RYMAN WOMENS CUP FINAL

Enfield Town completed a hat-trick of Ryman Women's Cup triumphs as a last-gasp goal by Shelley Forster earned them a 2-1 victory over Eastbourne Town in Wednesday's final at Aveley.

It was a repeat of the 2010 final, which Enfield won with a lone 11th minute goal by Sheree Oliver. And for some time it seemed as if it would be an exact repeat, for it was Oliver who opened the scoring in the eighth minute. Her intended cross hit a post and, with the Eastbourne defence slow to react, she was able to collect the rebound and fire home from 18 yards.

You felt that they could have halted proceedings at that point and handed the trophy to Enfield, for their goalscoring record in the three years they have taken part in the competition now stood at an amazing 52-0.

Just as they did last year, Eastbourne gradually came more into the game and Lucianne Johnson almost equalised midway through the first half with a shot that flew narrowly wide.

And they did draw level on the hour. A long-range effort by Kelly Hunter deceived Kerrie Marlborough in the Enfield goal and that proud three-year shut-out record was over at last.

The pace of Abdalla and Jacey Samson caused the Enfield defence further problems but, although Eastbourne had most of the possession, most of their attacks broke down without a clear chance being created.

And it was Enfield who snatched victory when, with extra time looming, the ball rebounded kindly off a defender into the path of Forster, who was able to find the net with ease.

Eastbourne will consider themselves unlucky to have lost after again playing their full part in an entertaining final. Maybe it will be third time lucky for them in 2012. For the moment they can turn their attention to achieving a double in the South-East League. They play in the League Cup final on Sunday and need a victory seven days later to clinch the league title for the first time.

Enfield have had a disappointing league campaign but reached the last 16 of the FA Women's Cup before losing to West Ham.

The trophies were presented by the Ryman League's Secretary designate Kellie Discipline.

WEEKEND REVIEW

Premier Division

While a six-point Easter weekend put champions Sutton 14 points clear at the top of the Premier Division and ensured that, for the third successive year, the title will be won by a double-figure margin, all was chaos and confusion in the play-off race behind them.

Goals by Richard Jolly, his 21st in the Premier this season, and Fola Orilonishe gave Sutton a 2-0 victory at Folkestone on Saturday and they followed up with their tenth successive home win on Monday, seeing off Carshalton by the same margin in front of 1,367 at Gander Green Lane. Orilonishe and Bradley Woods-Garness were the marksmen this time.

The goings-on behind them were perhaps best summarised by Monday's game at Canvey. Another four-figure crowd, 1,163, turned out to see them host island rivals Concord, with both clubs still in the play-off hunt. It turned out to be a decisive victory for Concord. Two goals from Tony Stokes and one apiece from Steve King and Michael Begg earned them a 4-0 win over a Canvey side who had Jason Hallett

sent off before half-time and Jay Curran red-carded in the second half.

Yet, when the Easter dust had settled, it was Canvey who remained in the race while results elsewhere ended Concord's hopes. It did not help them that they had been beaten 1-0 at home by relegation-threatened Aveley on Good Friday, Orlando Smith scoring after two minutes. Canvey drew a weekend blank, having lost to a lone Sonny Ayres goal at Carshalton on Saturday.

Of the teams still in play-off contention before the weekend, Cray were alone in picking up six points. They won 3-0 at Tooting on Friday, where Laurent Hamici's 22nd league goal of the season kept him just ahead in the race for Premier scoring honours, and a Leigh Bremner double produced a 2-0 home win over Margate on Monday. Despite that, there will be no glory for Cray in their 150th anniversary season. The play-offs are now out of their reach.

Billericay also dropped out of contention. They suffered a shock 2-1 home defeat by Croydon on Friday despite taking an early lead through Harrison Chatting. Tommy Whitnell got Croydon's late winner. The Essex side still had slight hope, but it vanished on Monday. A win would not have helped, as it turned out, but they were held to a 1-1 draw at Hendon. Adam Flanagan, who skippered Dartford to the title last season, put them ahead with an early penalty but Jamie Busby replied.

So six teams remain in contention for the four play-off places. Tonbridge and Bury have 73 points, Lowestoft and Harrow 72, and they can all make sure of a play-off spot by winning on Saturday. Last season's play-off finalists Kingstonian, on 71, and Canvey, on 70, can only hope for a chance to pounce. None of those teams managed more than four points at the weekend and only two of them avoided at least one defeat.

Harrow, who went into the weekend sixth, moved up to third on Saturday as Rocky Baptiste and Danny Hart earned them a 2-0 home win in a crunch clash with Tonbridge, who dropped back to fourth as a result. Then Harrow slid to fifth when they were held 1-1 at fierce rivals Wealdstone on Monday. Lee Chappell gave Stones an early lead and Baptiste levelled with a penalty just after half-time, his 20th league goal.

Kingstonian marksman Bobby Traynor reached 21 with a pair of penalties. One gave his side a 1-1 draw at Hornchurch on Friday after Elliot Styles had given Urchins a first-minute lead; his second contributed to Monday's 4-2 home win over Tooting. Paul Vines scored twice and Tom Hutchinson also netted, while Billy Crook and Geoff Pitcher, with a penalty, were on target for the Terrors.

Despite Saturday's defeat, Tonbridge are back in second place thanks to goals by Danny Walder and Sam Jones which provided a 2-0 home win over Hastings on Monday.

Bury were, until the Sunday before last, the only side who could have stopped Sutton's march to the title but by Saturday night they were out of the play-off spots altogether after going down 2-1 at home to lowly Maidstone. Dan Stubbs gave Stones the lead, Keiran Leabon replied, and Maidstone were doomed to relegation until Ellis Green kept his head to convert a 93rd-minute penalty and give them a 2-1 victory.

It made Bury's Suffolk derby at Lowestoft on Monday all-important and, in front of 1,246, they took the points with a 75th minute goal by Chris Henderson. They are back to third while the Trawlerboys are fourth, having been second after two first-half goals from Jamie Forshaw and one from Matt Nolan gave them a 3-0 win at Margate on Saturday.

At the other end of the table, Maidstone followed up Saturday's dramatic late success with a 2-0 home win over Folkestone, who are now certain to finish with the wooden spoon. Colin Richmond broke the deadlock with a 67th minute penalty and Alex Flisher made sure three minutes later.

Maidstone, then, go into their final fixture at Hornchurch a point behind Hastings, who have a far superior goal difference. Hastings were on the way to safety when a Sam Adams penalty gave them the lead just before half-time in Saturday's home game with Hendon, but Dave Diedhiou made it 1-1.

Hastings' last fixture is at home to Aveley, whose survival target is an eight-goal win and, even then, Maidstone would have to drop points. The Millers went into Monday's derby with Hornchurch with high hopes after Friday's triumph at Concord but their two-season stay in the Premier was almost ended as Urchins

powered to a 4-1 win. Lewis Smith opened the scoring after 43 minutes and by the 62nd minute it was all over as Jon Hunt, Martin Tuohy – his 20th goal in all competitions – and Smith made it 4-0. Sherwin Stanley's 89th minute reply was little consolation and did not even reduce next Saturday's target, which would have been eight without it.

Horsham are safe after a weekend double. Jamie Cade gave them a first-half lead against Wealdstone on Saturday, Jamie Brotherton added a penalty and Wealdstone made it 2-1 in the last minute through Peter Dean, his 22nd league and cup goal. Aveley's defeat on Monday would have endured Horsham's survival but Hornets did it for themselves with a 4-2 victory at Croydon. Whitnell and Stefan Rasmussen twice put Croydon ahead in the first half, Cade replying, but the second half belonged to Horsham. Kevin Sefaaah's own goal levelled it again, Tom Graves put them ahead and Cade made certain.

Division One North

It will be a peaceful final Saturday in Division One North, unlike the other divisions where a great deal will be at stake.

East Thurrock United clinched the title with a 3-0 victory at Redbridge on Saturday and the four play-off contenders are also known: runners-up Needham Market, Harlow, Brentwood and Wingate & Finchley. Waltham Forest are doomed to the only relegation place so all that remains to be settled on Saturday is the line-up for the play-off semi-finals. Needham will definitely be at home but their opponents could be any of the other three. Brentwood are at home to Wingate and a draw would drop Harlow to fifth place if they are beaten. Whatever happens to Harlow, a definite result at Brentwood would send the losers to Needham.

Last season's golden boot winner, Sam Higgins, has spent most of the season with Chelmsford but he left an impression on this Ryman League season by heading East Thurrock's title-winning goal after 20 minutes on Saturday. Redbridge put up an excellent fight on a dusty pitch but Rocks made sure with goals from Reiss Gilbert and Max Cornhill in the last six minutes.

Few would begrudge Rocks their success. They were relegated with no fewer than 50 points in 2008, and would have stayed up but

for the loss of one point because of a brief appearance by an ineligible substitute.

A year later they had the chance to win the One North title with a last-minute penalty against Aveley, whose goalkeeper was sent off for the offence. But defender Glen Golby saved the kick, Aveley were champions and Rocks were beaten in the play-off semi-final. Fair to say that Rocks were a little nervous when they found Golby in the Redbridge side.

Incidentally, the Aveley manager that day, Rod Stringer, is now in charge at Braintree who clinched the Conference South title on Saturday.

Last season East Thurrock scored 102 goals but finished only fifth and again went out in the semi-final. So their popular manager John Coventry will be relieved not to have to face the knock-out lottery again.

They celebrated on Monday with a 4-0 home win over tenants Grays. All the goals came before half-time, the first two from Higgins including a first-minute penalty. Hakeem Araba and Gilbey were the other marksmen.

Needham did all they could to keep their hopes alive on Saturday, beating Waltham Abbey 4-2. Louis Bristow gave Abbey a swift lead, answered equally swiftly by Jamie Godbold. A Craig Parker double made it 3-1 at the interval and at that point the midfield man was the joint leader in the race for the league's golden boot, with 32 league goals. Danny Hayes pulled one back before Kris Lee hit Needham's fourth.

On Monday, with nothing at stake, Needham went 2-0 down after 15 minutes at AFC Sudbury as Jack Wignall and James Baker scored in rapid succession. A feature of Needham's season has been their ability to get out of trouble with a burst of goals and they did it again, though leaving it late. Parker converted an 87th minute penalty for his 33rd of the season (but see Division One South for the latest on the golden boot) and Sam Newson made it 2-2, bringing an abrupt end to Sudbury's play-off challenge.

Sudbury had stayed in the race with a 3-1 victory at Romford on Saturday, considerably aided by own goals from Adam Rafis and Chris Thomas. Ryan Henshaw was the only Sudbury men to find the net, while Ben Turner

converted a penalty for Boro which at the time, made it 1-1.

Harlow have a one-point advantage over the two rivals for third place, though their last game is at Needham Market and a defeat there might well mean that they have to return there three days later for their semi-final. Goals by Steve Ferguson and Dave Cowley gave them a 2-1 victory at Waltham Forest on Saturday, leaving Forest's survival hopes hanging by a thread although Josh Bennett's late goal made their target of catching Ilford a little easier. They needed to close a gap of six points and 11 goals, a dream that was to die on Monday.

On Monday Emiel Aiken gave Ware an early 1-0 lead at Harlow and it was the 72nd minute before Danny Brown saved a point with a penalty. Oddity: if Bognor win the South section, both Division Ones will have champions known as the Rocks and each division will have Hawks – Harlow and Whitehawk – contesting the play-offs.

Both clubs on Harlow's heels have a far superior goal difference, and Brentwood are three goals better off than Wingate. A 1-1 home draw with Cheshunt on Saturday was all Brentwood could manage at the weekend; they had no game on Monday. Josh Hutchinson put Cheshunt ahead and 16-year-old Jacob Dingli saved a point. The crowd of 763, boosted by a Help the Heroes day, was at the time the best in either Division One this season.

Wingate also drew on Saturday, 2-2 at Heybridge where a fizzing strike by Ola Williams provided their second equaliser with ten minutes left. Swifts scored in each half through Chris Ribchester and Michael Marsh, with Leon Smith getting Wingate's first.

Smith then fired a hat-trick, taking him to 20 league goals, by the 47th minute on Monday as Waltham Forest's lingering hopes were snuffed out by a 5-0 thrashing. Ahmet Rifat and a Marvin Samuel own goal completed the rout.

Enfield Town were play-off outsiders before the weekend. They did their best, beating Ilford with a lone Adam Wallace goal on Saturday and winning 3-0 at Cheshunt on Monday, where Wallace claimed two more either side of a Walid Matata effort. They

moved up to sixth but are four points off the play-offs with only one game left.

Maldon were the other contenders on Saturday morning and a 2-1 win at Great Wakering, where Joe Collins grabbed a last-minute winner, kept them alive. But they went down 4-2 to neighbours Heybridge on Monday, Luke Callander scoring twice, and that was that.

Iford did not need Forest's Monday defeat to make sure of their own survival. They did it for themselves with a 3-2 home win over Romford. It was 1-1 after 88 minutes; then Jan Skonieczki and Derek Hawtin struck two quick blows and still left time for Alex Read to pull one back.

Only a handful of games did not affect the key positions. Two of them involved Thamesmead, who fell foul of the Mitchell brothers in a 4-1 defeat at Ware on Saturday – Daryl and Matt Mitchell both scored – and then suffered a 1-0 home defeat by Great Wakering. Billy Johnson got the goal as Wakering completed their programme.

Louis Collins was on target as Potters Bar beat Tilbury 1-0 in Saturday's other fixture and on Monday Bar drew 2-2 at Waltham Abbey. It was 1-1 by the fourth minute with Abbey's Steve Cawley replying to Cole Penney's opener. Then Emmanuel Osei put Abbey ahead and Luke Croll squared it again.

Division One South

It was a thrilling weekend in Division One South and the stage is set for a nailbiting climax to the season on Saturday.

To sum up the position: Bognor, for whom Jason Prior has scored ten goals in three games, need a win at Chatham to make sure of the title. It looked an easy task until Chatham, with relegation looming, scored two last-gasp goals to snatch victory at Eastbourne on Monday and give themselves a chance. They must win on Saturday while Whyteleafe lose or Corinthian-Casuals fail to win. If Casuals draw, it is very possible that they and Chatham will finish with identical records, including goals. Leafe have the worst goal difference and will go down if all three finish level on points.

That unusual situation was also possible at the top until Bognor absent-mindedly conceded a

goal in added time on Monday. Now it's straightforward. Metropolitan Police must win their home game against Merstham and, if they do, they will be champions if Bognor drop points.

Whitehawk and Leatherhead will occupy the next two places, but in what order? They meet at Whitehawk on Saturday and a home win will give Hawks home advantage for the play-off semi-final a few days later. Any other result, and Tanners will host the game.

That leaves the fourth play-off spot. After the holiday programme Dulwich are fifth, ahead of Walton & Hersham on goal difference, and they meet at Walton on Saturday. Should they draw, Burgess Hill could sneak past both of them with a home win over Ramsgate, whose own play-off bid ended on Monday.

How did it come to this? Well, we must start with Bognor and Prior, who became the first man in the club's 124-year history to score a hat-trick of hat-tricks. He scored three in the 4-0 win over Walton & Hersham two Saturdays ago and hit the first four goals in Easter Saturday's 5-0 romp at Sittingbourne. The first was a tenth-minute penalty after an offence for which Sittingbourne's Hicham Akhazzan was dismissed. His second made it a three-way tie with Needham's Craig Parker and Leatherhead's Greg Andrews in the golden boot race, but he was two ahead by the end of the day and four clear of Parker by Monday night.

Watched by the highest Division One crowd of the season, 1,319, Bognor suffered a rather nervous first half against Worthing on Monday. Prior gave them the chance to relax with a shot and a header in the first seven minutes of the second half and added a powerful solo goal in the 83rd minute to take his league tally to 37 and in all matches to 43. His first was also Bognor's 100th of the season. Then, with various people counting on their fingers to confirm that they could finish the season tied with the Police in every respect, Dan White ended that possibility with a 93rd minute consolation goal.

Metropolitan Police maintained their challenge in smooth style. Eddie Smith and Carl Wilson-Denis earned them a 2-0 home win against Faversham on Saturday and they followed up with four unanswered goals at Corinthian-Casuals on Monday. Craig

Watkins took his season's league and cup tally to 29 with a double while Ty Smith and James Greenaway were also on target. Watkins' second, his side's third, was their 100th of the campaign.

Whitehawk had reached the century with their first goal on Saturday and they are now well past it. Ben Godfrey got the landmark goal and later added another as Corinthian-Casuals, who did not have the best of weekends, were thrashed 6-0 at East Brighton Park. Jerahl Hughes also scored twice.

On Monday, though, Hawks were held to a 2-2 draw at bottom club Horsham YMCA. Matt Hurley gave Hawks the lead shortly before the interval but two goals in five minutes midway through the second half, from Danny Dudley and Marc Cumberbatch, put YM in front. Then Sam Gargan squared it. It mattered little to Hawks, for whom a victory would still have left them needing to beat Leatherhead this week to finish third.

Leatherhead themselves started the weekend programme in the division by winning 6-2 at Whyteleafe on Friday. Ace marksmen Andrews and Tommy Hutchins each scored twice, giving Andrews what proved to be a short-lived two-goal lead in the golden boot battle.

He missed out on Monday, when Hutchings' 19th minute goal – his own 25th in the league and 32nd in all – was enough to beat Burgess Hill and knock them out of the play-off places. Leatherhead have 99 goals in the bank and their first goal on Saturday, if it comes, will make it the first time in the league's history that four clubs in the same division have reached the century.

Hillians had doubled their lead over their nearest rivals from one point to two on Saturday, despite being held 1-1 at home by Dulwich. Matt Percival gave the home side an interval lead, Calvin Morath-Gibbs replied. Then, on Monday, Gary Drewett's first-half goal was all Dulwich needed for a home win over Whyteleafe.

Walton & Hersham lost crucial ground when Sam Crabb's second-half goal gave Eastbourne the honours, 1-0, at Stompond Lane on Saturday. But the Swans got right back into it with a 3-1 victory at neighbours Walton Casuals on Monday. Kieran Knight

scored twice in the first 27 minutes, Luke Evans pulled one back before the interval and Gary Frewen clinched it for Swans ten minutes after the restart.

Ramsgate were very much in contention after Saturday's games, when they were level on points with Dulwich and Walton thanks to a late comeback for a 2-1 victory at Worthing. Trailing to a Mark Pulling goal, they scored twice in the last 11 minutes through Mark Lovell, a penalty, and James Gregory. It was all in vain. They had to win on Monday to stay in the race but, after 90 scoreless minutes, it was Whitstable's Ian Pulman who netted the decisive goal.

It was a six-point weekend for the Oystermen, who had already made sure of staying up by whipping YMCA 4-0 on Saturday. That man Pulman got the first two and now has 26 league goals, 29 in all.

You wouldn't have given much for Chatham's survival hopes on Saturday morning, when they needed nine points from their last three games to have any chance of staying up, something of a tall order for a team that had not won in 12 games. But it proved to be lucky 13 as two goals from Joe Fuller and one from Anthony Hogg produced a 3-2 home victory over Walton Casuals, for whom Liam Wright scored both.

It looked all over for them again at half-time on Monday as they trailed to goals by Tim Rivers and Marvin Farrell at Eastbourne. Charlie Ticehurst pulled one back early in the second half but that was it until the 89th minute, when Kane Rice equalised. A draw was no use to them, but there was still time for Kevin Watson to win it. The odds are still stacked against them but they have performed marvels to take it to the last day.

Chipstead moved into the top half of the table with a pair of victories. Alex Wilks scored both as they saw off Godalming 2-1 on Saturday and contributed another goal to Monday's 4-0 romp at Merstham, who had drawn 1-1 at Fleet on Saturday. Fleet then hit five unanswered Monday goals at Godalming, two of them from Josh Pearson.

Akhazzan joined the lengthy list of players who have followed a red card with a goal when he scored for Sittingbourne on Monday but they went down 3-1 at Faversham.

Ryman Youth League

Staines Town completed the first half of a potential Ryman Youth League double this week, winning 3-1 at Northwood to clinch the West Division title.

The match was also a shoot-out between the league's two top marksmen. Mario Quiassaca opened the Staines scoring with a 14th minute penalty and netted again four minutes later to take his season's haul to 20. Romaine Walker pulled one back before half-time to reach 20 himself but Quiassaca had the last word with his 21st in the 70th minute.

Staines also reached the Lucas Fettes Cup final, coming from behind to win 2-1 at Redbridge thanks to a double by Lewis Afflick in the last ten minutes. They will host Walton & Hersham in the final on Monday, 2nd May (3pm).

Walton took a third-minute lead through George Griffiths in their semi-final at home to Sutton, for whom Michael Bello replied in the seventh minute. There was a long, long wait for the next goal, which came early in the second half of extra time, again from Griffiths. Ross Nunn's last-minute effort made it 3-1.

Back in the West Division, Woking thrashed Northwood 6-0, including a Jack Mazzone double, and are now favourites to finish second. Ashford (Middx) drew 1-1 at Fleet, for whom James McBride replied to Elijah Bristol's early goal.

There was just one game in the Central Division and Thamesmead's 3-0 home win over Metropolitan Police means that the boys in blue finish at the foot of the table. Fraser Walker netted twice.

It was a busy week in the South-East Division, where Horsham YMCA's remarkable change of fortune continued. They were certainties for the wooden spoon when they managed only one point from their first 11 games but another

draw in their 12th outing seemed to give them renewed confidence and they have won their next four, including two victories this week which lifted them off the foot of the table. Bradley Carter and Charlie Abrehart scored in a 2-1 win at Welling and they were both on target again in a 4-0 home victory over Ashford (Kent) which took them above neighbours Horsham, who suffered two home defeats.

Maidstone went home with all three points thanks to a lone goal by Chinedu McKenzie and Lewes had Charlie Dunkley and Harry Bowles to thank for their 2-1 success.

That kept Lewes in the title hunt, just. They trail leaders Burgess Hill by five points and have only two games left. A George Jones goal earlier in the week gave them a 1-0 victory at Burgess Hill to keep the race open, though Hillians went on to beat Eastbourne Town 2-1 with goals from Freddie Parker and Tom Stillwell.

That kept them two points clear of Whitehawk, who beat Welling 4-0. It was scoreless until the 50th minute, when Jesse Whyte scored the first of his two goals.

Maidstone made it a six-point week with a 3-2 home win over Worthing. They had to come from 2-0 down, with McKenzie scoring again to start the comeback.
