# ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

## Premier Division

NO fewer than seven of the 11 Premier Division matches on Saturday produced away victories, and the seven defeated home sides managed just one goal between them.

That came from Leatherhead's Danny Gainsford, who headed home Jake Hill's cross a minute before half-time to put Tanners on level terms against Lowestoft.

Lubo Guentchev had given the Trawlerboys the lead, tapping his sixth goal of the season into an empty net after Matt Nolan had rounded keeper Chico Ramos.

Lowestoft's winner came in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute when Ramos saved Guentchev's penalty but could not prevent Stuart Ainsley converting the rebound to give the Suffolk side a 2-1 victory and second place in the table, while Tanners stay at the bottom with a single point to their credit.

Hendon remained a point clear at the top after their 2-0 win at Margate. They were helped by Margate keeper Jack Smelt, who was adjudged to have brought down Greg Ngoyi for a penalty which Jamie Busby converted in the 71<sup>st</sup> minute, then carried a cross over the line for an own goal seven minutes later.

Before that Margate had been on top; Matt Bodkin hit the bar and several other chances went begging.

Another 2-0 away victory lifted Canvey to third place as they inflicted Wingate & Finchley's first-ever Premier Division defeat, and their first in any competition since March 26.

Leon Gordon headed the opener on the half-hour and Wingate could not hit back despite dominating the second half. Murat Karagul came closest, hitting the inside of a post, before Jay Curran clinched it for the islanders in the last minute.

A goal by Tommy Whitnell on the stroke of half-time sparked Cray into life at Harrow and they marched to a 4-0 victory.

Chris Saunders claimed the second immediately after the restart and further goals followed from Jack Clark and Sam Long. Dean Fenton hit the bar for the hosts, who slipped to 21<sup>st</sup> in the table.

Kingstonian are still seeking their first home point after crashing 3-0 to Wealdstone. Wes Parker headed home a free-kick to open the scoring on 24 minutes.

Ian Selley almost equalised when he struck a post from 25 yards but Stones settled it when Richard Jolly and David Hicks scored in the first 11 minutes of the second half.

Met Police collected their maiden away win at Premier level thanks to a lone Tony Finn goal after 34 minutes at Bury.

It came very much against the run of play in a first half during which Tom Bullard had two headers cleared off the Met line and Roscoe Hipperson hit the bar. The second half was more even and the visitors defended their lead well.

The seventh away winners were Billericay. Jay May headed home Junior Luke's cross with ten minutes left for the only goal of their game at Carshalton, the only team in the league who have yet to score on home turf.

An away victory seemed to be a good bet at Hornchurch, where the home side were without a point on their own ground while visitors Tooting had won both their away games and scored four times in each of them.

Once Martin Tuohy had given Urchins a third-minute lead, however, the result was rarely in doubt and he went on to claim a hat-trick in a 6-0 romp.

Two more goals came in a minute just before the half-hour; Jonathan Hunt scored direct from a corner and Tuohy notched his second. Lewis Smith made it 4-0 soon after the interval, Tuohy completed his treble with his sixth of the season in the 85<sup>th</sup> minute and Michael Spencer made it six.

Another team with two away wins under their belts, Horsham, also failed to make it three. They were on top for much of their game at East Thurrock but went down to a lone goal by Neil Richmond in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute.

The third and last home winners were Lewes, who joined Lowestoft as the only teams with a 100 per cent record on their own turf. They strolled to a 4-1 victory over Aveley, who have drawn four times but are still seeking their first victory.

Paul Booth was on target after 11 minutes and it was 3-0 by half-time through a Nic Ciardini header and a powerful shot from the outstanding Christian Nanetti.

Reece Morgan managed a late consolation for Millers but Michael Malcolm promptly netted Rooks' fourth.

There was just one drawn game, at Concord where all four goals came in 11 minutes after the half-hour mark.

Hastings seemed to have taken command with quickfire goals from Aaron Hopkinson and Matt Hall, but Kyle Asante pulled one back and a Michael Noone penalty made it 2-2.

## Division One North

THE top two sides in Division One North met at Chatham, and it was Grays who came out on top 2-0 thanks to a Harry Agombar double.

His first came from a penalty after 36 minutes and, after Chats had tried hard to hit back, he scored again, direct from a corner, in the 54<sup>th</sup> minute.

Grays are a point clear of Waltham Forest, who came from 2-0 down to win 3-2 for the second time in four days.

Having seen off Ilford in Wednesday's FA Cup replay, they performed the same trick to see off Maldon in an eventful affair at Cricklefield.

A Dave Collins free-kick and a Ross Wall header put Maldon two up in 21 minutes before a foul on Manu Dagher enabled Jeff Hammond to reduce the arrears from the spot before half-time.

A red card for Josh Green left the hosts with ten men from the 53<sup>rd</sup> minute but they drew level when Dagher fired home in the 76<sup>th</sup> minute and got the winner with another Hammond penalty seven minutes later after he had been tripped by Joe Pearman.

There was one further blow for the visitors when keeper Sam Cowler was sent off in added time for handling outside his area.

Leiston are up to third after making short work of visiting Tilbury, who were previously unbeaten.

Unlucky Dockers had to field left-back Aaron Matthews in goal after James Marrable was injured in the warm-up and the final 3-0 scoreline was posted by the 26<sup>th</sup> minute.

The stand-in made a good save in the third minute only to see Nathan Stone bury the rebound, and that was followed by two goals in as many minutes midway through the half from Joe Jefford and Lee McGlone.

Ten-man Harlow came from behind to win 2-1 at Sudbury and moved into the leading group.

The hosts took the lead through Robbie Martin four minutes after half-time and Harlow had Mark Taylor sent off shortly afterwards.

But they drew level through Luke Marshall in the 66<sup>th</sup> minute and snatched all three points when Rhys Henry scored from close range in the fourth minute of added time.

Soham left it equally late to take a point, David Cobb's last-gasp effort going in off a post to earn them a 2-2 draw at Heybridge.

Michael Simpson had fired Soham ahead in the 68<sup>th</sup> minute but the league newcomers conceded twice in the last seven minutes as Bertie Brayley

levelled matters and Tom Broadhurst put Swifts in front.

Redbridge matched Waltham Forest by winning 3-2 at Great Wakering after going 2-0 down.

George Artemi pounced to put Rovers ahead after five minutes and Nathan Dewberry punished a goalkeeping error in the 26<sup>th</sup> minute.

The comeback started on the hour when Mitchell Das followed up to score after his first effort was saved.

Ryan Murray levelled the scores and then completed a burst of three goals in 15 minutes with a diving header.

Enfield Town also fought back from a 2-0 deficit to take a home point against Needham Market, who had apparently taken charge of proceedings with goals either side of the interval from Scott Chaplin and Sam Newson, the latter's sixth goal in the league and seventh in all.

Walid Matata reduced the arrears in the 62<sup>nd</sup> minute and Liam Hope made it 2-2 from long range with 12 minutes left.

Two sides seeking their first victory of the season clashed at Ware and it was Thamesmead who came out on top as two Danny Penny headers produced another of the division's come-from-behind successes.

Tom Querry's free-kick gave Ware a tenth-minute lead and doubled their season's goal tally. Penny netted the equaliser midway through the half and Ware then had Dave Bastien sent off.

They went down to nine men in the 68<sup>th</sup> minute when Vince Rispoli handled on the line and, although Obey Murefu saved Penny's penalty, the Thamesmead man nodded home the resulting corner.

Ware prop up the table with one point from five games, though Maldon and Ilford are ahead of them only by a single goal.

Ilford were beaten 3-1 at Potters Bar in another meeting of two winless sides.

Tom Pett put the hosts ahead with an eighth-minute penalty and substitute Matt Clifford made it 2-0 in the 68<sup>th</sup> minute with only his second touch.

Aji Olatunbosun pulled one back before Pett clinched it with seven minutes left.

Brentwood beat Waltham Abbey 2-0, scoring twice in the first half after surviving heavy pressure by the visitors in the early going. Luke Croll and Leon Fisher were the marksmen.

Josh Hutchinson netted twice in a hectic five-minute second-half spell as Cheshunt drew 2-2 at Romford.

Jack Barry headed Romford into a 29<sup>th</sup>-minute lead but they missed a number of chances and

paid the price when Hutchinson converted a penalty after 63 minutes.

Paul Kavanagh's free-kick restored Romford's advantage but Hutchinson quickly struck again for a share of the points.

## Division One South

AND then there was one . . . Bognor dropped their first Division One South points of the season in an uneventful 0-0 draw at Sittingbourne, leaving Dulwich as the only side in the league with a 100 per cent record.

Last season's play-off finalists made it five wins out of five, though not before conceding their first goal of the season.

It came two minutes after half-time when Matt York curled in a free-kick for hosts Chipstead, who had earlier hit the bar through Alex Wilks. Including their FA Cup tie, Dulwich had kept a clean sheet for 497 minutes.

They soon recovered from the shock. Frankie Sawyer levelled the scores three minutes later and Calvin Morath-Gibbs grabbed the winner with eight minutes left.

Worthing moved above Bognor into second place on goal difference. Ryan McBride's hat-trick led them to a 5-1 win over Merstham at Woodside Road, where Rebels have scored 14 times in three games.

John Lansdale opened the scoring with a seventh-minute penalty after a foul on Jamie Brotherton and McBride opened his account in the 23<sup>rd</sup> minute.

An own goal by Glen Woodburn gave the visitors brief hope but McBride restored the two-goal margin before the interval. Brotherton made it 4-1 before McBride notched his third.

A third Sussex club, Whitehawk, are fourth after a 2-1 home win over Ramsgate. It was their third meeting of the week: Hawks won a midweek FA Cup replay in Kent after a goalless draw in the first match.

Goals in the first 20 minutes by Pat Harding and Paul Armstrong gave Hawks their reward for a dominant first half. Ramsgate were the better side after the break but had to settle for a Simon Pettit goal just before the hour as their unbeaten league record went.

Folkestone made it four wins out of five with a 1-0 away victory which left Crawley Down still seeking their first Ryman League point.

Ironically, the winner was a 66<sup>th</sup>-minute own goal by Hassan Nyang, who has scored both Down's league goals.

Only one other team in the league were still without a point at kick-off time.

That was Walton Casuals and they broke their duck, but only just: Charlie Ide snatched a last-minute equaliser as they drew 2-2 at Hythe.

Casuals had taken an early lead with a Liam Hind header but James Dryden quickly replied and Ronnie Dolan's 71st-minute goal was almost a winner.

Three players were sent off after a flare-up in added time at Tolworth, where injury-hit Corinthian-Casuals went down 3-0 to Godalming.

Kane Sargeant hit the bar for Casuals in the first half but Gavin Smith put G's ahead seven minutes after the break, Scott Harris added another soon afterwards and Smith scored his second after 72 minutes.

He was to be one of the players to receive a red card, along with Casuals' Scott Hassell and Jamal Carr.

Maidstone scored twice in the last minute of the first half to win 2-0 at Croydon Athletic, who later had Jon Cartledge sent off. Ellis Green and Alex Flisher were the Stones' marksmen.

Aaron Quain's double helped Faversham to a 3-2 victory at Walton & Hersham, who took a fifth-minute lead through Gary Frewen. Quain equalised with a free-kick 11 minutes later and Faversham went in front soon after half-time through Adrian Stone, the first of three headed goals. Quain made it 3-1 and Ashlee Quashie gave Walton hope with 11 minutes left.

Greg Manton fired Eastbourne Town into a 10<sup>th</sup>-minute lead at Whitstable and the Oystermen found themselves in deeper trouble when Rob Lyle was sent off 13 minutes before half-time. Matt Geard put the visitors further ahead in the 44<sup>th</sup> minute and Stuart Vahid's late reply could not save Whitstable from a 2-1 defeat.

Burgess Hill are still without a win after going down 2-0 at Whyteleafe.

The visitors were unlucky not to be ahead before Jay Garrick opened the scoring in the 38<sup>th</sup> minute. Jerome Ingram made it 2-0 with 16 minutes left and, although the Hillians finished strongly, they could not find a way past keeper Ricky Borrett.
