ALL THE WEEKEND ACTION

Premier Division

THE Premier Division leadership changed hands again on Saturday and it's Hornchurch who now top the table after a convincing 3-0 home win over Kingstonian. Although they have played two or three more games than their closest rivals, they will stay there until at least Tuesday week as the Alan Boon League Cup and FA Trophy take centre stage.

With none of the teams above them in action, Urchins knew that victory would lift them five places from sixth position and they dominated the game from the start. As has often been the case in their home games, however, they struggled to turn superiority into goals and it was not until K's were down to ten men that the breakthrough arrived.

Bashiru Alimi received his second yellow card on the hour and Martin Tuohy opened the scoring in the 66th minute. Lewis Smith added another from Michael Spencer's clever pass five minutes later and Tommy Black set up the third for Frankie Curley with ten minutes left.

Canvey, in eighth place, were the next-highest team involved in a league match and they saw off Tooting 2-0 at Park Lane. It failed to improve their position but they are only three points behind the new leaders.

Danny Heale gave them an early lead and, after Jason Hallett had hit the Tooting bar and Wade Small had done the same at the other end, Jay Curran wrapped it up on 70 minutes.

Horsham were jubilant after their 2-2 draw with Met Police; it was their first home point of the season after six successive defeats.

They had keeper Ken Westoby to thank for a late save from Staforde Palmer which prevented the Met completing their comeback from an early 2-0 deficit.

Hornets must have hoped for better after Craig Davies and Williams Peauroux struck in the first 17 minutes. Palmer pulled one back seven minutes after the interval and Orlando Jeffrey squared it in the 80th minute.

Carshalton also have only one home point to their credit and have scored just once in five outings at Colston Avenue. Harrow were the latest team to enjoy their visit, taking the points with a lone 24th-minute goal by Quincy Rowe.

Richard Jolly netted twice in three minutes shortly before half-time to set up Wealdstone's

2-1 home win over Hastings, who replied through Zac Attwood in the 76th minute.

Aveley romped into an early 2-0 lead at Wingate. Spencer Harrison put them ahead in 15 minutes and Reece Morgan added other six minutes later, only for Leon Smith to produce an instant reply which made him the first Premier player to with ten league goals to his credit. The equaliser did not come until the 80th minute and was a bizarre own goal by Aveley keeper Dave Hogan, who caught a cross safely but then stepped back over the line.

Division One North

DIVISION One North was the place for goals on, with 42 of them coming in nine games. Eight of them were scored by Needham Market, who had already netted seven twice this season and are the league's top scorers with 33 in ten games.

This time the Marketmen went goal-crazy on the road, wrecking Cheshunt's unbeaten home record by inflicting an 8-1 thrashing.

It was the 18th minute before Jose Espinosa started the rout but it was 3-0 eight minutes later as Sam Newson and Danny Thrower struck. Kevin Ashwood replied for the Ambers on 35 minutes but that provoked a two-goal response from Angelo Harrop and Bradley Barber that made it 5-1 at the interval.

Newson scored again on 70 minutes, his 16th of the season in all competitions, before late efforts came from Scott Chaplin and Deakan Napier.

For all their goal scoring, Needham are no higher than seventh in the table. They are one of a number of teams who closed in on leaders Grays, who had a day off.

Waltham Forest are now in second place, two points off the pace with a game in hand, after hanging on to beat landlords Ilford 4-3.

Manu Dagher put Forest ahead after seven minutes and Jamie Moore added another midway through the first half. Raffael Kaphouris quickly made it 2-1 only for Joel Palmer to restore the two-goal margin on the half-hour.

Stephen Opoka revived Ilford's hopes on 71 minutes but Dagher nabbed his second six minutes later and a late strike by Wale Adedoyin, was no more than consolation for the 'visitors'.

Tilbury stormed into a 3-0 lead at home to Waltham Abbey. Tom Webb scored after 22 and 38 minutes, with Steve Good adding the third six minutes after the break. Abbots were given some hope with 20 minutes left when Tim Shaw's shot came back off the bar and cannoned into the net off Dockers defender Joe Nightingill. Then Matt Mitchell caused late alarm when he made it 3-2 with a free kick in the 89th minute. But Dockers held out and moved up to third place.

Enfield Town dropped back from second to fourth after being held to a 1-1 draw at Great Wakering. Michael Pindy levelled for the hosts eight minutes after half-time, wiping out Liam Hope's 15th-minute strike for Enfield. Dave Kendall almost made it 2-0 but saw his effort come back off the bar.

Harlow are fifth after wrecking Leiston's impressive home record. They had won their first four on their own turf, conceding just one goal in the process, but the Suffolk fans learned that Ryman League football is not that simple as Hawks marched to a 4-1 triumph.

Piers Wixon put them ahead midway through the first half, Luke Marshall added another seven minutes before half-time and Danny Brown converted a penalty soon after the break. James Bunn claimed the fourth before Michael Brothers managed a consolation.

Four other teams overtook Leiston, who dropped from fifth to tenth. Romford returned to sixth place after a 3-2 home win over Ware in which Matt Toms took only six minutes to open the scoring. Nick Reynolds made it 2-0 on 25 minutes and, after Ricci Crace replied, Reynolds restored the two-goal margin on the stroke of half-time. All three Romford goals were headers. Bottom club Ware reduced the arrears again through Anthony Lane three minutes after the restart but could not find an equaliser.

Lea Dawson gave Thamesmead a 31st-minute lead at Soham, who replied in the 41st minute through Dubi Ogbonna only to be hit by two goals on the stroke of half-time. Danny Moore ran the length of the field to restore the lead in the 45th minute and Danny Penny netted a penalty in added time to put Thamesmead 3-1 up, which is how it finished.

The longest name on the day's league score sheets was also the first: Ashley Harrison-Barker put Potters Bar ahead in the second minute against Chatham and Josh Urquhart made it 2-0 with a free kick just before the break. Tom Pett missed a chance to wrap it up from the penalty spot but Jon Pilbeam's late

reply could not save the visitors from a fourth successive defeat after they had started the season so brightly.

Emmanuel Osei was Brentwood's hero in their 2-0 home victory over Heybridge, scoring in the 65th and 80th minutes to decide a game that was evenly fought.

Division One South

FOLKESTONE moved up to third place in Division One South on Saturday with four unanswered goals at Merstham, who were previously unbeaten at home.

Josh Burchell put them ahead after 16 minutes but the damage was done by two own goals in three minutes, with Gareth Graham's mishap in the 69th minute quickly followed by another from Dean Hamlin. Simon Austin completed the scoring.

Maidstone slipped back to fourth after their run of seven successive league wins came to an end with a 1-1 draw at Whyteleafe. It looked as if a Graeme Andrews goal midway through the second half would keep the Stones rolling, but Stefane Gnamore levelled it with ten minutes left.

At the other end of the table, improving Crawley Down climbed off the bottom by beating Whitstable 3-0 and collecting their first Ryman League points on home turf at the sixth attempt. Fraser Logan broke the deadlock in the 56th minute, Brannon O'Neill doubled the lead six minutes later and Luke Blewden made quite sure.

Walton & Hersham are the new bottom club, though in unfortunate circumstances. They were leading by an early Victor Kiri goal when their game against Corinthian-Casuals had to be abandoned ten minutes after half-time. Casuals striker Kane Sergeant suffered a broken leg and required lengthy treatment on the pitch before he could be moved.

Whitehawk lost three points during the week when they were punished for fielding an ineligible player on the first day of the season but a 3-1 win at Croydon Athletic put them back where they started. Paul Armstrong's seventh-minute penalty was followed by a goal from Ben Godfrey on 26 minutes. Peter Afoloyan put Croydon back in it six minutes later and the scoreline stayed unchanged until Armstrong netted another spot-kick with three minutes left.

The other three games were all 1-1 draws with the hosts scoring first. Jones Awuah converted an early penalty for Burgess Hill, who then hit

the bar through Lloyd Cotton. Danny Buckle headed the equaliser in the 64th minute.

Eastbourne came closer to turning Scott Krkwood's 40th-minute goal into victory but Joe Taylor rescued Ramsgate with four minutes left.

Chipstead cut it even finer: Rob Watkins equalised in added time at Hythe, for whom Richard Sinden had netted in the 76th minute.

FA Cup

IT WAS a disappointing Saturday for Ryman League clubs in the FA Cup: of the 13 in action, only three clinched places in the fourth qualifying round, two of them in all-Ryman ties. Two others go into the hat after drawn games.

Redbridge were the only side to beat 'outside' opposition. Having already put out two Premier Division clubs, the Motormen might have expected an easier time at home to unbeaten Spartan South Midlands League club Dunstable Town and the final 3-0 scoreline may sound convincing.

But Dunstable held out until the 71st minute before conceding a goal to Nathan Gordon and Redbridge keeper Adam Rafis then saved a Peter Holmes penalty.

Ben Bradbury and Joe Gardner finally made sure of victory in the last five minutes and Motormen are now 90 minutes away from reaching the first round proper for the first time since 2003, when only the crossbar denied them a glorious triumph at Port Vale.

One of the shocks of the day came at Billericay, where Leatherhead turned the Premier Division table upside down. At kick-off time the hosts topped a table which Tanners propped up, yet it was the bottom club who hit three unanswered goals to bring back memories of past FA Cup heroics.

Vernon Francis headed them in front in the 11th minute and, after Liam Pestle got the second soon after the break, it was Francis who added the clincher.

Another upset threatened at Maldon, where the Division One North strugglers had the better of Premier high-flyers Hendon for an hour and led through Marcus Milner's goal seven minutes before the break.

Carl McCluskey put Hendon on terms in the 61st minute and Greg Ngoyi gave them the lead four minutes after that. The dismissal of James Lawson was a further blow to Maldon's hopes and Elliott Godfrey completed a 3-1 Hendon victory in added time.

The Cornishmen of Bodmin must make the midweek trek to Godalming after a 1-1 draw. The Division One South club recovered from falling behind in the 12th minute and earned another chance with a goal from Darren Wheeler on 31 minutes. Wheeler later had a penalty saved by Kevin Miller.

East Thurrock had to work harder to earn their second chance against Southern League visitors North Greenford, who scored in the first minute and were 3-0 up by the half-hour mark.

Half-time substitute Greg Cohen came to the rescue. He set up Rocks' opening goal for Kye Ruel in the 54th minute, pulled another one back himself seven minutes later and was again the provider when Sam Higgins made it 3-3 in the 77th minute.

That leaves six clubs who were beaten by teams from Conference South, though it could have been so much better.

Perhaps no-one will regret their exit as much as Margate, for whom Kwesi Appiah was on target in the first minute of their home game with Bromley and struck again after 20 minutes, his ninth FA Cup goal of the season. It stayed that way until the 70th minute, when Warren McBean punished a defensive error, and the same player headed the equaliser a minute later. Then, with a replay looking likely, Gate conceded an 88th minute penalty which was converted to give the visitors a 3-2 victory.

Cray also forfeited the lead in a Kent derby at home, going down 2-1 to Dartford. Tommy Whitnell struck for Cray two minutes after half-time but Ryan Hayes equalised on 72 minutes and Danny Harris won it eight minutes later.

Two Division One clubs suffered late heartbreak. Worthing went down 2-0 at home to Staines with both goals coming in the last four minutes, while Sudbury held out for 84 minutes at Eastbourne Borough before losing to Gary Elphick's lone goal.

Lowestoft were another team to score first. Joe Francis put them ahead after 16 minutes at home to Chelmsford in a game that attracted a four-figure crowd to Crown Meadow. But Cliff Akurang and Max Cornhill gave the Essex club 2-1 half-time lead and they added two more before Dale Cockrill converted an 85th-minute penalty for the Trawlerboys. Kezie Ibe then got his second for the visitors to complete a 5-2 success.

The only club with little to remember from the day were Bognor, who were three down by half-time at Sutton and eventually lost 4-0.
