# ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

## Premier Division

THE LAST 100 per cent record in the Premier Division disappeared on Sunday when Hendon were held to a 2-2 home draw by Lewes.

Michael Malcolm gave the Sussex club the lead in the second minute and Elliott Godfrey fired home a free-kick to equalise shortly before the half-hour.

Malcolm was on the mark again with his fourth goal of the season 11 minutes into the second half.

But once again Lewes could not hold the advantage and Greg Ngoyi levelled matters for good with 25 minutes left.

Hendon had to play the last 12 minutes with ten men after substitute Aaron Morgan was dismissed.

The point was enough to restore Hendon to the leadership after they had been displaced by Lowestoft on Saturday.

The Trawlerboys made the most of the chance to take over first place overnight with a dominant display, thrashing Concord 5-0 at Crown Meadow.

It might have been different had reliable Lowestoft keeper Andy Reynolds not pulled off an early double save from Harry Elmes.

Lubo Guentchev opened the scoring shortly afterwards and two goals in as many minutes from Michael Frew shortly before half-time left Concord reeling.

Matt Nolan, who had earlier hit the bar, headed the fourth after 56 minutes and provided the chance for Guentchev to claim the fifth with almost a quarter of the match remaining.

Canvey joined Lowestoft on the 12-point mark with a 1-0 home victory over Harrow. The winner came from a Rob King penalty after 65 minutes.

No surprise there: all four Canvey victories have been by the odd goal and King has provided the second-half winner every time.

Wingate's 100 per cent record came to an end in a 1-1 draw at Tooting, who took a tenth-minute lead through Jordan Wilson.

Marc Weatherstone headed home a corner to equalise midway through the first half and, despite plenty of chances at both ends, there was no further scoring.

Billericay were the day's top scorers, hitting six unanswered goals against Kingstonian at New Lodge.

K's must have thought that Monday's 4-1 win at Tooting had put them back on course after their poor start to the campaign, but they were in for a rude awakening.

There was little between the sides until Paul Semakula headed home Sam Berry's cross in the 18<sup>th</sup> minute and two more headers, both from big defender Rob Swaine, made it 3-0 by the 32<sup>nd</sup> minute.

The rest of the goals came in a rush in the last eight minutes through Jay May, debutant Courtney White and Harrison Chatting.

K's can console themselves with the thought that they are faring better than two years ago, when they conceded 19 goals in losing their first four games and went on to reach the play-off final.

Carshalton, expected to be strong title contenders, had started the season slowly but gave themselves a boost with a 2-0 victory at Hastings despite playing with ten men from the 26<sup>th</sup> minute, when Tom Davis received his second yellow card in quick succession.

Dean McDonald had already put Robins ahead with a deflected free-kick and he scored again four minutes after half-time as the depleted visitors won in some comfort.

Hornchurch were also 2-0 away winners, at Met Police. Urchins manager Jim McFarlane had been generally pleased with his side's performances despite three successive defeats and they took charge of this game in the closing stages.

Aaron Gayle set up a 72<sup>nd</sup>-minute opener for Martin Tuohy, who then created the second for Jo Flack six minutes later.

Former Charlton youngster Joe Woolley made his Hornchurch debut, becoming their fourth goalkeeper in three games.

Darren Behcet had been injured during the previous Saturday's game and replaced by outfield player Elliot Styles, and Trinidad international Kelvin Jack was signed for Monday's visit to Lowestoft.

Promoted Leatherhead got off the mark at the fifth attempt, though they remained at the foot of the table after their 1-1 draw at Aveley.

Veteran Micah Hyde lashed home a 25-yarder to put Millers ahead just before half-time but Mark Simmons levelled it with a 71<sup>st</sup>-minute penalty after Spencer Harrison handled.

Tanners' delight at collecting their first Premier Division point since 1983 was tempered by a stoppage-time red card for defender Michael Akande.

Wealdstone came from behind to collect their first victory of the season, beating Bury Town 3-1 at Grosvenor Vale. The visitors had Kieran Leabon sent off in the 31<sup>st</sup> minute but took the lead nine minutes later with a Sam Reed header. Kieran Knight changed the game with two goals in as many minutes just after the hour and Alex Dyer completed the scoring with 15 minutes to go.

A Tom Bradbrook double gave Margate a 2-1 victory at Horsham, who have won both their away games but lost all three at home.

Bradbrook forced home a loose ball in the 11<sup>th</sup> minute and there was no more scoring until the 70<sup>th</sup>

minute, when Tony Nwachukwu netted his fifth of the season to put Horsham on level terms. It stayed that way for only seven minutes; then Bradbrook clinched the points for the visitors with a vicious long-range free-kick. Cray's Leigh Bremner is the early leader in the Golden Boot race after netting his sixth league goal of the season in a 3-0 home win over East Thurrock.

## FA Cup

TWO Ryman League sides hammered nine goals as Division One sides entered the FA Cup at the preliminary round stage on Saturday.

Shaun Welford led the way by scoring five times in Maidstone's 9-0 rout of Corinthian on the Kent League's side's home turf, following up his league hat-trick against Crawley Down, also away from home, seven days earlier.

It was Graeme Andrews who started the feast in the second minute, Welford opened his account with a lob on the half-hour and Sam Bewick made it 3-0 at the interval.

Welford nabbed his second in the 63rd minute and completed his hat-trick seven minutes later, after Ellis Green had made it five.

And Welford completed his haul with another two in seven minutes at the end, separated by the eighth from Baff Addae.

Ross Wall struck four times in the first half to lead Maldon's 9-0 demolition of Eastern Counties League strugglers Ipswich Wanderers.

The visitors, bottom of their league's lower division, were hit by two Wall headers in the first five minutes and he completed his treble after only 20 minutes, immediately after Ollie Berquez claimed the third.

The same duo made it 6-0 by the 37<sup>th</sup> minute, after which there was a lull until just after the hour, when Freddie Ladapo netted. Jack Stevenson added a penalty and Marcus Milner made it nine with 13 minutes left. But Wanderers were spared double figures.

It was generally a bad day for the Eastern Counties League clubs who faced Ryman opposition, with four of the ties producing an aggregate score of 22-2 in our favour.

Leiston hit five unanswered goals against Clacton, three of them in the first half from Patrick Brothers, Lee McGlone and Neil Calver. Nathan Stone and Brothers completed the scoring before the hour mark.

Heybridge won 4-1 at Hadleigh. Chris Ribchester scored the only goal of the first half but two in five minutes early in the second half, from Taylor Hastings and Luke Callander, took them out of reach.

Hadleigh managed a consolation but Ricky Griggs immediately restored the three-goal margin.

Needham were also 4-1 winners at home to Felixstowe and they, too, were 3-0 up before their opponents broke their duck. Danny Thrower and Scott Chaplin scored in the first half, Sam Newson and Danny Bloomfield in the second.

Bremner had to wait until the dying moments for his goal but he played a major part in Cray's sixth-minute opener, earning a penalty which Tommy Whitnell converted.

Jack Clark doubled the lead in the 25<sup>th</sup> minute and an attempted rally by the visitors after the break brought them no reward.

Gorleston salvaged something from the day for the ECL, beating Harlow 2-0 with a goal in each half from Liam Harvey-Cooper.

There were eight all-Ryman League ties, the most one-sided of them coming at Waltham Abbey as Ware were thrashed 6-1.

When the sides met in the league recently, Ware donated two own goals to a 3-1 Abbots victory.

This time the hosts needed no help. Louis Bristow, Luke Webster and Liam Thomas made it 3-0 at half-time and Ayrton Coley netted twice midway through the second half, with Ben Andreos replying between his goals. Tim Shaw completed the six-hit.

Thamesmead saw off visiting Burgess Hill 3-0. Rikki Cable opened the scoring with a free-kick on the half-hour, Jake Burman netted soon after the interval and David Noel made sure.

Ilford and tenants Waltham Forest will continue their domestic battle in a replay on Wednesday after a 1-1 draw.

Forest beat their landlords, who had 'home' advantage, in the league on Monday but this time Ilford had the away dressing room and they went ahead through debutant Vendel Nunes after 28 minutes. Gaz Dauti replied three minutes later.

Worthing's good start to the season continued with a 3-1 victory at Whitstable, with goals coming early in each half from Tom Lawley and John Lansdale. Stuart Vahid gave the Oystermen hope with 12 minutes left but a Lansdale penalty settled it.

Ramsgate defended valiantly to earn a goalless draw at Whitehawk while a single goal by defender Chris Hill, in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute, was enough to see Chatham through at the expense of visiting Croydon Athletic.

Dulwich beat Eastbourne 2-0 at Champion Hill, but had to wait until the last minute for Dean Carpenter's clincher after taking a second-minute lead through Ray Powell. Eastbourne battled hard even after Scott Kirkwood's second yellow card reduced them to ten men.

The final all-Ryman tie was at Folkestone, where an 88<sup>th</sup>-minute equaliser by Frankie Chappell kept the Kent side in the competition.

Whyteleaf will host the replay on Tuesday after a 2-2 draw. Leaf took the lead twice in the first half through Jay Garrick and Fabian Batchelor, with Darren Smith putting the home side briefly on terms.

Bognor cruised to a 5-1 victory over Combined Counties League side Camberley, though it was close for some time after Luke Nightingale's 11<sup>th</sup>-minute header put Rocks ahead.

Quick goals by Ben Johnson and Terry Dodd early in the second half effectively decided the outcome and, although Michael Smith pulled one back with a penalty, Stuart Axten soon made it 4-1, with the help of a defender, and Jason Prior finished it off.

Kent neighbours Faversham and Hythe progressed with 1-0 away victories.

Adrian Stone netted for Faversham in the 59<sup>th</sup> minute at Raynes Park Vale and James Dryden was on target five minutes later for Hythe at Chessington & Hook.

Brentwood left it later, with Jacob Dingli's 77<sup>th</sup>-minute effort earning their 1-0 victory at Colney Heath.

Crawley Down, still seeking their first Ryman League point, got their season rolling with a 2-1 home win over Farnham.

Claude Seanla's goal midway through the second half looked certain to be the winner but the visitors equalised in added time only for their replay hopes to be dashed immediately by Hassan Nyang's winner.

Sittingbourne also needed a last-gasp goal as they beat visitors Peacehaven by the same margin.

Billy Manners wiped out Peacehaven's early goal but a replay on the Sussex Downs was looming until substitute Josh West scored from close range.

Another team to win 2-1 after falling behind were Redbridge.

Vince Durrant's free-kick shortly before half-time put them on level terms at Cockfosters and an inspired substitution introduced penalty specialist Ben Bradbury in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute.

Two minutes later Shane Stamp was brought down in the box and Bradbury did the rest.

Tilbury were behind after only three minutes in their home game against Biggleswade United but hit back for a 3-1 victory.

Emiel Aiken equalised and Sam West put Dockers ahead on the stroke of half-time. Kevin Malthouse stretched the lead nine minutes after the break.

Walton & Hershaw saw off Tunbridge Wells by the same margin, taking a 3-0 lead by the 36<sup>th</sup> minute.

Jon Munday's header opened the scoring, Reis Stanislaus added the second and he then won a penalty which Chamal Fenelon converted.

The Swans made it hard for themselves, conceding a penalty in the 69<sup>th</sup> minute which Andy McMath converted to give the visitors hope, then having to play with ten men for the last eight minutes after Ashley Quashie was shown a second yellow card.

Godalming had to travel to Dorset to face Wimborne in the only tie that pitted a Ryman League club against Southern League opposition.

It was G's who progressed with a 2-1 victory. Scott Harris opened the scoring just after half-time, George Short made it 2-0 in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute and a late reply was all the hosts could manage.

Sudbury have home advantage for the replay after a 0-0 draw at St Ives and it was also goalless at

Cheshunt, who must now travel to Southend Manor on Tuesday.

Another draw came at Great Wakering, 1-1 this time against Oxhey Jets. The visitors went ahead after 66 minutes and Michael Pinder headed the equaliser five minutes later.

An own goal gifted Merstham an early lead against Egham, who earned a home replay when Dale Marvell scored against his old club with 12 minutes left.

Six Ryman clubs, including Harlow, went out to lower-league opposition, with the most noisily celebrated 'upset' coming at King's Lynn, where 853 saw the reformed club beat Soham 2-1.

Matt Robinson equalised for Soham in the 63<sup>rd</sup> minute but they were on level terms for only a couple of minutes.

Dean Pennant gave Enfield Town the lead at Stotfold but paved the way only for a 2-1 defeat, while Danny Buckle's eighth-minute penalty for Walton Casuals at Beckenham was a false dawn as the Kent club hit back to win 3-1.

Corinthian-Casuals lost by the same margin at Horley, for whom Kyle Hough completed a hat-trick on the stroke of half-time and moments after Glenn Boosey had put Casuals back in the game.

It was a 3-1 defeat, too, for Potters Bar at home to Broxbourne. James Gershfield put the Bar on terms at half-time but the visitors scored twice early in the second period.

Three Ryman League clubs were in FA Cup action on Sunday and all progressed with odd-goal victories over opposition from lower leagues.

Royston, with a 100 per cent Spartan South Midlands League record, were expected to be testing visitors for Romford but, in the end, the 3-2 scoreline perhaps flattered their efforts.

Odawale Odedoyin rounded the keeper to give Romford an early lead which was wiped out by Dalton O'Brien in a defensive muddle shortly before the interval.

Jack Barry restored Boro's lead shortly after the restart and Abs Seymour made it 3-1 before Ryan Lockett's header five minutes from time raised Royston's replay hopes in vain.

Two goals in seven minutes either side of half-time paved the way for Grays' victory by the same margin at AFC Dunstable.

They, too, took an early lead though Louis Dennis only to see their opponents draw level.

Junior Baker and Bradley Thomas struck the important blows that put Grays 3-1 up and although the hosts pulled one back with 17 minutes left it was the most they could do.

Chipstead were also made to suffer in the closing stages after having a 2-0 lead cut back.

Goals in each half from Jason Goodchild and Alex Wilks set them on course at Epsom, who replied with 12 minutes left but could not avert a 2-1 defeat.

## **JOE FRANCIS – ASSISTANT MANAGER - TEN YEARS A CRAY WANDERER**

Cray Wanderers FC celebrated the ten year anniversary of assistant manager Joe Francis at the club, by presenting Joe with an inscribed plate before their Ryman Premier League home match versus East Thurrock United on 3 September.

Joe joined Cray initially as a player in September 2001, and quickly graduated to assistant manager and coach, forming a very successful partnership with Ian Jenkins who had been appointed manager in 1999. Their joint efforts saw Cray win the Kent League championship for two consecutive seasons before gaining promotion to the Ryman Division One in 2004. Five years later the Wands went up via the play-offs into the Ryman Premier. It is the most successful ten-year period in the club's 150-year history.

After playing for the Charlton Athletic youth team, Joe enjoyed a distinguished playing career at the top levels of Non-League football, playing in the Conference and the Ryman Premier for Welling United, Bromley, Enfield, Hayes and Kingstonian.

Joe has been an inspirational coach at Cray Wanderers, fulfilling his own prediction (in 2002) that: "Having been considered a creative player I have always had a vision of how I wanted a team to play – with flair and imagination, but also solid as a unit."

Age 42, Joe is married to Sarah and their children are Louis, George and Lily. Joe has just taken a new full-time job as Head of Education and Welfare at Charlton Athletic FC.
