ALL THE ACTION

IT WAS a Saturday for the pursuers in the scrap for the Ryman Premier play-off places. None of the top six managed a win but the next three clubs in the table, Bury, Hendon and Margate, all came out on top.

Margate produced the result of the day, whipping fourth-placed Lewes 5-1 in Kent. Although they are only eighth, they have games in hand on most of the sides above them and on current form look to be favourites for a play-off berth.

Despite the emphatic scoreline, it was 0-0 until just before the hour mark, when Margate struck twice in as many minutes through Matt Bodkin and Dan Stubbs. Paul Booth quickly pulled one back with a penalty but Richard Avery made it 3-1 in the 67th minute and Bodkin struck again nine minutes later.

Where was Kwesi Appiah? The master marksman, having turned down a move to Blackpool, finally made his contribution with four minutes left, his 22nd of the season in the league and 34th in all.

Leaders Billericay improved their position despite being held to a goalless draw at Hastings, who played with ten men for most of the game after Jamie Crellin's 25th-minute dismissal.

They are now two points clear of Hornchurch and Lowestoft, who were both beaten. Urchins fell behind to a Sam Reed goal midway through the first half at Bury and had centre-back Reiss Noel sent off soon after half-time. Jonathan Hunt's penalty in the 83rd minute seemed to have saved the day for the ten men but John Sands struck in the third minute of added time to give Bury a 2-1 victory and move them up to sixth spot.

Lowestoft almost salvaged a point at Canvey, hitting the bar in the dying moments. Alex Rhodes gave Canvey a 13th-minute lead which was wiped out by Lubo Guentchev ten minutes before half-time. The Trawlerboys were then hit by two goals in the last two minutes of the half, from Bradley Woods-Garless and Jay Curran. The bar denied Rob King a fourth before Chris Henderson pulled it back to 3-2 in the 66th minute.

Cray remained fifth after a 1-1 draw at Wealdstone, Tommy Whitnell put Cray ahead after 58 minutes, capitalising on the rebound when Jack Clark's shot was tipped on to the bar, and Wes Parker headed the reply within two minutes.

Hendon are up to seventh after collecting their ninth away win of the season at rock-bottom Horsham, for whom it was a 12th home defeat.

Horsham had their chances before Ryan Wharton opened the scoring in the 38th minute. Greg Ngoyi made it 2-0 in the 73rd and Elliot Charles added another two minutes later, not that he knew much about it as he was laid out by a clearance which hit him in the face and flew into the net.

Met Police slipped from sixth to ninth after being held to a 0-0 home draw by lowly Aveley. That was the only point gathered by any of the bottom four, and Millers had plenty of chances to win it before keeper Adam Rafis pulled off two fine saves in added time to deny the Police what would have been a fortunate victory.

Tooting went down 3-1 at home to Harrow, who took the lead with a Danny Leech header midway through the first half.

Tristan Toney added another on the hour and Danny Buckle notched the third shortly afterwards. Andre McCollin netted a consolation goal with nine minutes left.

Leatherhead, in 19th place, are four points adrift of safety after their 1-0 defeat at Wingate, who eased their own fears thanks to a ninth-minute goal from Leon Smith.

David Laird was unlucky not to add a second when his volley crashed against a post.

Concord moved further away from trouble with a win by the same margin at Kingstonian.

They were on top for much of the game but, thanks to excellent goalkeeping by Rob Tolfrey, they had to wait until the 78th minute for the decider from Tony Stokes, his 20th goal of the season in league and cup.

East Thurrock's Sam Higgins reached the same target and, with luck, might have gone well past it in their 1-1 home draw with Carshalton, a battle of two of the league's FA Trophy survivors.

Higgins hit the inside of a post in the fourth minute, the ball somehow eluding two of his teammates as it bounced along the goalline. Carshalton took the lead in the 17th minute, against the run of play, with a fine header by Paul Vines from an accurate cross by Craig Tanner.

Rocks dominated after that with some neat passing and Higgins eventually squared matters in the 61st minute. Nick Hamann made some superb saves either side of the goal to earn Robins a point, though the hosts almost snatched it at the death when the dangerous Higgins struck a post again.



THE Ryman North action started early on Saturday with a noon kick-off for the derby between Tilbury and Grays.

It was the 158th meeting of the neighbours, including a dozen friendlies, and it was Tilbury who came from behind to win 2-1, giving them a 67-62 edge in the series with 29 drawn games.

Grays were out to avenge a 3-1 home defeat in November and, after Alex Read had missed an open goal for the hosts, they took an early lead. Louis Dennis converted a 12th-minute penalty after Joao Carlos was tripped by Paul King.

It became a fairly scrappy affair after that, with Grays seemingly content to sit on their lead. They paid the price in the 72nd minute, when poor defence allowed Joe Nightingill to prod in the equaliser, and Steve Good fired Dockers ahead seven minutes later.

James Marrable's superb point-blank save from Carlos in added time made sure of the points for Tilbury, who climbed into fifth place while Grays remained fourth.

Both, though, were to finish the day below Harlow, who took over fourth spot in the afternoon with a 1-0 win at Maldon. The decisive goal was an 80th-minute Danny Brown penalty.

Red cards played an important part in the battle for the leadership. Leiston beat visiting Heybridge 3-1 to move two points clear, taking command after Dan Foakes was sent off in the first half.

It was 1-1 at the time after Nathan Stone's sixth-minute opener for the hosts was answered by Chris Bryan's free-kick in the 23rd

minute. The ten men struggled to hang on and were saved three times by the woodwork before Stone made the breakthrough with a 66th-minute header. Michael Brothers made sure in added time.

Second-placed Enfield had only themselves to blame for losing ground, and were relieved to escape from Potters Bar with a 0-0 draw after playing the whole second half with nine men. Walid Matata – who had hit a post in the first minute - and Mark Kirby were dismissed in the last three minutes of the first half, but the hosts could not reproduce their excellent recent form and failed to profit from the advantage.

Needham Market stay third, nine points behind the leaders, after a 2-2 draw at Soham. Bradley Barber's free-kick gave Needham an early lead but Andy Funnell headed an equaliser on 33 minutes and then put his side ahead with 14 minutes left.

Lee McGlone headed home to rescue a point with four minutes left, but the best news for the Marketmen was that lethal striker Sam Newson was fit to play a part in the action as a second-half substitute, having been out for more than a month.

Brentwood stayed in the thick of the play-off race with a 1-0 home win over Ware, who slid back to the foot of the table, Steve Butterworth netted the goal after 11 minutes.

Sudbury, too, are right in the hunt after a 4-1 victory at Cheshunt, another game where red cards were all-important. James Baker missed a penalty for Sudbury before Tyrone Scarlett put the hosts ahead after 27 minutes.

They had Jordan Lumsden sent off shortly afterwards and although they held their lead until half-time they were overwhelmed afterwards. Jemel Fox equalised within two minutes of the restart and Baker put Sudbury ahead six minutes later.

Any hope for the Ambers vanished on the hour when they were reduced to nine men. Jimmie Berry was sent off for handball and Baker this time made no mistake from the spot. The lively Daniel Emmanuel added the fourth.

Ware are bottom because Ilford picked up their fourth away point of the week with a 0-0 draw at Great Wakering. An Ilford victory would have lifted them out of the bottom two altogether and plunged Wakering into the relegation zone. Julian Okai twice hit the woodwork for the hosts in the first half but Ilford came more into the game after the break.

Redbridge, who lost at home to Ilford in midweek, suffered another blow to their chances of challenging for a play-off place when they were held to a 1-1 draw by visiting Waltham Abbey. Mitchell Das headed the Motormen into the lead moments before half-time and Ayrton Coley replied with 13 minutes left.

Two early goals paved the way for Romford's 2-1 home win over Chatham. Wale Odedoyin, back from a spell with Ilford, and Jack Barry put Boro 2-0 up by the 13th minute and that looked likely to be the end of the scoring. Romford's day was spoiled in added time when Barry was sent off for handling and Lee Hales scored Chatham's consolation from the spot.

South

BOGNOR received a double boost in their quest for the Ryman South championship yesterday (Saturday), beating Corinthian-Casuals 2-1 at Nyewood Lane and learning that goal machine Jason Prior would be staying with them despite impressing in his two-week trial at Newcastle.

Dave Hodges gave Casuals the lead with a low shot midway through the first half but Sonny Cobbs headed the equaliser five minutes later and skipper Dan Beck blasted the winner in the 69th minute. It was to be a mixed day for Beck, who was sent off shortly afterwards.

Bognor remain a point clear of Sussex coast rivals Whitehawk, who left it late to collect a 2-0 victory at lowly Burgess Hill. The hosts held out under heavy pressure and their hopes were boosted when Hawks had Ben Godfrey sent off with 25 minutes left. But Sam Gargan broke the deadlock in the 83rd minute and James Fraser notched the second in added time.

Dulwich stayed two points behind Bognor and one behind Whitehawk, with one and two games in hand respectively, after their 3-0 victory at Merstham. Ethan Pinnock's free-kick gave them a 17th-minute lead and Nyren Clunis doubled it 20 seconds after the interval. Frankie Sawyer wrapped it up with 15 minutes left.

The other sides in the top five failed to see off ten-man opposition. Folkestone are now two points behind Dulwich after their 0-0 draw at Eastbourne, who had Kai Bichard dismissed

on the hour. The Kent club found home keeper Kieron Thorp in defiant mood.

It was an even worse day for Maidstone, who had an extra man from the 13th minute but went down 1-0 at Hythe. Home skipper, and top scorer, Dave Cook was the man sent off but Stones still struggled to make an impact and a Nick Barnes goal on the hour settled it.

Sixth-placed Worthing were without a game and stay three points behind Stones with two games in hand, while Chipstead are four points further back after a 4-1 victory at Walton & Hersham.

Daniel Sintim's own goal handed Chips a 17th-minute lead, Marcus Cassius added another on the half-hour and the scoring was completed with a flurry of three goals just before the interval.

Bruce Hogg's free-kick made it 3-0, Cassius grabbed his second and Swans gained some consolation with a header for Greg Andrews, just signed from Leatherhead for whom he scored 36 times last season.

Whitstable eased their relegation fears with a lone-goal victory at Sittingbourne. Scott Heard converted a 42nd-minute penalty after James Pinnock was brought down.

The Oystermen are four points clear of Burgess Hill, who in turn are four ahead of 21st-placed Whyteleafe. They stayed firmly in the relegation hot seat after going down 3-2 at home to Ramsgate.

Ian Pulman opened Ramsgate's account in the 40th minute but Leafe equalised two minutes later through Fred Fleming, only to fall behind again three minutes after the break when Luke Wheatley headed home.

Elliot Mitchell made it 2-2 in the 70th minute but Rams grabbed their winner within a minute when Pulman claimed his second of the afternoon.

Two goals in the first ten minutes of the second half gave Walton Casuals a 2-0 victory at Godalming. Troy Ferguson opened their account and Liam Holden added a penalty.

Crawley Down came from behind to beat Faversham 3-1. A breakaway goal by Matt Bourne gave the visitors the lead against the run of play in the 65th minute but Tom Burton levelled matters two minutes later.

Miles Mitchell put the Anvils ahead in the 75th minute and a late lob by Luke Blewden made sure of the points.

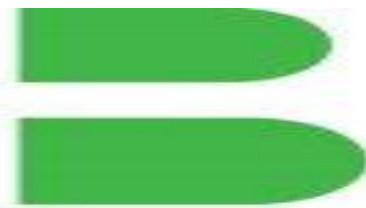
