#### WEEKEND REVIEW

##### Premier Division

Sutton United moved to within touching distance of their fifth league title with a 2-1 win over second-placed Bury Town at Gander Green Lane on Saturday. There were five points between them going into the game and Sutton soon took charge of proceedings. Apart from a Chris Henderson effort that clipped a post, Bury were forced on to the back foot. They held out for 36 minutes before Andy Forbes headed home Darren Ebsworth's corner.

It was perhaps slim reward for a first-half display rated by manager Paul Doswell as his side's best of the season, and Henderson gave them another fright when he struck the bar just before the break. Two fine saves by Kevin Scriven and a goal-line clearance by Simon Downer foiled Bury as they upped their game after the interval, and Sutton gained precious breathing space when Craig Dundas made it 2-0 in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute.

He later hit a post before Kennedy Adjei conceded an 85<sup>th</sup> minute penalty which Sam Reed converted to give Bury late hope. Adjei was the hero in the end though, heading Jamie Scowcroft's shot off the line in the dying seconds. If Sutton win their home game against Hastings next Saturday, they will be crowned champions if Bury fail to collect maximum points at Cray 24 hours later.

With the title apparently beyond their grasp, Bury must be careful not to let their disappointment affect them because their play-

off place is by no means secure. Seven teams are within six points of them.

Closest are Harrow Borough, two points behind Bury in third place after their 2-0 home victory over Folkestone. For the second Saturday running it was Kenta Nakashima, soon returning to Japan, who was their hero. He scored from 35 yards shortly before the interval and lobbed the second eight minutes after the restart.

Saturday generally did little to clarify the race for post-season action, with most of the contenders winning, though Cray look to be out of the picture after their 2-1 defeat in a thrilling game at Kingstonian which dropped them to 11<sup>th</sup> place, seven points below fifth spot.

Although Tom Hutchinson's header gave K's a 16<sup>th</sup> minute lead, the first half belonged to Cray and they deserved no less than their 32<sup>nd</sup> minute equaliser from Danny Phillips. Simon Huckle converted a Tom Bird cross nine minutes after the interval to restore the home side's lead and, despite some heavy pressure from Cray, K's held out to remain where they started the day, ninth in the table but within two points of the play-off positions.

Most of the other contenders won, though Tonbridge Angels suffered a setback when they were held to a 3-3 home draw by Tooting & Mitcham United and slid from sixth to eighth. They have a game in hand on all the other contenders, though, and a victory at Hendon on Tuesday would restore them to the top five.

An early own goal by Danny Walder gave Tooting a good start and they went 2-0 up through James Pinnock in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute. That stirred the Angels into life and, thanks to a Frannie Collin free-kick and a close-range strike by Scott Kinch, they were level within seven minutes. The home fans began to relax when Ade Olorunda put them ahead after 63 minutes but Terry Dixon squared it again three minutes later and Reece Hall almost won it for the Terrors with a shot that Lee Worgan tipped on to the bar.

Canvey Island remained fourth with a 1-0 victory at Maidstone. Rob King volleyed his 20<sup>th</sup> goal of the season soon after half-time and the islanders held out despite the late dismissal of full-back Ashley Dumas.

Lowestoft won 2-0 at Croydon Athletic to stay in fifth place. A deflected shot by Adrian Forbes put the Trawlerboys ahead just before the half-hour mark and their constant pressure eventually produced a clinching goal 12 minutes from time by Lubo Guentchev, his first since his move from Hendon.

Essex duo Concord and Billericay moved above Tonbridge and remained a point behind Lowestoft. Concord are sixth after their 2-0 home win over Horsham. Tony Stokes, who had already hit a post, put them ahead five minutes before the interval from a cross by Gary Ogilvie. The roles were reversed as Stokes provided the second for Ogilvie in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute. There is every chance that goal difference will come into the picture at the end of the season so Concord may yet regret the superb save by Mark Zawadski to keep out a late penalty by Harry Elmes.

The much-travelled Tony Boot has scored several valuable goals since joining Billericay in February and he did it again on Saturday, finding the net with a neat header two minutes after half-time to see off visitors Aveley in a rehearsal for the Essex Senior Cup final at Thurrock on Monday evening.

Completing the contenders are AFC Hornchurch, four points adrift of the play-offs in tenth place. They may need to win all their remaining games to stay in the hunt and their chances of doing so were much improved as they ended a recent goal famine by beating visiting Carshalton 4-0. They again struggled to create chances in the first half but Jonathan Hunt's perfect free-kick in added time broke

the deadlock. Lewis Smith came off the bench to inspire Urchins in the second half when he played a part in all three goals. So did Martin Tuohy, who scored two of them and, in between, had a shot cleared off the line for Frankie Curley to finish.

It was a bad day for clubs in trouble. The bottom four all lost to promotion-chasing opposition as already recorded. So did Horsham, who dropped to 18<sup>th</sup>, four points ahead of Aveley who now seem to be the only team with any real chance of escape. Maidstone and Croydon are six points away from safety, Folkestone seven, and time is running out.

Hastings, though, moved closer to retaining Premier status for next season. While all their rivals lost, they beat Margate 3-0 at the Pilot Field to move above Horsham and six points clear of Aveley. They might have scored several times before Kenny Pogue put them ahead on 32 minutes. Defender Josh Jirbandey claimed his first goal of the season on the stroke of half-time and Ben Billings wrapped it up in added time at the end of the match.

Wes Parker scored six minutes after half-time to give Wealdstone a 1-0 victory at Hendon in the only 'meaningless' game in the division.

### **Division One North**

East Thurrock United took a huge step towards the Division One North championship with a 2-1 victory over their only rivals, Needham Market, at Rookery Hill on Saturday. Kris Newby hit the winner as Rocks, desperate to avoid the play-offs after semi-final defeats in the last two years, opened up a six-point lead with four matches left.

The game got off to an explosive start with two goals in the first six minutes. Ryan Sammons drilled home a rare goal to give the hosts a third-minute lead but the Marketmen responded by forcing three successive corners, from the third of which Craig Parker headed home. It was his 37<sup>th</sup> goal of the season and he became the first man to reach the 30-goal mark in League matches alone.

Chances came thick and fast at both ends and it was Rocks who converted one in the 35<sup>th</sup> minute, when Max Cornhill set up Newby's 27<sup>th</sup> of the season. It proved enough as Needham were unable to convert their second-half

pressure into clear chances. They were reduced to ten men in the 84<sup>th</sup> minute when Pip Boyland was sent off and, although keeper Danny Gay made up the numbers with several charges into the opposition penalty area at set pieces, Rocks held out.

Brentwood are a distant third, 15 points behind the Marketmen, but are three points away from clinching their own play-off spot after a 2-0 victory at Romford. Steve Butterworth opened the scoring five minutes before half-time and Leon Fisher made the most of a defensive muddle to head the second in the 55<sup>th</sup> minute. Romford slumped three places to 12<sup>th</sup>, effectively ending their promotion challenge.

Harlow and Wingate & Finchley strengthened their hold on the other two play-off slots. Steve Ferguson's 15<sup>th</sup> minute goal was enough to give Harlow all three points at home to Tilbury while Wingate edged out Cheshunt 2-1. Lewis Smith put Wingate ahead after five minutes and Gary Burrell volleyed home to make it 2-0 just after the hour. Sam Byles pulled one back in the 72<sup>nd</sup> minute but Wingate held out.

They are four points clear of sixth-placed AFC Sudbury, who may well rue their failure to convert a 3-1 half-time lead into a home win over bottom club Waltham Forest. Richard Shittu, recently signed from Godalming, scored his first Forest goal to give them a 32<sup>nd</sup> minute lead but that merely provoked a Sudbury goal rush. James Baker equalised, becoming the 11<sup>th</sup> player to reach 20 league goals this season, and in the next seven minutes Daniel Emmanuel and Dave Wareham put the hosts in command. Or so they thought. Josh Bonnett gave Forest new hope eight minutes after half-time and Rob Carter made it 3-3 in the dying moments.

Forest's delight lasted only as long as it took them to learn that landlords Ilford had beaten Potters Bar 1-0 at Cricklefield. Nathan Gordon scored the all-important goal seven minutes before half-time and it left Forest six points adrift at the foot of the table.

Back at the top of the table, Maldon & Tiptree were without a game but remained seventh because Enfield Town were beaten by a last-minute goal at lowly Ware. Ryan Wade's header gave Ware the lead nine minutes into the second half but Enfield, desperate for points to stay in the race, levelled through

Liam Hope with ten minutes left. It was Ware who snatched a 2-1 win, however, as teenager Leigh Rose nabbed his first senior goal to leave Enfield six points adrift of Wingate.

Two points further back are Heybridge and Grays, who both won away but have surely left their challenges too late. Heybridge fell behind after 26 minutes at Redbridge when Craig Arnott scored. Reece Morgan quickly replied and then put Swifts ahead in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute. It became a convincing 4-1 margin with late strikes from Chris Bryan and Michael Marsh.

Jason Fontaine netted twice in the first 24 minutes for Grays at Thamesmead and 2-0 was how it finished.

In the other game, Toran Senghore maintained his free-scoring form since joining Great Wakering from Romford with a 13<sup>th</sup> minute opener at Waltham Abbey. Tyler Campbell replied with two goals in six minutes towards the end of the first half and Abbey won 2-1.

### **Division One South**

A goal by Dan Royce earned Bognor Regis Town a 1-0 home win over Whyteleafe on Saturday and maintained their two-point lead over Met Police at the top of Division One South. There were 41 points between the sides at kick-off time but little between them on the pitch and Rocks were relieved to finish on top thanks to Royce's close-range strike from a Ben Johnson cross in the 56<sup>th</sup> minute.

Metropolitan Police also had their problems at Fleet, who had several chances to take the lead in the first half. But former Fleet man Eddie Smith grabbed a goal on the stroke of half-time and Craig Watkins completed a 2-0 Met victory after 65 minutes to keep the title race wide open.

Whitehawk's hopes of challenging the leading pair look over after they were held to a 2-2 draw at Ramsgate, who twice took the lead in the first half through Mark Lovell and Stuart Vahid, with Liam Quinn's own goal providing Whitehawk's reply. Hawks upped their game after the break but could manage only an equalising header by Ben Godfrey in the 83<sup>rd</sup> minute.

Hawks are six points behind the Met and two ahead of Leatherhead, who have a game in hand. The pair are likely to clash in the play-

off semi-finals and home advantage may not be settled until their rehearsal meeting at Whitehawk on the last day of the season.

Leatherhead were the day's top scorers, powering to a 5-0 victory at Walton Casuals. Tommy Hutchings gave them the lead with his 20<sup>th</sup> league goal after 27 minutes and Casuals were then stunned as Tanners made it 4-0 by half-time. Mark Simmons and Jack MacLeod hit the target before Hutchings got his second with a penalty. Mu Maan completed the rout midway through the second half.

A remarkable ending to the game at Burgess Hill means that the top four are all now certain of a play-off place at least, and Leatherhead's nap hand means that they are also the four highest scorers in the league. They all have a chance of reaching 100 goals, which would be a unique feat. Never in the league's 106-year history have four clubs from the same division reached a century.

What happened at Burgess Hill? Well, very little until the 90<sup>th</sup> minute, when Fabio Saraiva scored for Merstham to put a dent in Hillians' promotion bid. Or did it? Lloyd Cotton hit back for the hosts two minutes into added time and there was still time for one more goal. But it was Leon McDowall who scored it to give Merstham a 2-1 win, a scoreline which will come as a considerable shock to spectators who drifted away before the end.

Burgess Hill's fifth place was not under immediate threat but they now lead Walton & Hersham by a single point after the Swans won 3-0 at Sittingbourne. The young home side have done remarkably well to stay on the fringe of the play-off battle but this was surely the end of the line for them, especially as they have only three games left. James Nicholls opened the scoring after 38 minutes and the outcome was settled by two goals in five minutes either side of the hour, from Kieran Knight and Jean Michel Sigere.

Hillians have a game in hand on Walton but they will use that up on Tuesday when they face a testing visit from Leatherhead, after which both contenders will have four matches left.

It looks as if it will be a straight fight between them for the final play-off place after all the other hopefuls dropped points on Saturday. Walton Casuals and Ramsgate have already

been mentioned, and Dulwich's late challenge seems over after their 2-1 home defeat by Worthing. It looked good for the hosts when veteran defender Francis Duku – a Premier Division play-off finalist with Kingstonian last year – put them ahead after only three minutes. John Lansdale equalised before the interval and his corner provided the winner for Terry Dodd midway through the second half.

At the other end of the table, 21<sup>st</sup> placed Chatham wasted a golden chance to boost their survival hopes when they went down 2-1 at ten-man Whitstable. The Oystermen were short-handed from as early as the 15<sup>th</sup> minute, when James Peacock was dismissed.

It looked as if Chatham would profit when an intended cross by Kane Rice found its way into the net in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute to give them the lead. But Gareth Cornhill levelled it with ten minutes left and Dan Wisker struck shortly afterwards to give the hosts a crucial 2-1 victory. Chatham would have caught them if they had held on to their lead; as it is, Whitstable moved above Corinthian-Casuals who are in turn five points clear of Chatham despite a 3-1 defeat at Chipstead.

Ray Freeman and the excellent Kofi Quartey gave Chipstead a 2-0 lead which was reduced by Joel Thompson with six minutes left. But Chipstead's own Thompson, Jason, wrapped it up with a last-minute penalty.

Eastbourne's slight fears are almost over after Sam Crabb's 66<sup>th</sup> minute goal earned them all three points at Godalming but Horsham YMCA's inevitable relegation was put beyond even mathematical doubt as they went down 1-0 at home to Faversham. Julian Ascheri's lob early in the second half settled it, and YM's gloom was completed by a red card for Zak Henry.

### **Ryman Youth League**

There were six games in the West Division of the Ryman Youth League this week – and four of them featured hat-tricks.

Staines remained four points clear of Woking at the top, with a game in hand, after their 6-2 home win over Fleet. An even first half ended 2-2 as Fleet twice drew level, but Mario Quiassaca's second goal of the game, a penalty immediately after half-time, sparked a burst of three goals in four minutes. He completed the scoring, and his own treble, in

the last minute. It took Quiassaca's tally for the season to 17 goals, making him the league's top scorer. But not for long.

One night later it was Romaine Walker's turn to hit a hat-trick as Northwood romped to a 5-1 win at Barnet (Black). He netted two of their four first-half goals to reclaim the leadership and added his 19<sup>th</sup> of the season in the closing stages.

Woking's Jack Mazzone scored the most important threesome. A goal up at half-time, they found themselves 2-1 down at Ashford (Middx) after Charles Gerson netted twice in the first ten minutes of the second period. Mazzone levelled it again in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute, put his side ahead in the 74<sup>th</sup> and notched his third, and 15<sup>th</sup> of the season, with five minutes left.

The week's fourth hat-trick hero was Hayes forward George Isaac. He opened his account with a seventh-minute penalty and, after visitors Barnet (Black) drew level, he struck twice more in the last five minutes of the first half. Doubles by Nicke Kabamba and Ryan Simpson made it 7-2 to Hayes.

Walker failed to add to his tally in Northwood's other game, a 1-0 victory at Harrow. Nathan McLeod was the marksman six minutes after the interval. Harrow were beaten again at Hampton, 3-1 the margin this time. Matthew Warren got Hampton under way with a 20th-minute strike.

The recent story in the South-East Division is the slump of defending champions Lewes. They lost only once last season and were firm favourites to finish on top again after going unbeaten in their first 11 games. Since then, though, they have lost four in a row, including two this week.

Carl Schaaf gave them a half-time lead at home to Ashford (Kent), who hit back through Josh Knight, Harry Goddard and Dexter Gondongwe to win 3-1.

Knight scored twice in the return match two days later but Lewes thought they had grabbed a point with a Harry Bowles penalty in the 90<sup>th</sup> minute. Then Kaosi Ebenebe struck four minutes into added time and Ashford won 3-2, doubling their total of victories for the season in just over 48 hours.

Leaders Burgess Hill were another team to play twice in the week and they came from behind in the latter stages of both games to collect four points. They trailed for most of their game at Eastbourne to a second-minute goal by Shane Fox. Kit Tregear equalised in the 72<sup>nd</sup> minute and Josh Fawssett won it five minutes later.

The young Hillians made it even harder for themselves at Welling, finding themselves 2-0 down after an hour. Tregear again opened his side's scoring with 15 minutes left and Marcus Collier hit a last-gasp leveller.

Whitehawk are three points behind their Sussex rivals, both sides having four games left including a potential title decider when Hillians visit Whitehawk on April 28. Hawks also had to come from behind after Jack Simon scored his 15<sup>th</sup> of the season for hosts Maidstone in the 37<sup>th</sup> minute. Matt Daniel and Alain Multini turned it round with two goals in four minutes midway through the second half and Daniel, who started the season with Burgess Hill, made it 3-1 with a penalty.

Bottom club Horsham YMCA continued their revival with a 2-0 derby win at home to Horsham, reducing the gap between them to three points with YM having a game in hand. Sam Bulley and Charlie Abrehart got their goals.

It completed a bad week for Horsham who had earlier gone down 4-1 at home to Tonbridge. Jack Leighton scored twice for the Angels. The other match in the division was a 1-0 home win for Worthing over Welling thanks to Jack Boxall's 72<sup>nd</sup> minute penalty.

It was a quiet week in the Central Division where only two games were played, with Sutton the visitors in both of them.

They were contrasting affairs, too. In the first of them, at Carshalton, neither side could manage a goal but at Met Police three days later Sutton took less than a minute to find a way through, Terance Polson netting. Josh Lewis equalised and Louis John restored Sutton's lead, all in the first 12 minutes. Sutton were reduced to ten men by a red card just before the half-hour but it was they who scored again to run out 3-1 winners, Jonte Smith the marksman in the 67<sup>th</sup> minute.
