Ryman Premier

PREMIER newcomers **Whitehawk** moved to within a point of leaders Hampton with a 1-0 victory at **Carshalton** on Tuesday.

Josh Jones was on target five minutes before half-time but Hawks could not manage the second goal which would have lifted them above Kingstonian into second place. Carshalton slipped into the bottom two.

Lowestoft moved up to fourth, five points behind Hampton with a game in hand, with a comfortable 3-0 home win over **Wingate**. Chris Henderson put them ahead in the sixth minute and further goals from Lee Smith and Joe Francis completed the scoring by the 40-minute mark. Wingate's Ryan Gardiner was sent off in the second half.

A hat-trick by Bradley Woods-Garness made him the division's joint top scorer with seven league goals and powered **Canvey** to a 3-1 victory over **Margate**. He opened the scoring on 24 minutes, added his second on the hour and made sure in the 70th minute, after a red card for Dean Mason reduced Canvey to ten men. Dan Stubbs netted a late consolation for the visitors.

Bognor's goalscoring troubles at Nyewood Lane continued with a 3-0 defeat by **Harrow**. The Sussex Rocks have scored only once in six home games. Simeon Akinola put Harrow ahead immediately after half-time and scored again after Michael Peacock had notched the second.

Bury salvaged their unbeaten away record with an equaliser in added time from John Sands at **Cray**. Joe Vines put the home side ahead in the 24th minute and they looked well on the way to three points when Mark Willy added another on the hour. But a Craig Parker penalty in the 76th minute gave Bury hope and Sands made it 2-2 with time running out.

Two sides who have reached the first round of the FA Cup met, fittingly, in the shadow of the Wembley arch and shared the points in a 1-1 draw. Jack Mazzone put **Hendon** ahead after 23 minutes and Ty Smith equalised for visiting **Met Police** just before half-time.

Ryman North

AVELEY moved up to third in the table with a 4-1 home victory over **Sudbury** on Monday. They took the lead through Paul Burnett in the eighth minute but Leon Antoine's glancing header from a corner quickly levelled the scores.

There was then a great deal of frustration for the home side, who were always on top but could not find a way past defiant keeper Fred Howe.

Two substitutions eventually tipped the scales. Petrit Elbi had only been in the action for five minutes when he restored Aveley's lead in the 79th minute and fellow-sub Shane Oakley quickly added another, a fine solo effort.

Elbi added the fourth, the tenth goal conceded by Sudbury in three days. It is not going according to plan for the pre-season title favourites.

That result pushed **Grays** down to fourth place but 24 hours later they were on top after two early goals earned them a 2-0 victory at **Potters Bar**. The hosts started the game in second place but were stunned as Jack West and Harry Agombar struck in the first 16 minutes. Grays are a point clear of Maldon but the previous leaders have two games in hand.

Heybridge moved closer to the leading group with a 3-2 home win over **Cheshunt**, who led twice. After a goalless first half, Andrew West put the visitors ahead immediately after the restart and, after Luke Callander levelled matters five minutes later, Tony Burke put the Ambers ahead again on the hour. Michael Cheek squared it once more and Callander grabbed the winner with eight minutes left.

The most predictable result was at **Thamesmead**, who made it five home wins out of five by beating bottom club **Ware**, yet to take a point on their travels. But it was not as easy as the respective records might suggest and Thamesmead had to settle for a single goal from Jack Hopkins in the 34th minute.

Chances galore went astray at both ends as **Brentwood** and **Waltham Abbey** somehow reached half-time with the scoresheet blank. Abbey's Chris Sargent headed home a corner after 57 minutes to break the deadlock and Clark Akers punished the home side's failure to clear their lines nine minutes later to give the Abbots a 2-0 victory.

THE man of the night on Tuesday was **Faversham**'s Luke Harvey, who netted four of his side's goals in the 5-3 victory at **Worthing** which lifted them to third place in the table.

It was Worthing's fifth home defeat in the league, yet they were 2-0 up by the 22nd minute thanks to a Jamie Brotherton double. Harvey opened his account in the 24th minute and Darren Marsden, signed from Folkestone on Monday, equalised shortly afterwards. The first 17 minutes of the second half belonged to Harvey as he fired his side into a 5-2 lead. Matt Daniel replied for Rebels with 19 minutes left but they could not close the gap further.

Leaders **Crawley Down** entertained **Leatherhead**, in 21st place, and, as might have been expected, it was a comfortable victory. But not for the Anvils: it was the visitors who collected the points with three unanswered goals. Jerry Nnamani put them ahead in the third minute and they never looked back. Kev Terry made it 2-0 in the 37th minute and Tommy Hutchings added the third just after the interval. The Tanners leapt up to 15th place.

Tooting at last broke their home duck, after five straight defeats, and were moments away from lifting themselves off the bottom of the table after Carl Wilson-Denis scored only their second home goal of the season in the 56th minute. But visiting **Burgess Hill** snatched a 1-1 draw with a 90th-minute leveller from Toby Phillips. Tooting trail new 21st-placed club Walton Casuals by a single goal. Both teams have taken only one point at home but won three times away.

Dulwich also left it late at **Whitstable**, coming from behind to win 2-1 with an 89th-minute penalty by Erhun Oztumer. Buster Smissen's header had given Whitstable a 34th-minute lead, with Frankie Sawyer replying three minutes later. Dulwich are up to fourth.

Dave Cook's 26th-minute goal was enough to give **Hythe** a 1-0 home win over **Horsham**.

Maidstone climbed to second place on Wednesday with a 3-0 victory at **Eastbourne Town**, who were fifth, one position above Stones, when the game kicked off.

The hosts were in deep trouble after only 12 minutes, when Sonny Cobbs was sent off for a 'professional foul' and Paul Booth converted the penalty.

Town then held out until the 75th minute, when Booth struck again: his tenth league goal of the season to go with seven in the FA competitions.

Ian Draycott added the third as Maidstone, the pre-season title favourites, moved to within a point of Crawley Down with a game in hand.

League Cup

THE sole remaining second-round League Cup tie took place on Wednesday and it was **Concord** who went through with a 4-1 win at **Romford**.

Perhaps it would have been a different outcome had Boro taken their early chances, but Ryan Imbert shot wide of an open goal and Joe Oates had a weak penalty saved by Michael Jordan.

Jason Hallett drove in a fierce cross-shot to put Concord ahead on 27 minutes and John Easterford finished off a goalmouth scramble to make it 2-0 on the hour.

Substitute Jerome Walker scored seconds after joining the action in the 71st minute, making the most of an unselfish pass by Hallett. Imbert got one back four minutes later but another substitute, Harry Elmes, completed the scoring with a perfect free-kick three minutes after that.

FA Cup

AN amazing fourth qualifying round replay at **East Thurrock** on Tuesday ended with bitter disappointment for the home side, whose dream of a second successive appearance in the first round proper was ended by defeat at the hands of Chelmsford in a penalty shoot-out after a thrill-packed 4-4 draw.

Sam Higgins fired Rocks ahead inside the first minute but Rob Edmans equalised in the 21st minute and his second goal shortly after half-time looked to have taken the Conference South side through.

Rocks, who had forced the replay with a goal deep into added time on Saturday, did it again when substitute Sam Collins saved them in the 94th minute.

The same scoring pattern was compressed into 30 minutes of extra time. Higgins put Rocks ahead, Chelmsford hit back through Jamie Slabber and former East Thurrock man Max Cornhill.

Incredibly, Rocks saved themselves in added time for the third time in the tie when Kris Newby crashed in a 20-yard drive.

Cruelly, though, Newby then fired the first shoot-out penalty over the bar and that proved to be the only miss by either side as Chelmsford ran out 5-3 winners to earn themselves their dream tie, an A12 derby at home to Colchester.
