Ryman Premier

WEALDSTONE evicted **Kingstonian** from top spot in remarkable fashion on Monday, coming from 2-0 down to beat them 5-2 at Grosvenor Vale.

Stones were seeking a sixth successive victory over the visitors but their chances of achieving it looked slim when Andre McCollin fired the leaders ahead in the third minute, becoming the first player to reach the five-goal mark in the division, and Gary MacDonald made the most of slack marking at a corner to head a second after 18 minutes.

Stones, though, hit back two minutes later when Richard Jolly scrambled the ball home for his fifth league goal, and Alex Dyer equalised with a spectacular free-kick in the 33rd minute.

K's keeper Rob Tolfrey might have known he was in for a sticky night when he was named in the programme and on the team sheet as 'Toffee', and he was beaten again in the 45th minute as Peter Dean completed the turnaround with a fierce drive.

Tom Pett met a Lee Chappell cross with a clever back-header to make it 4-2 in the 57th minute and K's saw little of the ball after that, although when they did manage to attack home keeper Rikki Banks had to pull off two fine saves from McCollin to prevent the visitors getting back into the game.

Substitute Nathan Webb wrapped it up with a shot from a tight angle in the 86th minute and Banks saved a penalty by Dean Lodge to deny K's some consolation in added time.

Stones leapt from seventh to first in the table, one point clear. Perhaps more remarkable, considering that it was the only game in the division that night, was that K's crashed from first to sixth!

Wealdstone's reign lasted only 24 hours. Behind after a minute at **Canvey** on Tuesday, ambitious Ryman Premier debutants **Whitehawk** went to the top of the table after hitting back to win 2-1.

Bradley Woods-Garness was the early marksman for the islanders. Joe Keehan replied after 26 minutes and Jed Wallace's 62nd-minute effort took Hawks to the top of the pile.

Behind them only on goals scored are **Hampton**, who reclaimed second spot with a 2-1 home win over **Lewes**. There was a rapid exchange of goals just before the half-hour, with Anthony Thomas swiftly replying to Joe Turner's opener for the Beavers and doubling Hampton's goals-against tally in the process. Joel Ledgister claimed the winner with 16 minutes left.

A win would have kept **Margate** on terms with the top two but they were stunned by **Concord**'s highly-rated Tony Stokes, who struck twice in the last ten minutes to pull off a 2-0 victory for the Essex visitors.

East Thurrock produced the comeback of the night after goals early in each half by Tyler Campbell and Liam Hope left them 2-0 down at **Enfield Town**. Sam Collins opened Rocks' account with 20 minutes left, Hakeem Araba levelled matters in the 82nd minute and Kris Newby's 89th-minute strike stole a 3-2 victory.

Carshalton's poor start to the season continued with a 2-0 home defeat by **Bognor**, who are right up with the leading group. Dan Kempson put the Sussex Rocks ahead after 34 minutes and Carl Walshe got the second just before the break.

Harrow are still seeking their first away point after going down 2-1 at **Wingate**, their fourth defeat on the road. They had hopes of breaking their duck when Simeon Akinola put them ahead after 20 minutes but it all went wrong midway through the second half, when the hosts were awarded a penalty and James Burgess was sent off before Jordan Fowler converted the kick. Murat Karagul hit the winner five minutes later.

Bury had a night to remember, despite not being in league action. They thrashed **Sudbury** 10-1 in the Suffolk Premier Cup, with hat-tricks for John Sands and Allicion Blake.

Ryman North

AFTER losing their first three home league games, **Harlow** seemed determined to break their duck as they three times took the lead against **Soham** on Tuesday. The visitors had other ideas, scoring four times in the last 20 minutes to win 6-3.

Soham were quick to respond every time Harlow scored. Piers Wixon's tenth-minute opener was answered two minutes later by Buster Harradine and when Tom Davie put Hawks ahead again on 30 minutes it was only five minutes before Matt Robinson made it 2-2.

Wixon gave Harlow the lead yet again after 64 minutes but after Michael Simpson levelled matters for the third time, this time six minutes later, the roof caved in for the hosts. Robinson put Soham ahead for the first time in the 75th minute and two late strikes by Rob Mason completed an unlikely scoreline.

Redbridge, 21st in the table, took the league's leakiest defence to table-topping **Tilbury** and held out for 57 minutes. Then a misplaced header by Paul Shave allowed Joel Barnett to put Dockers ahead and it was soon 3-0 thanks to another Barnett effort and one from Emiel Aiken. Jacob Cleaver pulled one back, the fourth goal in eight minutes, but Martin Llewellyn completed a 4-1 Tilbury victory in the 89th minute.

Potters Bar are behind them only on goal difference and might feel that they could have made up the three-goal gap against a visiting **Brentwood** side who were down to nine men by half-time. Cole Penny put the Scholars ahead in the third minute and Eddie Munnely added the second on 40 minutes, just after Danny Dafter was sent off. Darren Blewitt joined him in the dressing room before the break but, for all their second-half pressure, the hosts had to settle for a 3-0 win with Daniel Ailey getting the third in the 75th minute.

Maldon are up to third after a Chris Bryan penalty provided the only goal of their home game against a defiant **Ilford** side, who were denied an equaliser by a post.

Grays stayed well in touch with the leaders with a 2-1 victory at **Cheshunt**, who slipped from second to fourth. Kenny Beaney put Grays ahead after 16 minutes and Ryan Wade's equaliser just before the hour proved in vain as Junior Baker nabbed a 75th-minute winner.

Thamesmead were two up in 15 minutes at home to **Waltham Abbey** with goals from Lewis Tozer and Enoch Adjei. It stayed that way until well into added time at the end, when Rob Carter made it 3-0.

Two games on Wednesday were both decided by a single goal. Hussein Isa's fierce shot on the turn provided a 56th-minute winner for **Romford** in their home game with **Chatham**, lifting Boro to seventh in the table, while Luke Callander's free-kick after 80 minutes gave **Heybridge** all three points in a drab game at **Waltham Forest**.

Ryman South

ONLY one team in the top half of the table collected three points in the latest round of midweek matches. That was **Walton & Hersham**, who moved into second place with a 2-1 home win over **Crawley Down** on Tuesday, ending the last unbeaten record in the division.

There was early excitement as Jamie Cade put the visitors ahead in the fifth minute and Dave Lawrence made it 1-1 in the ninth. Ashley Quashie scored another for the Swans in the 23rd minute and that turned out to be the winner. Walton drew level on points with leaders Folkestone with the Anvils a point behind in third place.

Chipstead and **Herne Bay** are a point further back after their 2-2 draw. Chips, in fact, took a 2-0 lead with goals by Conner French in the 33rd minute and Michael Gordon in the 64th. Dean Grant pulled one back two minutes later and the visitors snatched a point with an 89th-minute effort from James Turner.

Dulwich lost ground with a 1-0 defeat at **Corinthian-Casuals**, who moved into mid-table. Jamie Byatt headed the goal with eight minutes left.

Horsham are off the bottom, though they made harder work of beating **Sittingbourne** than seemed likely when they powered into a 4-0 lead after 40 minutes. Billy Medlock opened the scoring after 21 minutes and struck again five minutes before the break, by which time Wayne Clarke and Ryan Marriott had also delighted the home fans. Joe Taylor pulled one back immediately before the interval but Hornets were still 4-1 up going into added time at the end of the game. Then Taylor scored again, Tom Loynes made it 4-3 and Horsham had to sweat it out for another four minutes before the final whistle.

The new bottom club are **Tooting**, beaten 2-0 at home by **Walton Casuals**. Sam Robinson did the damage, scoring in the ninth minute and converting a penalty just before the half-hour mark.

Worthing gave themselves some breathing space at the foot of the table with a 3-1 win at **Leatherhead**. The Tanners drop to 18th, which means that all three sides relegated to this division from last season's Premier are in the bottom five. Tom Lawley and Scott Tipper gave Rebels a 2-0 lead in the game's first quarter. Nat Hubert's own goal gave Tanners hope early in the second half but the favour was repaid when Chris Boulter found his own net seven minutes from time.

Liam Wright's double gave **Merstham** the points from a 2-0 victory at **Burgess Hill**, another team who had the chance to draw level with Folkestone. Instead, Hillians fell behind on 52 minutes and had Jonno Melia dismissed on the hour. Wright got his second in the 68th minute.

Paul Booth's penalty gave **Maidstone** the lead four minutes before half-time but visiting **Hythe** levelled matters though Brendon Cass in the 73rd minute. They still fell to 20th in the table, despite having a better goal difference than three of the top five.

Leaders **Folkestone** were held to a 2-2 home draw by **Faversham** on Wednesday and edged a point clear of second-placed Walton & Hersham. All the goals came in the last 18 minutes of the first half. Adrian Stone gave Faversham the lead only for Stuart King to hit back with his 10th goal of the season, his eighth in the league. Richard Atkins then put Folkestone ahead, but Luke Harvey squared it again on the stroke of half-time and that was the end of the scoring.

FA Cup

THERE were four replays involving Ryman League clubs this week and they started well on Monday as **Hastings** gave themselves a great chance of reaching the first round of the FA Cup for the first time since 2002 with a 2-1 victory at Hitchin. Indeed, before this season they had not won a single match in the competition since 2006.

Bradley Goldberg put them ahead, against the run of play, just after the half-hour. John Frendo equalised for Southern League Hitchin from the penalty spot in the 58th minute but player-manager Sean Ray restored the Ryman club's lead on 73 minutes and they held out.

Their reward is a home tie against Blackfield & Langley, a club based near Southampton who are no more than halfway in the Step 5 Wessex League.

A word of warning, though: they are managed by Ashley Vickers, well remembered in the London area as a tough-tackling midfielder with the likes of Heybridge, St Albans and Dagenham. He has also had a recent spell in charge of Conference South club Dorchester, though his reign there is most famous for the controversial suspension he received for rugby-tackling a mankini-clad pitch invader!

Hendon progressed in thrilling style on Tuesday with a 2-1 home victory over Conference South club Eastbourne Borough, despite falling behind and going down to ten men early in extra time.

The first 90 minutes were scoreless but Darren Lok put the visitors ahead in the 92nd minute and Hendon had Scott Cousins sent off, leaving them with a formidable task.

Michael Murray equalised with a penalty four minutes into the second period and the comeback was completed in the final minute when Isaiah Rankin grabbed the winner. Hendon will visit Corby, who beat Histon in a replay on Wednesday.

Thurrock, though, are out, beaten 3-1 at home by Welling. Goals by Joe Healy and Lee Clarke put the visitors 2-0 up in 20 minutes. Matt Turpin pulled one back on the half-hour but Healy restored Welling's two-goal advantage in the 63rd minute.

Met Police made it six Ryman teams in the final qualifying round with a 2-0 home win over Eastern Counties League side Dereham on Wednesday.

Jonte Smith gave them a 15th-minute lead with his eighth goal in the competition and Ty Smith clinched it with 12 minutes left, earning the Met an away tie at South Park of the Combined Counties League.
