Ryman Premier

A HAT-TRICK by Nathaniel Pinney provided bottom club **Carshalton** with three precious Ryman Premier points as they beat fellow-strugglers **Enfield Town** 3-2 on Tuesday.

Enfield took the lead on 33 minutes through Scott McGleish but a foul by Mark Kirby allowed Pinney to reply from the penalty spot before half-time. He completed his hat-trick by the midpoint of the second half and has scored all six of the Robins' goals since Christmas.

McGleish netted his second with 15 minutes left but there was no escape for Enfield, who slumped into the bottom two because **Thurrock**, who had been 21st, romped to a 5-1 home win over **Cray** and moved up three places.

Stuart Thurgood put the hosts ahead with an early penalty and they took charge midway through the half with goals in quick succession from Luke Wanadio and Danny Green.

Cray had previously lost only once on their travels but a straight red card for Joe Vines on the stroke of half-time made their task a near-impossible one. Harry Honesty made it 4-0 in the 52nd minute and although Paul Vines replied shortly afterwards, Thurrock had the last word when Wanadio completed the nap hand in added time.

Hastings, their FA Cup adventures now behind them, are a point ahead of Enfield after their eighth successive league draw, 1-1 at home to **Wealdstone** who themselves moved up one place to fourth.

Josh Jirbandey, captaining the side in his last game before leaving for America, put them ahead after 16 minutes but conceded a penalty soon after half-time. Liam O'Brien, who saved a penalty at Middlesbrough on Saturday, did it again to deny Chris Moore but Alex Dyer followed up to score. Dyer later hit a post.

Hendon stayed in the danger zone after a 2-1 home defeat by **Canvey**. The visitors went ahead in the 14th minute with a header by Jay Curran. Dean Cracknell replied on the half-hour but Bradley Woods-Garness won it for the islanders soon after the break.

Ryman North

BOTTOM club Ilford were without a Ryman North game on Tuesday but still had a good night as the two teams a point ahead of them were both beaten at home.

Lee Hales scored twice for the second successive game to give **Chatham** a 2-0 half-time lead at **Ware**. Jack Jeffery completed a 3-0 victory in added time and to make Ware's night even worse they had Tony Martin sent off.

Redbridge went down 1-0 to **Waltham Forest**, their 10th defeat in 11 home games. Dmitri Larin's eighth-minute header provided the only goal amid a host of missed chances at both ends.

Unlucky **Romford** suffered the Wednesday night blues for the second week in a row – and this time it was a double dose.

Beaten by a goal in added time at Grays a week ago, tonight they took a 3-2 lead into the 92nd minute of their action-packed home game with **Brentwood** only to lose 4-3.

Brentwood's prolific Alex Read broke clear to give his side the lead after 18 minutes. Boro equalised on the half-hour when Brentwood failed to deal with a cross from Lewis Francis which hit the far post and dropped for Kurt Smith to bundle over the line.

Skipper Ryan Doyle restored Brentwood's lead five minutes before the break when everyone in front of goal missed his free-kick.

A fierce drive from Romford captain Jack Barry made it 2-2 on the hour and they went ahead in the 83rd minute when Doyle met a Ben Jones free-kick with a diving header that directed the ball into his own net.

But a defensive error allowed Steve Butterworth to run through unchallenged to shoot past keeper Atu Ngoy and level the scores two minutes into added time.

Worse was to follow for the hosts two minutes later when they conceded a needless free-kick just outside the box and Read blasted his 18th league goal of the season and his 27th in all, including nine in the FA competitions.

Ryman South

A GOAL by **Horsham**'s Ryan Marriott denied **Maidstone** a return to the top of the Ryman North table on Tuesday. Needing three points to knock Dulwich out of top spot, Stones took the lead at Gorings Mead in the 40th minute through Shaun Welford only for Marriott to hit back three minutes later. That was the end of the scoring and it finished 1-1.

Ten-man **Sittingbourne** won 1-0 at **Leatherhead** to put one over on their former boss Richard Brady. It was the Tanners' sixth defeat in ten home games but, despite that, they are third in the table.

The Brickies had Nick Treadwell sent off eight minutes before half-time but won it with a 71st-minute own goal by Mark Simmons and moved up to sixth place, with only goal difference keeping them out of the play-off spots.

Worthing moved up to ninth with a 2-1 home win over **Ramsgate**. Tom Lawley gave Rebels a 15th-minute lead but Ashley Miller equalised immediately after half-time, leaving home fans fearing that they were heading for their 10th home defeat. A minute later, however, Chris O'Flaherty restored the advantage and it proved to be enough.

League newcomers Three Bridges face an uphill task if they are to retain their status for a second season. Last year's Sussex County League champions fell to the foot of the table after **Walton Casuals** won 2-0 at **Eastbourne Town** on Wednesday to go two points ahead of Bridges with a game in hand.

Mu Maan, signed this week from Carshalton, broke the deadlock in the 51st minute and Dylan Cascoe clinched victory with 11 minutes left.

That's odd!

THIS week's results mean that, remarkably, there have now been more away wins (265) than home victories (263) in the Ryman League this season.

All three games in the North this week were won by visiting clubs, making 93 successes on the road against 91 on home turf. Travelling teams have had the better of things throughout the season in Ryman South, their current advantage being 103-86. Only in the Premier has the conventional pattern been followed, with an 86-69 advantage for home teams.

The South produces some of the strangest records. Leatherhead are third despite six home defeats, atoning for them with nine away victories. Worthing are in the top half of the table despite losing nine games at Woodside Road: seven of their ten wins have come elsewhere.

Faversham have also won seven away and only three at home, while Walton Casuals moved off the bottom of the table on Wednesday with their fourth win of the season, all of them on their travels.

In the North, the majority of clubs have won roughly even numbers of home and away games, rather odd in itself. Maldon's 100 per cent home record stands out and they are, in fact, the only club in the league without a home defeat.

At the other end of the scale, Needham Market are still seeking a home victory after 10 attempts but have won six times on the road. Ilford are also still seeking a home victory, though they have won only once anywhere.

In the Premier things are more normal, though leaders Whitehawk have won seven away and only five at home. Six of Cray's eight defeats have been on home territory.
