WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

Sutton United are Ryman League champions for the fifth time after Bury Town, their last possible challengers, were beaten 2-1 at Cray on Sunday. And the Suffolk side now face a battle to stay in the play-off places, having slipped from second to fourth while they spent an idle Saturday.

Bury had won the Suffolk Premier Cup on Friday night, beating Needham Market 2-0 thanks to a Sam Reed double, and maybe that game had an effect on them because they were thoroughly outplayed by a Cray side missing several key men, not least the Premier Division's top scorer Laurent Hamici.

With Sutton manager Paul Doswell and plenty of fans from Gander Green Lane looking on hopefully, Cray took charge from the start. Leigh Bremner hit a post from a tight angle in the 13th minute and they went ahead seven minutes later when John Guest spun to fire home in the scramble following a corner.

Bury had to win to keep the title race alive but the game turned decisively against them during a dramatic conclusion to the first half. In the 45th minute Sam Reed worked himself some space in the box but before he could pull the trigger he was superbly tackled by Aaron Day. The ball ran loose to Lee Reed, whose fierce drive was beaten away by home keeper Dave King and, a matter of a few seconds later, Bremner made it 2-0 with a brilliant finish at the other end.

Worse was to follow for Bury before the interval when veteran James Scowcroft was dismissed for allegedly using his elbow in a challenge.

The visitors looked thoroughly disheartened as they emerged for a second half that was largely a non-event, although Cray remained on top. Bury did manage a goal by Kieran Leabon but it was by then the third minute of added time and they had no chance to snatch a point, let alone score the two more goals they would have needed to delay Sutton's celebrations for at least six days.

Sutton did their part on Saturday by beating Hastings 2-1 at Gander Green Lane. They looked edgy and it was the 33rd minute before Leroy Griffiths put them ahead. They doubled their lead when Sean Ray brought down Craig

Dundas in the 54th minute and Andy Forbes made it 2-0 from the penalty spot with his last kick of the match; he was immediately replaced by Richard Jolly.

Hastings had shown little ambition thus far but they came out of their shell and Harry Beautyman raced clear to pull one back after 62 minutes. Sutton had the upper hand for the rest of the game but Hastings launched enough promising attacks to have the home supporters biting their nails until referee Tony Power put them out of their misery.

The crowd of 1,552, boosted by a 'Fun Day' for kids in association with the Metropolitan Police, was the league's highest of the season though Sutton hope to top it for their Easter Monday derby with Carshalton, while Lowestoft's all-important Suffolk derby against Bury on the same day also looks likely to attract a massive gate.

Tonbridge are second after their 4-0 home win over Carshalton, who held out until the last minute of the first half when Carl Rook made the breakthrough. Ade Olorunda doubled the lead early in the second half and Adrian Stone volleyed two late goals, his first since his switch from Maidstone.

Without Stone's goals it would have been Canvey in second place on goal difference. As it is, they are third, four goals better off than Bury, after beating Hornchurch 3-0 on the island. Leon Gordon put them ahead after 27 minutes and the game was settled in the 70th minute, when visiting keeper Darren Behcet was sent off for upending Gordon and Rob King drove the resultant spot-kick past defender Elliot Styles, who had taken over between the posts. It was King's fourth such success against Urchins this season; he netted a penalty hat-trick in the previous meeting. Danny Heale made it three with eight minutes left and Hornchurch's play-off bid is over barring an extraordinary sequence of results in the last three rounds of matches.

Lowestoft returned to the top five by sending Harrow back to London on the wrong end of a 3-0 scoreline. Andrew Cave-Brown's first goal of the season on 25 minutes set the Trawlerboys on course and Joe Francis grabbed another eight minutes later. Lubo Guentchev completed the scoring eight minutes from time and Harrow, who started the day hoping to take over second spot, instead

slid three places to sixth and out of the play-offs.

They are a point behind Lowestoft, with Kingstonian a further point adrift. Tom Bird's free-kick midway through the second half gave K's the lead at home to Folkestone but it was the fifth minute of added time before Dean Lodge clinched a 2-0 victory which means that Folkestone return to Division One South after only one season in the Premier.

The side who came up with them as Division One South champions, Croydon Athletic, are also returning whence they came unless they can make up nine points and 35 goals on Hastings in their last three games, which seems unlikely. Croydon went down to a lone goal in the 66th minute by Jamie Byatt for visiting Tooting, with Danny Elgar's penalty miss denying the Rams an equaliser.

Maidstone kept their slender survival hopes alive with a 2-0 home victory over Concord, an upset not just because Concord were chasing a play-off place but because it was Maidstone's first victory of the season at their borrowed Ashford base despite the fact that they have chalked up six wins on the road. Their previous 19 games at the Homelands had yielded just five draws among 14 defeats; no wonder they plan to move to Sittingbourne next season. Tony Stokes hit the bar for Concord before Dean Stubbs gave Stones the lead just after the half-hour. Laurence Harvey made sure with eight minutes left.

Stones, though, remain six points behind Hastings and prospects for the other side in the bottom four, Aveley, are little better. Their hopes rose when Kenny Beaney gave them the lead with a 62nd minute penalty at home to Margate, but Tom Bradbrook equalised six minutes later and it finished 1-1.

Horsham had made almost sure of survival in the day's early kick-off, putting their poor recent form behind them to hit three unanswered goals at Hendon. Jamie Brotherton got the first after 20 minutes, opening his account for the club after his move from Whitehawk. The hosts had James Burgess sent off just before half-time and Greg Ngoyi had a penalty saved by Horsham keeper Mark Zawadski immediately after the restart. Strikes by Jamie Cade and Paul Kennett in the last ten minutes clinched an important victory for Horsham and made it a happy day for Gary

Charman, who was making his 500th appearance for the club.

Wealdstone beat Billericay 1-0 at Grosvenor Vale thanks to a superb long-range strike by Peter Dean in the 23rd minute and Billericay, like Essex rivals Concord, find themselves four points short of the play-offs and in danger of losing touch. They also had defender Chris Wild dismissed so he will miss their final game of the season.

Division One North

Six points adrift at the bottom with three games to go, Waltham Forest look doomed to relegation from Division One North. But they are determined to go in style, having scored seven goals away from home on the last two Saturdays.

Sadly for them, their efforts have earned only one point, from a 3-3 draw at Sudbury. Yesterday they almost wiped out a 5-2 half-time deficit at Waltham Abbey but ran out of time after pulling it back to 5-4.

Emmanuel Osei starred for Abbey with a hat-trick in the first 36 minutes, completed from the spot. Louis Bristow also scored in that time, while Billy Healey had equalised for Forest shortly after Osei's early opener. The visitors closed the gap through Joel Palmer three minutes before half-time, only for Tyler Campbell to respond with Abbey's fifth. Josh Bonnett pulled it back to 5-3 on the hour and struck again with a penalty after an offence for which Jack Daveney was dismissed. But by then it was the 90th minute.

At the other end of the table, Hakeem Araba's double salvaged a home point for East Thurrock against third-placed Brentwood. Defender Darren Blewitt, in prolific scoring form lately, put Brentwood ahead after 19 minutes and Sos Yao doubled the lead ten minutes after the interval. Araba, who had missed a great chance to make it 1-1, opened his account three minutes after Yao's strike and headed home Joe Keith's corner to equalise with 18 minutes left.

Rocks are now seven points clear - their only possible rivals for the title, Needham Market, had the day off - and need to win one of their last three to be sure of promotion.

Brentwood also need one win, in their case from two games, to secure a play-off berth.

Harlow and Wingate are favourites to join them. Wingate & Finchley did not play on Saturday and Harlow climbed above them into fourth place with a 2-1 home win over Heybridge. Bertie Brayley volleyed them into a half-time lead and, after Luke Callander's 65th-minute leveller, Lee Roache quickly netted the winner.

Wingate themselves have a four-point cushion but the four clubs behind them all won to keep their hopes alive. AFC Sudbury, who are sixth, beat Great Wakering 4-0. It took them an hour to open the scoring through James Baker but they ran away with it after that with a couple from Dubi Ogbonna and a late Baker penalty after Ogbonna had been felled.

Alex Osborn followed up his five-goal haul in Grays' 9-0 midweek trouncing of Cheshunt with a headed 47th minute opener at Ilford. Eljay Worrell completed a 2-0 win which keeps Grays a point behind Sudbury, though they have played one game more than the teams around them.

They include Maldon & Tiptree, who trail Grays on goal difference after beating visitors Romford 2-0. Paul Kavanagh missed a penalty for Boro in the first half and was made to suffer as Chris Chase and Joe Sweeney netted in the first 14 minutes after the break.

The other side still cherishing distant play-off hopes, one point further back, are Enfield Town. They took a third-minute lead through Liam Hope at Thamesmead and added another goal in each half to finish 3-0 up, Richard Morton and Adam Wallace the marksmen. Rudi Hall had a chance to make it four in the last minute but Sam Mott saved his penalty.

Redbridge and Ware became officially safe from relegation with away victories which lifted them both three places in the table. Manlee Brown gave Redbridge the lead in the 12th minute at Cheshunt; ominously, the same time at which Grays opened their account in Wednesday's massacre. Motormen, though, added only two more, second-half efforts from Kyle Fraser-Allen and Julian Edwards, and Cheshunt made it 3-1 with a last-minute header from Peter Antoniadis.

Ware's top scorer Ryan Wade gave them the lead on the hour at Tilbury and struck again five minutes later to complete a 2-0 win. Ben

Boyce almost pulled one back with a volley that hit the bar.

Division One South

Corinthian-Casuals gave manager Brian Adamson the perfect tonic as he recovers from a heart operation. They all but secured their Division One South place yesterday (Saturday) by thrashing fifth-placed Burgess Hill 4-0 at Tolworth.

The crucial moment came a minute from the end of a goalless first half, when Danny Curd hit a Casuals post from close range. Had Hillians netted a morale-boosting goal then it might have been a very different outcome. Glenn Boosey gave Casuals the lead in the 56th minute, after a kick by keeper Tom Betts, but there was no hint of the decisive final scoreline until a rush of goals in the last 14 minutes from Joel Thompson, James Cottee and Robert Stevenson.

With Walton & Hersham, a point behind Burgess Hill in sixth place, crashing by the same margin at Bognor (see below), the play-off race is wide open again.

Dulwich are right back in the hunt, two points behind Hillians, after a 5-2 home win over doomed Chatham. They have their fate entirely in their own hands. If they win their last three they will certainly finish fifth, for they visit Burgess Hill and Walton on the last two Saturdays. Nobody said it would be easy.

It was not that easy on Saturday, despite the scoreline. Rob Gradwell's fourth-minute header was all Dulwich could manage in the first half and Brad Potter equalised just before the break. The hosts again scored early in the second half through Dean Carpenter and Malvin Kamara made it 3-1 before Joe Fuller replied. It was not until added time that goals by Gerry Gonnella and Kamara clinched it and snuffed out any realistic survival hopes for Chatham, eight points adrift of Casuals with only nine to play for.

Ramsgate and Sittingbourne, who both had the afternoon off, still have some hope of making the play-offs, respectively four and five points adrift of Burgess Hill, and Faversham are also five back after a goal 13 minutes from time by Dean Grant gave them a 1-0 home win over Whyteleafe.

Meanwhile, the free-scoring top four marched inexorably on by a collective margin of 14-3 and only Leatherhead had a serious fright.

The Tanners fell behind to a 34th minute goal by Darren Wheeler for visiting Fleet and there were only six minutes left when Sol Patterson-Bohner made it 1-1. Then Greg Andrews fired home a free-kick for a last-gasp winner, his 30th league goal of the season.

That put him level with Needham's Craig Parker in the golden boot race and, in fact, there is a triple tie after Bognor's James Prior also reached 30 with a hat-trick as the leaders beat Walton & Hersham 4-0 at Nyewood Lane.

It took 42 minutes for their pressure to pay off but then they struck twice in less than 60 seconds with Luke Nightingale laying on Prior's first before scoring himself. Prior made it 3-0 on 56 minutes and at that stage, with Met Police 2-1 up in their game, the top two had identical goal figures of 93-41. A missed penalty almost cost Prior his hat-trick but he completed it in the 89th minute.

Metropolitan Police remained two points behind but edged their goal difference ahead – and that could yet prove vital - with a 4-1 win at Walton Casuals. It was Casuals who scored first through Kofi Lockhart-Adams but James Field levelled within a minute and James Greenaway put the Police ahead with a thumping header just before half-time. Eddie Smith, with another header, stretched the lead on 63 minutes and Craig Watkins added the fourth.

Leatherhead and Whitehawk, a point behind them in fourth place, still have a chance, on paper, of catching the top two but they can realistically prepare to meet in a play-off semi-final. Hawks are one short of a century of goals in their Ryman debut season after a 4-1 victory at Merstham. Dan Harding conjured a quick reply to Sam Gargan's headed opener for the visitors but Ben Godfrey put Hawks ahead to stay before the interval, Gargan added a penalty and former Horsham marksman Pat Harding claimed the fourth, his first since his transfer.

So dominant are the top four that Burgess Hill, in fifth place, are two points closer to Corinthian-Casuals, in 20th, than they are to Whitehawk.

At the other end of the table, a 2-2 home draw with Chipstead was not enough for Horsham YMCA to avoid clinching the wooden spoon. Zak Henry put YM ahead on 19 minutes and the rest of the goals came in a seven-minute burst shortly before half-time. Ray Freeman and Kofi Quartey gave Chipstead a lead which was soon wiped out on spectacular fashion by Hugh Sammuels, who netted with a free-kick from his own half.

Worthing's visit to Godalming produced the same result in much the same fashion. Rishi Nankani put the hosts ahead, Terry Dodd hit back with two goals in five minutes and James Evans made it 2-2 in the 41st minute.

Ian Pulman gave Whitstable a half-time lead at Eastbourne with his 25th goal of the season and they went on to win 2-1. Tim Rivers equalised soon after half-time but Whitstable were awarded a penalty a minute later and Scott Heard obliged. The Oystermen had Lloyd Blackman sent off with ten minutes left but they held out.

Ryman Youth League

It has been a good week for Staines Town in the Ryman Youth League. They reached the Lucas Fettes Cup semi-finals on Monday with a 2-1 victory at Tonbridge and, two days later, romped to a 4-0 home win over Hampton which took them seven points clear at the top of the West Division.

First-half goals by Conor O'Brien and Dominic Ogun saw them through in the cup and they will now visit Redbridge, who came from behind to beat Welling 3-1. Their equaliser came from Glenn O'Hanlon, who had the previous week lifted the English Schools Under-18 Trophy as captain of Barking Abbey, a school with which Redbridge have developed strong links.

Abbey, the holders, became the first school to win the competition three times outright since it began in 1996. In the final at Hillsborough they scored two unanswered goals to see off Monkseaton, from Northumberland, who had previously had two successes and shared the trophy once. Monkseaton are also the only other school to have lifted the trophy twice running.

Two goals from the prolific George Griffiths booked Woking's place in the last four of the Lucas Fettes Cup with a 2-1 win over Northwood, who scored first through Jordan

Douglas, and the young Swans will entertain Sutton, who defeated Lewes 2-0. Ben King and Michael Bello were their marksmen.

Staines' league victory, in which free-scoring Mario Quiassaca netted the opening goal, gained added value when their nearest rivals dropped points to lowly opposition. Woking, in second place, were beaten by a lone Ricardo Morais goal for Barnet (Amber) and Northwood, who are third, were held to a 3-3 draw at Fleet. Zain Khan scored a late equaliser for Northwood, who had fought back to level terms from 2-2 down but went behind again when Matt Robson struck 12 minutes from time. Unbeaten Staines need five points from four games to be sure of the title.

Fleet also drew with Barnet (Black) in a battle of the bottom two. James McBride put Fleet 2-1 up with nine minutes left but Taylor Young-Chambers equalised in the last minute as Barnet avoided defeat for only the second time this season. They remained at the foot of the table on goal difference before Fleet edged a point clear with their draw against Northwood.

The other game in the division brought a comfortable 3-0 win for Ashford (Middx) at Harrow, where Conor Moody opened the scoring.

South-East Division leaders Burgess Hill were without a game but their position was reinforced as nearest rivals Whitehawk were held to a 2-2 draw at Lewes, leaving Hillians two points ahead with a game in hand. Hawks averted defeat when Jesse Whyte notched his second of the game with five minutes left.

A first-half goal from Shaun Charles gave Worthing a 1-0 victory at Ashford (Kent) and lifted them to fourth in the table, overtaking Maidstone and Tonbridge who both lost.

Lewis Scally and Josh Clack did the trick for Horsham in a 2-1 win at Maidstone, who had gone ahead through Jack Simon, while Nathan Guy, Luke Ticehurst and Bryce Masters were on target for Eastbourne as they edged out Tonbridge 3-2.

Two games in the Central Division yielded only one goal, by Carshalton's Darren Bryan. It provided a home win over Leatherhead and kept Robins in the hunt for the runners-up spot. Thamesmead drew 0-0 with Walton & Hersham.
