of the bottom club when they conceded a first-minute own goal in their match with Chipstead. But they bounced back to win 4-2 after Josh Wilson quickly levelled the scores and, although they remain at the foot of the table, they are only three points away from fourth place.

Free-scoring George Griffiths hit a hat-trick, including a first-minute strike, as Walton &

Hersham beat Carshalton 3-1 in the third round of the Lucas Fettes Youth Cup.

Sutton also romped through with a 4-0 victory at Hampton, Ben King scoring twice, while Welling needed penalties to put out Maidstone after a 1-1 draw.

The much-travelled Seb Schoburgh chalked up another move, joining Godalming from Billericay. Experienced striker Brian Haule moved from Hendon to Hornchurch.

Premier Division strugglers Aveley recruited Hussein Isa from Canvey and Chris Sullivan from Billericay, Robert Kember moved from Folkestone to Carshalton and Hastings keeper Scott Chalmers-Stevens joined Cray Wanderers.
