ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

Division One North

THREE goals in the first 25 minutes lifted Harlow to second place in Division One North with a 3-1 home win over Great Wakering.

Mark Taylor put Hawks ahead with an eight-minute penalty after Rhys Henry had been fouled, and strikes by Luke Marshall and Piers Wixon effectively settled matters. Wakering pulled one back with a Jack Carlile penalty two minutes from time.

Honours were even in the only other game: Tom Pett put Potters Bar ahead after only five minutes at Soham, who saved a point when substitute Richard Gammon netted in the 53rd minute.

Division One South

WALTON Casuals maintained their improvement in Division One South with a 3-2 home win over Whyteleafe. They now have seven points, all collected in the space of eight days.

Whyteleafe took the lead twice in the first 13 minutes thanks to Stephane Gnamore and a Craig Lewington own goal, separated by Charlie Ide's equaliser.

A header by Liam Hind levelled matters again on 32 minutes and Craig Totton scored what proved to be the winner six minutes later. Leafe's chance of a point faded when top scorer Jay Garrick was sent off in the second half.

Eastbourne failed to make the most of first-half domination, during which Sam and Nathan Crabb went close, and paid the price as they went down 1-0 at home to Corinthian-Casuals. The visitors upped their game after the break and Danny Green netted the winner on 61 minutes.

FA Cup

AMAZING Maidstone smashed nine FA Cup goals away from home for the second time in successive matches.

The Division One South club followed up their 9-0 preliminary round victory at Corinthian by romping to a 9-1 win at Banstead in the first qualifying round yesterday (Saturday).

There was a first-half hat-trick for Baff Addae which he completed with a penalty after home keeper Colin Harris was sent off for bringing

down Shaun Welford, who went on to notch his own third in the 51st minute.

Welford already has eight FA Cup goals and, including league matches, a total of 12 this season. It could have been more, but he was taken off after Alex Flisher made it 7-1 in the 55th minute.

James Pinnock and Alex Waugh took the haul to nine with 25 minutes still to play but an offside decision and a goalline clearance denied Stones double figures.

Dulwich maintained their perfect record for the season with their eighth victory out of eight. They hit four unanswered goals at Horley who, like Banstead, play in the Combined Counties League. First-half goals from Lewis Gonsalves and Calvin Morath-Gibbs were followed by late strikes from James Pinnock and Kevin James.

Another hat-trick came from Cray's Tommy Whitnell in one of three all-Premier fixtures. Whitnell opened their account after 23 minutes at Hastings and, after the hosts were reduced to ten men by the dismissal of Aaron Hopkinson, he added two in the last five minutes to complete a 3-0 victory.

Concord made light of their winless league record and deservedly came out on top 3-1 at Hornchurch. Southend loanee Karl Asante put them ahead in the 32nd minute but Tambeson Eyong replied for the Urchins before the interval.

Harry Elmes restored Concord's lead six minutes after the break and they were comfortable after that, adding a third goal when Mark Marshall headed home from an 80th-minute corner.

The other Premier clash went the way of the home side. Kwesi Appiah scored in each half, the first a penalty, and Tom Bradbrook completed Margate's 3-0 whitewash of Tooting.

There was a giant-killing act by Division One North side Redbridge, who netted three unanswered goals at Premier high-fliers Wingate. James Robinson, a grandson of Jimmy Greaves, gave the Motormen a half-time lead, Dan Trenkel doubled it and Ben Bradbury added a late penalty.

Two other ties pitted Premier Division sides against Division One opponents and they both

went by the book, although Lowestoft had to come from behind for their 2-1 win at Heybridge. The hosts took a 14th-minute lead through Bertie Brayley and they held it until the hour mark, when Lubo Guentchev levelled matters. Matt Nolan got the winner with 15 minutes to go.

Paul Vines scored twice in five first-half minutes to set Carshalton on their way to a 3-0 home win over Faversham, for whom Adrian Stone missed two early chances. The outstanding Anthony Joseph completed the scoring four minutes after the interval.

Chatham, second in Division One North, hosted Worthing, fourth in the South, and it was Worthing who went through with a lone goal against the run of play by Jamie Brotherton in the 34th minute.

Two other Sussex sides from Division One South advanced at the expense of opposition from the same section: Bognor beat 1-0 Sittingbourne at Nyewood Lane thanks to a tenth-minute goal by Terry Dodd, while Sam Gargan scored after five and 30 minutes to set Whitehawk on their way to a 3-0 success at Folkestone. Paul Armstrong added the third early in the second half.

First-half efforts by Roscoe Dsane and Sam Tucknott were enough for Merstham in their home game with Walton & Hersham. The Swans threatened to save the tie after Glenn Stanley pulled one back with eight minutes left, but Merstham held on to win 2-1.

There was a surprise in the Suffolk derby at Leiston where Sudbury put their unhappy league form behind them – they parted company with manager Nicky Smith during the week – to go through with a single 39th-minute goal by Richard Howell.

Three Premier Division sides crashed out against opposition from Division One of the Southern League. Kingstonian's wretched season continued with a 3-0 defeat at Poole, all three goals coming from headers. Lewes were briefly on level terms through Matt Somner but had Lewis Hamilton sent off just before half-time when they trailed 2-1 and went down 4-1 at Chertsey, while Wealdstone lost 2-0 at home to Beaconsfield.

Balancing that to an extent, two Ryman Division One sides drew with Southern Premier opposition and one did even better: Waltham Forest saw off Hitchin 2-0 at Cricklefield thanks to two goals in eight minutes during the game's final quarter, Jeff Hammond and Billy Melton the marksmen.

Maldon drew 2-2 at Cambridge City, who equalised in the 90th minute after the visitors had Lee Townrow sent off. City had taken an early lead but Sos Yao levelled it on the stroke of half-time and James Lawson put the Essex club ahead with 20 minutes to go. The replay will be on Tuesday, as will Brentwood's rematch with Hemel Hempstead after a goalless draw at Hemel.

The other such tie went the way of Southern Premier Arlesey, who nabbed an 86th-minute goal to win 2-1 at Tilbury. A goal down at the interval, Dockers replied on the hour through Aaron Matthews but could not hold on to earn a second chance.

The only tie featuring Premier Division clubs from both leagues took place at East Thurrock, where Petrit Elbi's header midway through the second half was all the home side needed to defeat Bedford.

Similarly, just one match involved clubs from the respective Division Ones and that went the way of the Southern League as Biggleswade accounted for visiting Waltham Abbey 3-1. Two down at the interval, Abbey pulled one back shortly after the restart with a Steve Cawley penalty only for the Waders to score again within two minutes.

Three Ryman Premier sides made their status count against Southern League Division One outfits. Table-propping Leatherhead should have gained some confidence from their 5-1 thrashing of North Leigh, especially as Tommy Hutchings opened his account for the season after missing the start of it through injury. He and Greg Andrews combined for 69 goals last season. Gary Drewett and Hutchings made it 2-0 after only ten minutes and Leigh had a man sent off soon afterwards. Danny Gainsford added a third before the visitors replied on the stroke of half-time. Teenage debutant Josh Gallagher and Andrews made sure.

Hendon also struck early on their way to a 3-0 win at AFC Hayes, who were known as Brook House during their two Ryman League seasons (2004-06). Jamie Busby converted a third-minute penalty and Greg Ngoyi made it two in the 16th minute. Never seriously troubled, Hendon wrapped it up in added time with another Busby strike.

Not far away, a Gary Jones double gave Harrow a 2-0 home win over Marlow. His first was a penalty five minutes before the interval and his second, a free-kick, came in the 71st minute.

There was a shock exit for Premier Division side Met Police, 4-2 at Kent League outfit Beckenham who took command with two goals from Adam Greenways in the first ten minutes. Staforde Palmer pulled one back for the Met but Beckenham scored again before the interval and were 4-1 up before Carl Wilson-Denis netted a late consolation.

There were contrasting fortunes for the two clubs promoted to Division One South this season. Both faced Kent League opposition but, while Crawley Down's unhappy start to the season continued with a 2-0 home defeat by VCD, Hythe saw off Erith & Belvedere 5-2. Last season's Kent champions were 2-0 up in eight minutes through Laurence Harvey and Brendon Cass. Erith replied, but Lloyd Blackman and Dave Cook made it 4-1 at the interval and Blackman scored again before Erith got their second.

Essex Senior League leaders Southend Manor claimed a second Ryman scalp to go with that of Cheshunt in the previous round, beating Romford 4-2. Free-scoring Wilf Msiska netted twice as they recovered from Paul Clayton's early goal for Boro, who were 4-1 down before Addian Clifton's consolation.

Another ESL side, Stansted, were well beaten at Canvey, for whom Danny Heale fired a hat-trick in a 4-1 home win. Heale opened the scoring on the half-hour and Stansted's hopes were further hit when former Southend forward Scott Forbes was sent off shortly before the interval. Heale and Leon Gordon made sure of victory and, after Stansted managed a late reply, Heale got his third in the last minute.

Chipstead eased to a 3-1 home victory over Sussex County League side Redhill. A Jason Goodchild penalty and a Bruce Hogg free-kick put them 2-0 up at the interval and Kofi Quartey blasted home from 30 yards shortly after the restart. Gavin Gordon replied for Redhill from the penalty spot.

Another Sussex League side, Shoreham, went down 2-0 at home to Thamesmead. Theo Fairweather-Johnson struck the initial blow after eight minutes and Rikki Cable claimed the second just after the hour.

Horsham must replay against Sussex County opposition after being held to a 2-2 home draw by Lingfield, whose ranks included Nicky Forster and Ian Pearce, two men with almost 900 Football League appearances between them. Horsham went ahead in the 51st minute through Dane Luchford, Forster equalised on the hour and Tony Nwachukwu restored Hornets' lead from the spot two minutes after

that. Josh Coulson saved Lingfield with ten minutes left but consolation for Horsham is that they will again have home advantage for Wednesday's replay because of floodlight problems at Lingfield.

Bury Town's 3-0 home win over Gorleston was not as simple as it sounds. The Ryman League side had Tom Bullard sent off five minutes before half-time when they were leading by a single goal, a 20th-minute header by Lee Reed. There were only 13 minutes left when Roscoe Hipperson stretched the lead, and Lee Smith made sure shortly afterwards.

Deakan Napier's 23rd-minute goal looked likely to be enough for Needham Market but Ely made it 1-1 with six minutes left to earn a home replay on Tuesday.

Billericay romped to a 4-0 home win over Stotfold. Defender Rob Swaine gave them a second-minute lead and added a second in the 23rd minute, the first of three headed goals. The next came two minutes later from Dave Knight and Tony Boot nodded the fourth early in the second half.

Finally, Godalming must travel down the A3 to Portsmouth on Tuesday after being held to a 1-1 draw by Wessex League side Moneyfields, who took the lead just before the interval. Gavin Smith equalised on the hour and a post denied Darren Wheeler a G's winner.

The stage was set for Aveley to join the list of Premier Division casualties when they visited Division One North leaders Grays on Sunday and conceded an early goal. But Millers, 21st in the table, had other ideas and they came from behind to win 2-1.

Grays soon took the lead when Joao Carlos headed home at the end of a sparkling move in the sixth minute, but Millers bounced back two minutes later through Spencer Harrison, who met Sherwin Stanley's long throw with a header which looped over keeper Andy Hall.

Thereafter there was little to choose between the sides in a rousing and sporting derby.

The winning goal came in the 35th minute when Stanley's cross from the right deceived Hall and hit the back of the net.

The end-to-end action continued after the break. Harry Agombar hit the Aveley bar, Micah Hyde struck a Grays post and then Dennis headed against the bar.

Gradually, though, Millers gained a grip on proceedings and looked more likely to add to the score while Grays were unable to offer too much of a threat in the closing stages.
