League Cup

THERE were some eventful ties in the third round of the League Cup on Tuesday, but nothing could eclipse the achievement of **Concord's** Jason Hallett, who scored SIX times in their 9-0 win at **Redbridge**.

That took the experienced striker's tally to an incredible 13 in two games, for despite scoring seven against Takeley in the Essex Senior Cup last Tuesday he was not able to make the team for Saturday's league match against Met Police.

If Hallett felt he had a point to make, it took him just 33 seconds to make it with his opener and he was on target again in the fifth minute. Two more followed in the 31st and 36th minutes, and it is no exaggeration to say that he could have had at least three more.

Poor Redbridge, trailing 4-0, then saw Concord bring on Tony Stokes, top of the Ryman Premier scorecharts, at the start of the second half. They held out for 14 minutes before Hallett got his fifth. Stokes then chipped in with the sixth and Hallett had a 65th-minute penalty saved, though he converted the rebound for his 13th goal in 143 minutes of playing time!

Stokes made it 8-0 with 17 minutes left but double figures eluded the Beachboys. Sammy Knott scored his first goal for the club in the 86th minute to complete the scoring, Concord's 28th goal in four games.

Hallett's feat overshadowed that of Danny Carr, who scored four times for **Dulwich** as they beat **Herne Bay** 5-1 at Champion Hill. Two of them came in the first 21 minutes, the only goals of the first half.

Billy Bennett put the visitors back in the game immediately after the break but Green struck twice in three minutes around the hour mark to put Dulwich in complete command. Ellis Green added a late fifth.

When you are in danger of frittering away a 4-0 lead, as **Hastings** were in their home game with **Three Bridges**, it would seem a risky time to give a debut to a 48-year-old. But when that 48-year-old is Gary Abbott, perhaps the greatest non-league footballer of the past 30 years, it might be another matter and Abbott wasted little time in scoring the goal which put the result beyond doubt.

Scott McDonald had put Hastings ahead after five minutes, Bailo Camara added another on the half-hour and further goals from Dee Okojie and Danny Ellis made it 4-0 at half-time. That was very harsh on the visitors, who had certainly not been outclassed, and they proceeded to prove it after the interval.

Marlon Maxwell opened their account after 56 minutes, Tom Bold's 18-yard drive reduced the arrears further ten minutes later and Charlie Cooke's strike from much further out made it 4-3 with 20 minutes left. Camara calmed Hastings' nerves with his second of the night two minutes later and Abbott's 86th-minute goal settled it, even though Joel O'Hara immediately replied to make the final score 6-4.

Only one club from the lower divisions managed to defeat Premier opposition. That was **Soham**, who led virtually throughout their game at **Leiston**. Robbie Mason scored after six minutes and there were 89 on the clock when

Gareth Heath saved the Premier side with a penalty. That meant more penalties, and Soham held their nerve to take the shoot-out 5-3.

There was one other potential shoot-out giant-killing but the Premier side survived as **Thurrock** beat **Brentwood** 4-3 after a goalless draw at Ship Lane.

Wroxham saw off Ryman North rivals **Needham Market** by the same score on penalties after the match itself finished 1-1. Sam Newson scored for the Marketmen in the 64th minute and Matt Blake levelled it in the 78th.

It almost went to a shoot-out at **Witham**, but two late, late goals gave holders **Bury** a 4-2 victory. Craig Parker put Bury ahead shortly before half-time, Witham levelled through Rob Whitnell in the 63rd minute and then did it again ten minutes later with a Scott Pethers goal just after Sam Reed had put Bury 2-1 up. Lee Reed put Bury ahead again in the 90th minute and Sam Reed nabbed his second well into added time.

Wealdstone came from behind to win 2-1 at **Carshalton**, who went ahead with a fluke goal in the 28th minute when Hakeem Adelakun's free-kick from close to the halfway line sailed over keeper Aldi Haxhia. Alex Dyer equalised on the hour and Lee Chappell's free-kick won it 15 minutes later.

Two goals from Ade Olorunda in nine minutes either side of the hour mark earned **Maidstone** a 2-0 victory at **Whitstable** and the night's other three ties all finished as 1-0 wins for the visitors.

Wade Small scored after 16 minutes for **Kingstonian** at **Harrow**, Stuart Zanone's 35th-minute effort was enough for **Thamesmead** at **Faversham** and Charlie Walker did the damage for **Whitehawk** at **Bognor** in the 53rd minute.

Two goals from Junior Appiah saw **Aveley** to a 2-1 home victory over local rivals **Tilbury** on Monday. He headed the opener after 26 minutes, shortly after Tilbury's top scorer Danny Francis had limped off. Francis has 14 goals in league and FA competitions this season, and Dockers will be hoping that his injury is a minor one.

Junior Dadson almost doubled the lead immediately after half-time with a shot that hit the inside of a post and Appiah nabbed his second in the 62nd minute, nudging the ball into the net as he, Tilbury keeper James Marrable and defender Bradley Barnes all lay in a tangle on the goalline.

Appiah missed the simplest of chances to complete his hat-trick a minute later, the first in a rapid succession of Aveley blunders in front of the Tilbury goal which allowed the visitors to get back into the game with an 80th-minute penalty by Joel Barnett.

Millers almost paid the price for their wastefulness in added time, when Tom Wraight was inches away from taking the tie to a penalty shoot-out with a shot that crashed against a post.

Met Police teenager Jonte Smith became the first player in the league to reach the 20-goal mark in major competitions with the first goal of his hat-trick in the Met's 5-3 home League Cup win over **Walton Casuals**.

Howard Newton put the Met ahead after 14 minutes and goals late in the first half from Steven Noakes and Smith made it 3-0 at the break. Casuals, bottom of Ryman South, pulled one back five minutes after the interval with a Sam Robinson penalty and gave themselves a real chance when Liam Holden reduced the arrears further in the 64th minute.

Smith nabbed his second on 79 minutes but Jerald Aboagye-Noel quickly made it 4-3. Smith finally killed off the battling Casuals side with three minutes left, taking his haul to 22: six in the league, 10 in the FA Cup and three apiece in the FA Trophy and League Cup.

Joel Palmer scored after 36 and 53 minutes to set up **Waltham Forest's** 3-1 home win over **Canvey** in the night's other League Cup game. Jay Curran put Canvey back in the game on the hour, only for Luke Stanley to restore the three-goal margin five minutes later.

Ryman Premier

THERE were no goals in the Ryman Premier fixture at **Hendon** on Tuesday but both sides had reason to be pleased with the outcome. Hendon moved off the foot of the table and up to 19th while **Cray** climbed two places to eighth.

Leiston are the new table-proppers and Thurrock find themselves back in the relegation places after themselves getting off the bottom with Saturday's 4-0 win over Kingstonian.

Lewes collected only their third league victory of the season, beating Lowestoft 2-1 at the Dripping Pan. It was a first half of contrasts for Joe Francis, who put **Lowestoft** ahead in the 16th minute but also received two yellow cards.

Ben Godfrey equalised for the hosts in the 23rd minute and the Rooks eventually profited from their extra man when Jack Walder's goal 11 minutes from the end left the Trawlerboys with nothing to show for their long midweek journey.

LEADERS **Maldon** opened up a seven-point gap at the top with a 3-0 victory at **Romford** on Wednesday, stretching their unbeaten run to 14 games.

Jamie Guy took just four minutes to put them ahead with his 14th league goal of the season, becoming the division's top scorer in the process.

Romford then held out until the hour mark, when a solo goal by Ollie Berquez made it 2-0. Chris Bryan completed the scoring in added time, punishing a miskick by Romford keeper Atu Ngoy.

JOINT **Sittingbourne** managers Jim and Danny Ward made a happy return to their previous club, **Ramsgate**, on Tuesday. The Brickies won 3-1 to climb into the Ryman South play-off places.

Ramsgate would also have gone fifth with a win but they were never able to get back on terms after Curtis Winnett's 29th-minute opener for the visitors. Hicham Akhazzan added another six minutes later, and Ashley Miller pulled one back six minutes after that. The clincher came from Joe Taylor, his eighth league goal of the season, midway through the second half.
